# Interim Superintendent's Report Reorganizational Meeting and Regular Meeting of July 12, 2010

- I. As was previously promised, the agenda for tonight is very brief. We will start with the annual reorganizational meeting, which by Board policy I should chair. When the reorganizational meeting is concluded we will immediately reconvene and conduct the regular July business. The reorganizational meeting includes the election of Board officers, the establishment of meeting dates for the coming year, the designation of depositories for school funds, retaining legal counsel, and appointing Board delegates to MASB and the LCASB. If it is your plan to continue holding the monthly meetings on the second Monday of the month at 5:30 p.m. the April meeting would best be scheduled for the third Monday (April 18<sup>th</sup>) so as to not conflict with spring break.
- II. We welcome Dana and Mark to their service as Board members. Thank you for your commitment to the children of our school district and for your willingness to provide this vital service.
- III. There are two personnel decisions for the Board to act on at this meeting the employment of a Transportation Supervisor, and addressing the current superintendency vacancy.

I certainly concur with Mr. Hartley's previous recommendation that George Davis should be reemployed as our Transportation Director. George has served the District extremely well in his previous position of Director of Maintenance and Transportation. George has agreed to return and reassume the transportation supervisory responsibilities for 1/3 of his previous compensation, or about 18,100, if that is the agreeable to the Board.

You also need to take some action on the superintendency. I have agreed to serve as the Interim Superintendent for the month of July, but I have no desire to continue in that capacity beyond July. It seems you have two options, reemploy Mr. Hartley, or advertise the position and seek new candidates for the position. Mr. Hartley had previously indicated that, considering the projected financial challenges facing the District, he is willing to return on a full time basis for at 1/3 of his previous compensation.

IV. We have two bids for resealing the elementary parking lot:K & B Asphalt Sealcoating, Inc. \$7,125.85Wenn Seal Coating and Striping Inc.\$6,885.00

Both companies have worked for us in the past and have done a good job.
