## Superintendent's Report April 18, 2011

I. Included in this packet is a letter from the Michigan Interscholastic Athletic Administration Association commending Kris Isom for 25 years of service as an Athletic Director. That is a lot of athletic events and a lot of nights away from home! I know you join me in congratulating Kris on reaching this milestone. Kris oversees a very important component of our school program and has been a driving force in teaching our student athletes the value of sportsmanship and that every endeavor deserves your best effort.

Kris has included the winter sports financial report in this packet for your review and approval.
II. The elementary has selected Krista Long as the new secretary to replace JoAnn Moore. Linda and Nate will have background information in their reports.
III. In a previous email I informed you that it would be advisable to move your May $9^{\text {th }}$ meeting to May $16^{\text {th }}$. That would allow you to act on the election of the LISD Board members without calling a special meeting. By law the earliest possible date for a local Board to pass their resolution on the election is May $16^{\text {th }}$.
IV. Elementary counselor Tracey Brackelman is expecting her second child in mid-May and is requesting a FMLA/disability/maternity leave following the birth of her child. I recommend you approve Tracey's request with the understanding that she will be allowed to use her accumulated sick leave days for the period of time her doctor verifies she is disabled.
V. Our school election will be here soon, May $3^{\text {rd }}$ is only two weeks away. Please do you best to remind everyone to vote. It is a very important election and the outcome of school elections are often decided by just a few votes. I really commend our Voices For Change students, and their President Samantha (Sam) Davis, who took it upon themselves to design and have bumper stickers prepared supporting the bond proposal.
VI. Included in this packet is a resolution on school funding that MASB is encouraging all Boards of Education to adopt. I certainly support that recommendation. We would be in much better shape, and the Proposal A promises made in 1994 would be honored, if the State would use the School Aid Fund to only support K-12 public education. Politicians sometimes wonder why they are distrusted. They either have very, very short memories, or they fail to understand that a promise is a promise - no matter how tough it might be to keep.
VII. Probationary teacher evaluations are being forwarded to the Board via a separate confidential email. Each of the probationary teachers has requested that their evaluations be discussed in closed session as permitted by law, and as we always recommend.
VIII. Our cafeteria employees approached me recently and inquired about the possibility of extending their contract that is scheduled to expire this July for an additional two years. I explained the financial uncertainties facing schools in Michigan and told them there just is not any money for raises next year. As always, they are a very reasonable group. They have offered to extend their contract for 2011-12 with no changes in wages, benefits, or contract language. In 2012-13 there would be a reopener to discuss wages only, but again, I would expect that conversation to be very reasonable. They do currently have a "me too" provision in their contract that would provide them with a raise equal to any increase the teachers' base wages go up. Our bus drivers will be meeting on Friday, April $15^{\text {th }}$ to discuss the extension of their contract which will be expiring this August.
IX. Kristin and the high school counseling office have finished surveying students on their class interests for the 2011-12 school year. They are now recommending that we offer American Sign Language as a second foreign language option for our students. With your approval, students would be able to satisfy their foreign language graduation requirements via either Spanish or American Sign Language.
X. I attended a meeting with the officials from the Lenawee County Road Commission a couple of weeks ago. They are proceeding with plans to widen Treat Hwy in front of the school from just north of our north driveway to our middle drive way. A deceleration apron will be installed for cars approaching school from the north to turn into the school and a left turn lane will be installed for cars coming from the south. There is still a little discussion about the motion activated stop light at our north drive, but I believe that will also be part of this project. Work is scheduled to start just after the $4^{\text {th }}$ of July with completion prior to the start of school.
XI. Bid documents were to be released late this past week for the DK classroom addition. Bids for that project are due May $10^{\text {th }}$ and should be ready for your consideration at your May $16^{\text {th }}$ meeting.
XII. We are also asking for bids on a small project to better insulate the outside wall of two of our middle school classrooms that face the elementary court yard. The two rooms are extremely difficult to heat; even a portable heater would not keep one of the rooms comfortable this winter. The project calls for the removal of the single pain windows, replacing some of the windows with new energy efficient windows, and installing a drivet insulation system on the outside wall. We would also perform the similar type of work on the adjacent restroom windows and wall. Bids for that project will also be ready for your approval in May.
XIII. We had another 5 hour negotiation session with the MEA bargaining team this past Wednesday. There was also an 8 hour session on March $28^{\text {th }}$. I know both teams are somewhat frustrated that we have not been able to reach an agreement. All of the uncertainty in Lansing is making it a lot tougher for both teams to know what to do. We are getting closer, but there are a couple of obstacles that we have not been able to resolve yet.
XIV. This past Thursday morning a retired State Police officer and safety expert, hired through a federal grant the LISD secured, was at Madison to do a walkthrough vulnerability assessment. (Eight of the eleven county school districts are participating in the grant.) The officer was accompanied by a Lenawee County Sheriff, the Madison

Township Fire Chief, and a person from the LISD. After the walkthrough he met with our administrative team to review what he had observed and he will be back on the afternoon of June $17^{\text {th }}$ to meet with our entire staff. He did share a couple of ideas and suggestions with us. Probably the most significant recommendation was that we install a system on our three main entrance doors that would require a person to be "buzzed" into the building anytime they came to school during the regular school day. We will be receiving some additional information about what would be required to implement such a system.

## RESOLUTION OPPOSING SCHOOL AID FUND TRANSFER TO HIGHER EDUCATION

WHEREAS, well-educated students prepared for college and careers is the best investment Michigan can make in the pursuit of a strong economy and a better future for its residents; and

WHEREAS, Michigan's standards for high school graduation have never been higher, with all students completing the Michigan Merit Curriculum and Exam to prepare them for post-secondary education or training; and

WHEREAS, school funding has increased by less than 1 percent per year during the past decade, failing to keep up with increased costs, mandates and standards, prompting staff and budget reductions to maintain programming; and

WHEREAS, Michigan voters in 1994 approved Proposal A, a measure that eliminated the ability of school districts to seek operating funds from constituents and shifted that responsibility to the state through an increase in the sales tax; and

WHEREAS, the ballot language of Proposal A clearly indicated those revenues would be totally dedicated to public schools, as it was crafted to provide tax relief for property owners while maintaining adequate funding for K -12 education; and

WHEREAS, community colleges and institutions of higher education were not included in the ballot language of Proposal A, nor were they mentioned in voter communication stating the intent of the constitutional amendment; and

WHEREAS, community colleges and institutions of higher education are afforded the opportunity to increase tuition and fees to finance operations while school districts are prohibited from seeking additional operating funds to compensate for inadequate state funding; and

WHEREAS, the transfer of funds from the School Aid Fund to community colleges and institutions of higher education will debilitate the School Aid Fund and its ability to adequately fund public schools; now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the (school district name) opposes the proposal to divert dollars from the School Aid Fund to support community colleges and institutions of higher education at the expense of public school districts and the children they serve.
