Best Practices Incentive

WHEREAS, Section 22f of the State School Aid Act provides \$52 per pupil one-time grants to districts that satisfy at least 7 of 8 best practices criteria not later than June 1, 2014 [MCL 388.1622f].

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Madison School District desires to receive the \$52 per pupil incentive payment.

WHEREAS, the Madison School District has satisfied at least 7 of 8 best practices criteria.

WHEREAS, eligibility for the incentive payment is contingent upon adopting a resolution that states the district has complied with the following 7 of 8 best practice criteria.

Now, therefore, be it resolved as follows:

- 1. The board of education of the Madison School District certifies that the district has complied with the following requirements:
 - ➤ The district is the designated policy holder for medical benefit plan(s) pursuant to Section 22f(2)(a).
 - ➤ The district has obtained a competitive bid on non-instructional services pursuant to Section 22f(2)(b).
 - o Health insurance services were competitively bid for 2013-14.
 - ➤ The district accepts applications for enrollment by non-resident applicants under Section 105 or 105c (MCL 388.1705) pursuant to Section 22f(2)(c).

- ➤ The district identifies the following it provides pursuant to Section 22f(2)(d):
 - The district monitors individual pupil academic growth in each subject area at least twice during the school year using competency based online assessments pursuant to Section 22f(2)(d) and reports the results to the pupil and his or her parent or guardian.
 - Submits to the Michigan Department of Education a plan that shows progress toward developing the technology infrastructure necessary for the implementation of pupil academic growth assessments by 2014-2015.
- ➤ The district supports opportunities for pupils to receive postsecondary credit while attending secondary school pursuant to Section 22f(2)(e).
- ➤ The district offers online courses or blended learning opportunities to all eligible pupils, and publish course syllabi pursuant to Section 22f(2)(f).
- ➤ The district provides a link on the district's home page to the url for the MiSchoolData Portal which will contain the required dashboard indicators pursuant to Section 22f(2)(g). If certain data elements for our district are unavailable from state data collections, we agree to provide those data in the form and manner determined by MDE.
- 2. The Board of Education of the Madison School District authorizes and directs its Secretary to file this resolution with the State Aid and School Finance Office of the Michigan Department of Education.
- 3. All resolutions and parts of resolutions insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this resolution are hereby rescinded.

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Superintendent's Report February 17, 2014

- I. I am recommending that you take action at this meeting to retain our auditors, Drake, Watters, & Associates, PLLC for the 2013-14 fiscal year audits at a fee of \$16,475.00, an increase of \$525.00 from a year ago.
- II. We will take a few minutes at this meeting to update you on the Balanced School Year (BSY) option that we have been researching since last fall. This will also provide an opportunity for you to provide input as we work to finalize a recommendation for your consideration at your March meeting.
- III. Katie McGormley, our Bio Med teacher, has invited the Board to join her in her classroom for a presentation on our new Bio Med program. I have had the pleasure of listening to Katie make a similar presentation to my Rotary Club and the Lenawee County Superintendents' Association. I know you will be impressed. We will plan to end our meeting in Katie's classroom.
- IV. We have received a request from Rachel Hague for a FMLA/disability leave following surgery that she will have in March through the balance of the school year. I am recommending you approve Rachel's request and that she be allowed to use her accumulated sick leave for the period of time her doctor verifies she is disabled.
- V. We are proceeding with plans to renovate the old elementary gymnasium into a satellite kitchen and serving area for our younger elementary students and to convert the former stage area into two music classrooms. We have had some struggles getting the project approved in Lansing, but recently received verbal approval. Written approval is hopefully forthcoming in the very near future. Based on the verbal approval we are moving forward to release construction documents to prospective bidders. We have established a bid opening date of April 15th so bids can be ready for your consideration at your April 21st meeting.
- VI. What a winter! The combination of snow and cold has been one for the record books. Thus far we have closed for seven days and delayed once. Per the Master Agreement with our teachers we make up the days starting with the 5th missed day by extending the school year, but we can mutually agree to a different make up schedule. Ryan & I met with the MEA leadership this past week to discuss options for the three days we currently have to make up. As a result of that discussion we have tentatively agreed to change the early dismissal days on March 21st and

May 9th to full days of school. That would make up one instructional day, and we can reschedule the professional development that was to occur on those two half days to the end of the school year after the students have finished. We have also tentatively agreed to have a full day of school on March 12th for grades 6-12, and March 14th for Young Fives through 5th grade. Those were scheduled to be half days for students with early dismissal for teachers to work on records. The teachers will now do the records on their own time evenings or weekends. That would make up our second missed day. We would then extend the school year from June 12th to June 13th to make up the third missed day.

Hopefully winter comes to a merciful end in the very near future. Weekend overtime to plow the parking lots, and especially the gas heating bills, are far beyond what we normally experience.

VII. The second official membership count day for the 2013-14 school year was this past Wednesday. Preliminary numbers, and the numbers from last October are as follows:

In addition to the above we now have to calculate how many students have moved into or out of our district between the two counts dates to another non Lenawee County Michigan public school between the two count dates and prorate the membership on those students. Our wonderful legislature just keeps making life more challenging, and, of course, financially less rewarding.

- VIII. Speaking of Lansing I am less than delighted with the Governor's proposed K-12 budget for the coming year. I am appreciative of the proposed additional funds to help stabilize the Michigan Public School Employees Retirement System, but that is something that I firmly believe is the State's responsibility. Additional funds for the Foundation Allowance are miniscule. Of the \$470 per pupil reduction in the Foundation Allowance four years ago \$9.00 was restored last year. It varies from district to district but the Governor's proposal would restore another \$95 to Madison for 2014-15 school year. Therefore, we would still be \$366 per pupil below where we were four years ago. Based on the above enrollment numbers, that equates to \$570,000 less revenue than what we would have received for the same number of students four years ago. Pretty tough to balance the books when K-12 education is treated so poorly.
- IX. Our 5th grade campers will be joining you for your March meeting to provide an update on this year's camp experience.
- X. Our winter sports programs are all experiencing great success thus far. The wrestlers recently won their first ever District Team Championship. (MHSAA did not have districts years ago when we won our five State Championships.) Scott Hall was named the Lenawee County Coach of the Year. I don't want to jinx anyone but, both our girls and boys varsity basketball teams are one victory away from securing repeat league championships, and our bowlers are both having outstanding seasons. Congrats to all of our winter sports athletes and coaches. Keep up the great work!

Proposed Balanced School Year (BSY) for 2014-15

Several advancements have occurred since the informational meetings took place with parents January 8th and 10th in the Performing Arts Center.

One, an electronic survey was made available to stakeholders as one avenue to provide feedback regarding the BSY program. The following themes emerged from the data collected:

Starting Time (during the 5 weeks throughout July and August)

Approximately half of the respondents support an earlier start time, half would prefer to maintain a consistent start time with what will occur the remainder of the school year.

Teacher Selection

Parents expressed concerned over which teachers will serve within each grade level on the BSY calendar. Some noted they will base their decision to participate, in part, on which teachers are available. There were also questions about looping and co-teaching opportunities.

Special Education and Other Support Services

Parents wanted assurance that their child will have the same paraprofessionals and other resource room staff throughout the entire school year. They shared concern about Nurse Ellen being here during the summer and that qualified subs would be available, if needed.

Child Care

Parents expressed concern about how to handle child care for their children during intersession breaks, but are hopeful the school is able to collaborate with various community partners to provide flexible services. Others see this as an opportunity to reduce child care expenses throughout the summer.

Proposed Calendar

Many responses to the calendar were suggestions to start school the first week of August. Other suggestions include avoiding extended holiday breaks, as many parents are required to work over holidays and that the six week break is still too long. Also, it was suggested to move the February break to the first week of March.

Weather-Related Concerns

Parents are concerned about a lack of air conditioning on buses, during recess, and gym. A few with asthmatic children were concerned about air conditioned classrooms.

Lenawee County Fair

Parent feedback was split; some were firm about not wanting school during the week of the Fair; while others asked that we not let the Fair determine when we are in session.

Intersession Opportunities

Parents are interested to see what opportunities will be available for their students during the intersession times. There are concerns about the cost of potential programming.

Continuation of BSY in MS/HS

Parents of upper elementary students noted concern about the transition back to a traditional calendar in middle school after being on the BSY calendar while in the elementary. Parents of early elementary students would like the opportunity of BSY to be an option once their children reach middle school. Furthermore, some parents noted potential challenges having students within the same family on two different calendars.

5th-6th Grade Transition

Regardless of the calendar selection, parents would like to see more opportunity for assistance on the 5th-6th grade transition for students. Parents who are interested in BSY are particularly interested in transition-related programs during intersessions and are concerned about trying BSY in the 5th grade, only to be on a traditional calendar again for 6th grade.

Class Size/SOC/Increased Enrollment

There were concerns voiced over how class size will be managed, especially if there is an influx of SOC students which may limit their child's chances of being accepted into the program.

Student Selection Process

There were questions regarding who will be selected first for this program: Madison residents, current SOC students, or new SOC students.

Class Demographics

Parents are concerned that the BSY program will not be a representative sample of the Madison student population. It was asked if students who excel academically or those underperforming will have the same benefits of students who are on the traditional calendar.

Third, presentations to Rotary and Kiwanis have occurred or are scheduled to take place. Jim has presented the information that was shared with those at the stakeholder meetings. Many within the community are interested in this initiative and would like to hear more about the Madison approach to this process. We continue to share what we know at this time.

Finally, before we can finalize programming needs and related costs we need to have a good understanding of exactly which students will be in the BSY program. Between now and March 3rd we will collect registration/commitment forms and, with these, gather valuable data to

determine student demographics, which children require interventions, bus transportation, etc. It is our intention to finalize as much data as possible and present to you the information to review and consider at the March 17th Board meeting. If the data is close to what we expect it to be, we will be asking you to approve the program for 2014-15 at that time.

Board Report Kristin Thomas, Principal Madison High School February 17, 2014

I. Parent Teacher Conferences – The winter Parent-Teacher Conferences were held on Thursday, January 23rd. Historically, the winter/spring conference attendance is significantly lower than the fall conferences. In the fall, we had 55% attendance. Last month we had 45% overall attendance. The breakdown by grade level is below:

- II. Scheduling for 2014-2015 The scheduling process for the 2014-2015 school year is underway! Mrs. Stelzer has already scheduled our Tech Center Courses and will begin meeting with all students in grades 8-11 to select courses for next year. When doing this, Mrs. Stelzer is using student PLAN and ACT scores to help students select courses that best meet their academic and future career path goals. Similar to this year, we will be sending a large number of students to the Tech Center. Mrs. Stelzer estimates that we have approximately 85 students attending in the morning and approximately 35 students attending in the afternoon.
- III. Professional Development This past Early Release Day, the HS staff reviewed the item analysis reports from our 9th & 10th grade PLAN tests. Unfortunately, our PLAN scores are lower than they have been in the past. HS teachers spent a great deal of time talking about how to address this concern and what we can do (in addition to what we are currently doing) to bring about student growth. The HS School Improvement Team has taken some of the feedback from the staff and is researching what interventions are available for high school students and what interventions would be feasible for our current student population and schedule. I will keep you informed as we head down this path.
- IV. Winter Homecoming –Despite having three snow days, our Winter Homecoming was a fun and exciting event for our students. Congratulations to Brett Merillat and Luisa Bastos who were crowned king and queen. Also, congratulations to both our Girls and Boys Varsity Basketball Teams as they defeated Sand Creek to bring home two Homecoming Victories[©] After the game, our student council provided an evening of fun activities for students which included a dance, basketball, volleyball, video games, and board games.

Board Report Brad Anschuetz Madison Middle School February 17, 2014

- 1. The Madison Middle School Musical, <u>School House Rock</u>, was a very entertaining show. I found myself singing along to the songs that were a part of our childhood. Mrs. Harsh and the cast should be commended for their performance. Unfortunately, due to timing and weather, only 250+ people saw the musical. We are putting on one final daytime performance this Friday during Forum. Student tickets will be reduced. All proceeds will go towards the 8th Grade Chicago trip.
- 2. Anthony Contreras, student leader, has started a challenge to all Forums to collect Box Tops! Going back to last fall his Box Top program has raised approximately \$795. This should reach the \$2,000 mark by the end of the year. As a student leader I have informed Anthony that he and other student leaders can be involved in the decision making process in terms of allocating this money. With the help of his teacher mentors he is developing a document for which teachers can apply for a mini grant to support their classroom. Anytime we can give students opportunities for authentic leadership we need to make it happen. We will look for ways to involve students in the decision making process to invest funds raised by Student Council as well. Approximately \$1,500 a year is raised by the Student Council.
- 3. As of the day writing this report there are 11 students with balances over \$400 regarding payment for the Chicago Trip. The cost of the trip was set at \$575. It is difficult to plan for this trip because we are caught in between the cut off for one bus and two busses. Empty seats on a bus run the cost per student up dramatically. We have always set a price and stuck with that price. In the past, overruns were picked up by fundraising efforts. These overruns, however, have the potential to run around \$4,000 this year. A full bus is 55 passengers (includes 4-6 chaperones). We are expecting somewhere between 64 - 67 students out of a possible 100 students eligible to attend. Approximately 15% of these students will receive partial scholarships (\$100 - \$300). Our attendance rate on these trips has hovered around 63-65%. Last year's eighth grade class comprised of 121 students, whereas this year's class is around 107 (about 7 are on partial MS/HS schedules). I do not think families truly understand the difficult position we are put in when someone backs out of this trip. On the other hand, I understand that there are some unexpected difficult situations that arise in family finances. I will more than likely be recommending a non-refundable deposit for this trip next year. I am working on potential solutions for this year's trip. I hope to communicate these solutions at the Board meeting.
- **4.** Given the fact that the National School Counseling week is in February, I would like to take this time to publicly thank Mrs. Sylvia Sotelo for the work she does as our Middle School Counselor. She has made a significant impact with students involved in her Student Success program. Furthermore, there have been several students working through personal trauma in their lives. Mrs. Sotelo has been a great resource for these students and their families.

- **5.** Our third paraprofessional has given notice of leave this year. The confusion and possible financial liability of the Obama Health Care law has crippled our ability to attract and retain paraprofessionals.
- **6.** Eighth grade students toured the Tech Center this past month as a prelude to long-term educational planning and the anticipated start of their high school academic coursework.
- **7.** This past Friday our faculty continued to focus on two important skills needed to be successful on a Smarter Balanced assessment (http://www.smarterbalanced.org/), (or PARCC if the legislation goes another direction (http://www.parcconline.org/parcc-assessment). These two skills are Close & Critical Reading (http://www.lirvin.net/WGuides/closereading.html), as well as Academic Writing in the Common Core.

1. **TEAM TIME:** Following our winter data meetings, we have adjusted our upper elementary Team Time (Title I Interventions). Our students who are falling beneath the 30th percentile in literacy and math will be receiving both math and literacy interventions four days per week instead of two. We have increased the number of data points we are looking at so we may make our interventions more focused on each student's specific needs.

3. **Professional Development:** During the past month we have had two very exciting professional development experiences. Kelly Cichy, LISD Director of STEM, led our professional development on January 20th. Teachers were given the completed document of Y5 – 5th grade science and engineering practices learning goals. The goals are in student-friendly language, written as 'I Can' statements. Initially this work began with the county science teachers. Madison Elementary teachers furthered the work by aligning the goals horizontally and vertically. Kelly led our faculty as we worked on a school-wide science learning project. We began the project by developing essential questions that will drive instruction at each grade level.

Here are the essential questions:

Overarching: How do humans affect the environment?

4 Yrs/ Y5s: Why is it important to recycle glue stick containers?

K: How can we reduce the amount of trash in the classroom?

1st: What impact does the use of plastic bags have on the environment?

2nd: How can we reduce/reuse packaged food waste in the cafeteria?

3rd: How does our classroom waste affect the environment?

4th: How does human reliance on electrical energy affect the environment?

5th: How does food waste affect the environment?

We will continue to work on this project, collaborating at grade level team meetings, so that we will have a school-wide science fair culmination activity on Earth Day.

Last Friday's early release professional development was led by Mellissa Wilson, based on the math goal of this year's school improvement plan. The foundation of our work was based on mathematical practices that will help guide instruction and build deeper student

understandings. We learned two different models of a gradual release math class, including daily practice of math fact automaticity in both. Two of our teachers, Jen Baur and Erin Pifer, shared video clips and tips of how they are developing this model in their classroom.

- 4. **Fifth Grade Camp**: Once again, our 5th grade students have had a great experience at Camp Michindoh Outdoor Education School. Despite the cold wintery weather, our campers made it to camp in Hillsdale on three days when we had no school. 103 fifth graders were there along with 17 high school cabin leaders. Our high school cabin leaders did a fantastic job again this year. I'm not going to say much more about it since there will be a fifth grade presentation at March's Board meeting.
- 5. **Counselor's Week:** We'd like to take this time to acknowledge Tracey Brackelman for her leadership and work with our students and staff. Tracey does so much for our school, our families, and our community. She goes above and beyond the role of the typical elementary school counselor. We truly appreciate all she does.
