Superintendent's Report

School ADvance Evaluation Training (Information Item)

School ADvance Evaluation Training is scheduled for Tuesday, October 21st at the Tecumseh Public Schools Administrative Office. The training will be facilitated by MASB Senior Associate, Karen Cross. We will begin with dinner at 5:30 p.m. and the session will conclude at 9:00 p.m. Please view aspects of the School ADvance tool and process at http://goschooladvance.com and feel free to contact me if you have questions.

School Board and Stakeholder Workshop (Information Item)

As a reminder the annual School Board and Stakeholder Workshop will occur Saturday, October 4th from 8:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. in the HS/MS Media Center. Olga Holden will facilitate various aspects of the day related to the District's mission, vision, and strategic plan. Members of the Madison family will be invited to join us for the day.

Multi-Zone HVAC Unit (Information Item)

The District conducted a mandatory walk through and pre-bid meeting for companies interested in providing a bid for the Elementary School 30-Ton Multi-Zone HVAC Unit Wednesday, August 27th at 9:00 a.m. As you are aware the unit will be paid for through the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) Year-Round Education Grant.

Qualified Bidders who attended the pre-bid meeting were invited to prepare and submit proposals on or before 2:00 pm Wednesday, September 10, 2014 at which time, in the Madison Board Room, the bids were opened publicly and read aloud. Thompson Plumbing, Heating & A.C out of Petersburg, Michigan was awarded the project at a cost of \$137,200.00. Work is expected to be completed no later than December 17th.

Letter of Agreement (LOA) (Information Item)

The Madison Education Association voted Friday, September 5th in favor of the proposed LOA which states:

Article XI G. of the Master Agreement shall be modified as follows for the 2014-15 school year only.

For each year of this Agreement, a teacher's Base Compensation shall be the sum of:

- The annualized teaching compensation the teacher would have earned working full time during the previous school year (not including performance based compensation), and
- The highest additional performance based compensation earned by any teacher in any of the three previous school years.

It is also agreed that each teacher who has reached the District compensation CAP as defined in Article XI H. of the Master Agreement shall, for the 2014-15 school year only, receive \$1,000 in additional compensation. This additional compensation shall not become part of the teacher's Base Compensation for the 2015-16 school year.

It is further agreed that, beginning in the 2015-16 school year, Madison Middle School and Madison High School shall operate on the aligned daily schedule attached to this Letter of Agreement. The daily schedule, and all terms and conditions, will be fully negotiated and agreed upon by both parties.

Brad has invited staff to participate with a committee to construct a proposed schedule to, once approved, begin the 2015-16 school year.

Madison Alumni Association and Madison Education Foundation (Information Item)

There have been several individuals who have asked me about starting an alumni association and an education foundation at Madison. There is a seminar Monday, September 22nd in Lansing for school districts that currently have a foundation or wish to start one. I asked Jim to attend this seminar and facilitate the process of starting an education foundation for Madison School District. I met with Dave and Jim this past week to discuss final payments for the Madison Café project. As part of our discussion we discussed plans for the Madison Education Foundation. Dave has committed a \$1,000.00 contribution to the Foundation. I am grateful to Dave for this generous donation and for Jim agreeing to initiate this worthwhile process here at Madison.

At the same time forming an alumni association has been a goal of this District. Key alumni including Dave Siler, Madison's first valedictorian, are interested in helping establish this association. Rebecca Schwan will be working with Jim to provide communication and marketing material for both the Foundation and the Association. I will keep you updated as progress occurs.

I am providing you an unofficial student head count reported by building secretaries after the first week of school. These numbers are subject to change between now and the official count day Wednesday October 1st and, consistent with previous years, I do expect some attrition.

Lease Agreement with Adrian Dirtbags Baseball Organization for 2014-15 (Action Item)

The Adrian Dirtbags baseball organization is interested in leasing the Madison Indoor Athletic Facility on Sundays, January through April 2015. The organization is willing to pay \$5,000.00 to rent the Facility for four months. In addition, the organization has offered resources worth approximately \$2,000.00 to remain within the Facility for use by Madison baseball and softball teams. A new batting cage, 3 L screens, a square screen, portable pitching mounds, and several hundred baseballs would be included. This lease arrangement, if approved, would pay for approximately one quarter of the loan from the general fund to F.A.N., if the arrangement were to continue for three years. The first payment, as outlined in the

contract, would be received October 15th. Furthermore, if the agreement could contribute to operational expenses if the agreement continues once the loan is paid off.

Several of the teams have Madison students on the roster and the list of coaches for the teams includes parents, staff, and volunteers from the Madison family.

I have attached a draft lease agreement for your review. This agreement has aspects for accountability and also provides adequate liability insurance for the District. I recommend the District enter into a lease agreement with the Adrian Dirtbags baseball organization for the months of January through April 2015.

Hiring Junior High Coaches (Action Item)

Included in Kris's report are three employment recommendations for junior high coaching positions. Kris has provided background information on each of the individuals recommended to join the Madison coaching staff.

5th Grade Camp (Action Item)

Included in Nate's report is information on the annual 5th grade camp trip. They are looking for tentative approval at this time so they can proceed with fund raising efforts. The 5th grade teachers have tentatively planned for the week of January 26-30. Unlike the last two years, this will not interfere with homecoming. They would like to again recruit high school students to serve as cabin leaders throughout the week.

8th Grade Trip (Action Item)

Included in Brad's report is information regarding the 8th grade trip. They are seeking tentative approval at this time so they can proceed with fundraising and planning/preparation efforts.

Student Success Program (Oral Report)

For several months throughout the beginning of the 2012-13 school year Kristin had conversations with Jim about the significant number of high school students that were not meeting expectations and simply failing to perform. As you are aware apathy is a tremendous issue we attempt to address each and every year. In fact too many students are unmotivated to the point that they drop out of school. Students, at times, do not have support and encouragement they need from home to understand that the future has hope for those who engage in their educational path towards and beyond graduation.

In February 2012 Jim requested permission to add a Success Coach position for the 2012-13 school year. He stated that the Success Coach would be assigned a caseload of at least 15 of Madison's most at-risk high school students and would do everything possible to motivate these students, remove barriers that are discouraging them from attending school, provide homework assistance, meet with the students either individually or in small groups several times each week, and confer with the students' teachers and their parents/guardians.

I was recently asked about the success of this position and what impact Mr. Wallace and the program has had on students attending Madison. I appreciate being asked this question and wanted to provide you information about students who have worked with Mr. Wallace and have a student tell her story about the progress made, in part, to the work of Mr. Wallace and the support and structure of the Student Success Program at Madison High School.

LEASE AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made this ____ day of September 2014, by and between Madison School District (Madison), whose address is 3498 Treat Highway, Adrian, Michigan 49221 and the Adrian Dirtbags. With the signatures of their respective representatives, the parties to the Agreement voluntarily bind themselves to the covenants contained herein and their mutual consideration establishes the basis for this Agreement.

WHEREAS, Madison and Adrian Dirtbags are entering into this lease agreement on ______, 2014, through which Madison leased to Adrian Dirtbags, for a period of January 1, 2015 to May 1, 2015, the day of Sunday each week 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., the 80 x 60 and 50 x 30 foot athletic areas, and access to the lobby and restrooms within the Madison Indoor Athletic Facility.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, Madison for and in consideration of the rents and covenants hereinafter mentioned to be paid and performed by Adrian Dirtbags, has demised, leased and by these premises does demise, lease and let unto Adrian Dirtbags the following described property, to-wit:

Property Description:

The Madison Indoor Athletic Facility located at 3535 Treat Highway, Adrian, Michigan.

- 1. <u>Term</u>. The term of this lease shall be for a period of four months commencing January 1, 2015 and terminating May 1, 2015 unless terminated or extended by the parties. The parties may, at their discretion, renew this Agreement upon terms to be reasonably negotiated and agreed upon by both parties. Any renewal or extension of this Agreement shall be performed through a mutually agreed upon writing executed by both parties.
- 2. <u>Rent and Fees</u>. As rent hereunder, Adrian Dirtbags shall pay Madison the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) annual agreement. Rent shall be paid in a single installment, due to Madison on or before October 15, 2014 and on or before October 1 of any subsequent year for which the Agreement is active. A fee of \$100.00 per hour will be billed to Adrian Dirtbags for any custodial costs beyond normal cleaning and care of the lobby and restrooms.
- 3. <u>Property Use and Occupancy</u>. Adrian Dirtbags covenants that Property will be used solely for the purposes of operating baseball practice and/or related functions. Adrian Dirtbags shall not be permitted to use Property for any non-practice purpose without first obtaining the written consent of Madison. Adrian Dirtbags may not use any area of the Indoor Athletic Facility beyond the designated areas.
- 4. <u>Improvements</u>. Adrian Dirtbags shall be permitted to make improvements to the Property as is necessary to accommodate Adrian Dirtbags use of the Property for the purpose described herein. Prior to undertaking any improvements, Adrian Dirtbags must obtain the express written permission of Madison.

- 5. <u>Insurance</u>. Adrian Dirtbags agree to procure, at its own expense, liability insurance in the sum of \$1,000,000 for damages resulting to an individual person and \$1,000,000 for damages resulting from any single occurrence. Adrian Dirtbags shall name Madison as an additional insured on Adrian Dirtbag's insurance policies. Adrian Dirtbags shall keep said insurance in force during the term of the Lease and shall deliver a copy of the certificate of insurance to Madison. Adrian Dirtbags maintains risk of loss for all personal property associated with Madison's use of the Premises and Madison agrees to procure personal property insurance for coverage of its materials at its own expense.
- 6. <u>Waiver of Liability and Hold Harmless</u>. As additional consideration, Adrian Dirtbags agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Madison from any all claims, causes of action, or liability of any nature, whether arising out of tort, contract, statute, ordinance, or otherwise, which may be asserted against Madison due to the acts or omissions of tenant, its officers, directors, members, agents, employees, or other representatives.
- 7. <u>Amendments</u>. This Agreement shall not be modified or amended without the consent of each party hereto, which consent must be evidenced by an instrument in writing executed by each part, or their respective successors or permitted assigns.
- 8. <u>Termination</u>. If either party fails to comply with any of the terms of the provisions of this Agreement or any of the agreements attached hereto, or defaults in any of its obligations under this Agreement or any agreements attached hereto and fails to correct such default or non-compliance within thirty (30) days after written notice, the non-defaulting party, at its option, may terminate this Agreement or any agreement attached hereto. The default or non-compliance of any of the terms or provisions of this Agreement attached hereto shall constitute a default of this Agreement.

Upon termination of this Agreement, Adrian Dirtbags may, at Adrian Dirtbags sole expense remove any improvements that have been made to the Property where removal of the items will not result in damage to the Property, or where Adrian Dirtbags, at Adrian Dirtbags sole expense, cures all damages and returns the Property to a similar or better condition of Property at the time of execution of this Agreement. All other improvements shall become part of the Property, and Adrian Dirtbags shall forego any right of ownership of the improvements or any value added to the property.

- 9. <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall insure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and permitted assigns.
- 10. <u>Notices</u>. Madison and Adrian Dirtbags will each identify and notify, in writing, the other party of a primary contact for each to facilitate and maintain on-going communication between both parties throughout the length of this Agreement. Notices or consents of any kind required or permitted under this agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed duly deliverable if delivered by person or if mailed or emailed to the appropriate party as follows

- 10. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof.
- 11. <u>No Partnership</u>. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed to create a partnership of other legal entity between Madison and the Adrian Dirtbags.
- 12. <u>Authorization</u>. This Agreement has been duly authorized, executed and delivered by the parties hereto and constitutes a legal, valid and binding obligation of such parties, enforceable in accordance with its terms. Each individual's signatory hereto represents and warrants that the signatory is duly authorized to execute this Agreement on behalf of the signatory's principal.
- 13. <u>Effectiveness</u>. This Agreement shall take effect immediately upon its execution and delivery as the date hereof.

Board Report Kristin Thomas, Principal Madison High School September 15, 2014

- I. Professional Development The HS faculty spent August 27th & 28th working on the UbD unit they started on June 15th. I am very excited about the quality of work that our teachers demonstrated on these days. I am confident that everyone will meet the goal of having one unit fully developed by the end of the trimester.
- II. Welcome Back Week At the high school, we kicked off the school year with a guest speaker & former student, Brent Cook. Brent shared with our entire student body about the things he wished he had done differently as a high school student, the price he has paid for some of his poor choices, and encouraged students to take full advantage of every opportunity they have at Madison. I was pretty proud of Brent and his willingness to be so candid with our students. It was nice to spend the first 30-45minutes of the school year all together, in one place. The week ended with an all school assembly in the PAC. Members of the teaching staff performed skits to highlight handbook rules & procedures, put on a very entertaining fashion show, and supervised an outdoor recess or indoor movie for students. It was a nice ending to a great first week!
- III. Future PD I recently requested to meet with Brian Jones and Stan Masters from the ISD to help me better understand the disparity between our performance on the ACT vs our performance on the Michigan Tests. We have steadily improved on the ACT, but our MME scores are certainly not where they need to be. While there is no clear-cut, easy answer both Stan and Brian advised us to begin doing more to collect specific data around specific standards. I recently discussed this with the HS School Improvement Team and will be discussing this with the entire HS faculty at our next staff meeting. This will not be a quick process, but hopefully if we can begin to collect better data we can better identify areas of student weakness and, ultimately, student performance.



- **IV.** There was an assembly this past Wednesday introducing the topic of financial literacy by TLC. All students grew up with the **TLC savings program** in the elementary. We are trying to continue the program through the eighth grade. One aspect of this program that we are excited about is the potential for students to save for their 8th grade trip early and often.
- **V.** A group of teachers and parents, lead by Mrs. Danyelle Matthews, continues to make plans for an **eighth grade trip to Chicago**. Mrs. Matthews has received a quote from different touring agencies. The lowest quote we received was \$650 for 64 students (subject to minor changes as we work out the final itinerary). This low bid is from Bob Rogers Travel which is the same agent/company we used in years past. This agent is familiar with our needs and expectations for service. For every seat fewer than 64 not filled there will be an additional cost. Six Madison School District educators will volunteer to chaperone the trip. The price per student includes all meals, travel, exhibit fees, and room accommodations. The travel dates are March 26 29, 2014. We are in need of parents to lead fundraising opportunities for students attending the trip. A fundraising meeting for the 8^{th} Grade DC trip, with all stakeholders, was scheduled for this past Thursday at 4:30 p.m.
- **VI.** Madison Middle School's **student enrollment** is 374 students (as of September 12th). At this exact time last year, our enrollment was 378 (380 in 2012 and 361 students in 2011). Between the years of 2005 and 2010 we averaged 333 students. This year there are 128 sixth graders, 128 seventh graders, and 118 eighth graders. Last year there were 137 sixth graders, 129 seventh graders, and 112 eighth graders. In 2012, there were 133 sixth graders, 115 seventh graders, and 132 eighth graders.
- VII. A special committee has been charged with the task of developing a **Six period schedule** for the 2015-2016 school year. Updates will be provided throughout the year as we work to transition from the alternating block schedule to the six period day.

Elementary Board Report - September 15, 2014 Nate Pechaitis – Upper Elementary Principal Linda Kaufman, Early Elementary Principal

1. **School Improvement Plan Summary:** Late this summer we received our school report card information. Our 2013 – 14 elementary school improvement plan was based on the newest data from this report card, local academic data, parent/stakeholder participation/feedback, program evaluations, and district school improvement plan.

In the elementary, our school improvement goals mirror the district goals (Literacy, Social Studies, and Math/Science), as do the strategies that will help us not only keep in line with the other buildings, but also help us reach our goals. The goals for each of the subject areas are to have our students reach their state assigned proficiency targets. We will continue to pay careful attention to the students who are our bottom 30% and those with disabilities, while still pushing all students to reach their potential.

The activities and school wide initiatives that we have put in place are specific to our building. We will be monitoring the progress of implementation as we move throughout the year. Our school improvement team will be leading this process. The School Improvement Plan summary is at the end of this report.

- 2. Leverage Leadership: Nate and Linda have been participating in a class since March called Leverage Leadership led by Debbie McFalone. We are changing our approach to improve instruction and learning. Instead of conducting one or two hour long observations each year, we will be getting into each classroom 8-10 times for 10-15 minute unannounced mini-observations. These mini-observations will each be followed a targeted face to face feedback conversation, where principals and teachers will work on bite-size goals together to improve the instruction and learning in each classroom. The small goals set up for teachers will be in line with the School Improvement Plan, the Teacher Evaluation Rubric, and our School-wide Initiatives. This process began last year, but is continuing to grow this year. So far it has been extremely positive.
- 3. **5**th **Grade Camp**: Our 5th grade teachers have been in planning again for this year's 5th grade camp at CAMP MICHINDOH in Hillsdale. Last year, they expanded the trip from four days to five. They would like to continue with the five days. Five days enables them to improve their programming and give them the opportunity to participate in classes and activities that they previously couldn't. They are asking for your permission to move forward with this. The tentatively scheduled date is January 26-30. The cost of the trip is \$185 per student. However, with fundraising efforts, the price will likely be less than \$160. High school students attending the trip would have no expenses.

Last year I asked our 5th grade teachers to improve the process for the recruitment of high school student leaders, a more defined progressive discipline plan, a more defined procedure for collecting medication to be distributed by the medical staff at Michindoh, and a plan for bus chaperones to and from camp. The 5th grade team has worked with Mrs. Thomas to develop an application process, a better communication system for students and teachers, and a system for assignment and work completion. In addition, they have improved and completed everything else I have asked of them.

One other obstacle that has made things a bit tricky with the involvement of high school students the past two years has been the scheduling of camp and Winter Homecoming. This has been a conflict for our high school students especially, who want to participate in the events that take place throughout the week. Fortunately this year, Mrs. Isom has been able to schedule Winter Homecoming for a different week.

Overall, I think this is another example of one of the outstanding educational opportunities we have been able to offer our students at Madison. I am asking that you approve this opportunity once again.

Madison Elementary School Improvement Plan 2014-2015

Goal 1: All students at Madison Elementary School will become proficient readers.

Measurable Objective 1: 73% of all students will demonstrate proficiency towards reading in English Language Arts by 06/17/2015 as measured by state assessments.

Goal 2: All students at Madison Elementary School will become proficient in Science. Measurable Objective: 41% of all students will demonstrate proficiency toward the core academic area of Science by 06/17/2015 as measured by state assessments.

Goal 3: All students at Madison Elementary will become proficient in mathematics. Measurable Objective: 57% of all students will demonstrate a proficiency in mathematics by 06/17/2015 as measured by state assessments.

Goal 4: All students at Madison Elementary School will become proficient writers.

Measurable Objective: 64% of all students will demonstrate proficiency towards writing in English Language Arts by 06/17/2015 as measured by state assessments.

Goal 5: All students at Madison Elementary School will become proficient in Social Studies.

Measurable Objective: 53% of all students will demonstrate a proficiency of concepts in Social Studies by 06/17/2015 as measured by state assessments.

Strategy 1 (Planning and Preparation): Staff will participate with professional development related to Understanding by Design (UbD) and utilize UbD to guide their planning and preparation to improve student proficiency towards reading.

Understanding by Design, or UbD, is a tool utilized for educational planning focused on 'teaching for understanding' advocated by Jay McTighe and Grant Wiggins in their Understanding by Design (1998), published by the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development. The emphasis of UbD is on 'backward design', the practice of looking at the outcomes in order to design curriculum units, performance assessments, and classroom instruction.

Activity (PD-D): Faculty will participate in professional development to introduce the UbD model. Activity (PD-D): Lenawee Intermediate School District staff will conduct ongoing professional development embedded in the district to support the implementation and utilization of UbD model. Activity (PD-D): All staff will participate in departmental and/or grade level meetings as part of a professional learning community.

Activity (I-D): All faculty will utilize UbD resources to collaboratively create, plan, and prepare one (1) complete unit by the end of the first trimester to ensure horizontal and vertical alignment. Activity (M-D): Each grade or department will submit to the building principal a unit plan.

Strategy 2 (Instruction and Learning): All content area staff will utilize the Gradual release of Responsibility model to ensure students learning.

The Gradual Release of Responsibility Model or GRR Model is a particular style of teaching which is a structured method of pedagogy framed around a process devolving responsibility within the learning process from the teacher to the eventual independence of the learner. This instructional model requires that the teacher, by design, transitions from assuming 'all the responsibility for performing a task...to a situation in which the students assume all of the responsibility.' The ideal result is a confident learner who accepts responsibility for their own learning and directs this learning through the cognitive processes involved, moving through the academic spectrum, to independent choice (personalized learning). As Buehl (2005) stated, the GRR model "emphasizes instruction that mentors students into becoming capable thinkers and learners when handling the tasks with which they have not yet developed expertise".

Research: Gradual Release of Responsibility, Pearson and Gallagher, 1993

Activity (PD-D): Staff will participate with ongoing professional development embedded in the district to support the Gradual Release of Responsibility model, including planning documentation of student data and differentiation.

Activity (PD-D): All staff will participate in departmental and/or grade level meetings as part of a professional learning community.

Activity (I-D): All staff will implement the Gradual Release of Responsibility model within the first month of instruction.

Activity (E-D): All staff will document the evidence of formative assessments and focus lessons (mini-lessons) within lesson plans and administration and LISD staff will monitor the implementation of the Gradual Release of Responsibility model through classroom walkthroughs and MDE Program Model.

Activity (M-D): District staff will use student achievement data (NWEA Classroom breakdown report, AIMSweb, locally developed assessments, etc.: to guide small group instruction.

Activity (PD-D): Serving All Learners with 21st Century Technology PD – Administrators and/or teachers will participate with research-based technology professional development to integrate into their core instruction in all core areas.

Activity (I-ES/MS): Research-based Tiered Interventions – District staff will implement an effective, research based, multi-tiered model of instruction/intervention support through the use of school-wide strategies and intervention support through the use of school-wide strategies and intervention instruction to students who qualify below the 30th percentile to increase reading, writing, mathematics, science, and social studies achievement. Timely assistance will be provided to students with difficulty meeting standards through additional tiered intervention support by Title I paraprofessionals, Literacy Coach, and/or Kindergarten At-Risk Aides.

Activity (M-ES/MS): Data Meetings Grade level teachers will participate with intervention staff for data meetings to discuss fidelity of programs, to analyze student academic/behavior data and to plan for strategic instruction/intervention support for students.

Activity (I-ES/MS): Culture of Achievement Program (CAP) – Students will receive homework support during lunch and after school in the Culture of Achievement Program.

Activity (P-ES): Pursue development of an at-risk student mentoring system.

Activity (I): Academic Curriculum Nights – Teachers will provide a night for parents to see examples of activities that their child/ren are doing at school. They will also gain insight into how to help at home and other available resources to support their children.

Activity (M): A School-wide Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports system will be maintained to ensure student academic success and will include Check-In Check-Out Program.

Activity (PD): Evidence Based Literacy intervention (EBLI) – Training/Coaching will be provided for teachers to instruct using the EBLI program.

Strategy 3 (Instruction and Learning): Staff will facilitate academic literacy strategies (response to text) in all content areas.

Through 'Response to Text' students develop a variety of strategies in response to literature through written and oral forms demonstrating comprehension through interpretation, evaluation, and analysis. Students respond to literature often time by making comparisons of text through text to self, text to text, and text to world and often respond to literature by justifying claims using evidence found in text. The objective is to have students connect ideas and information found in what they read to events and ideas from their own knowledge and experiences and from other texts to empower their understanding and interpretation. Ultimately 'Response to Text' supports the process to interpret, summarize, and/or draw conclusions with examples from text and/or from their own experiences.

Activity (I): All staff will facilitate response to text methods writing the first month of instruction.

Activity (I): All teachers will explicitly teach summarization strategies in all classrooms in all content areas throughout each week.

Activity (I): All teachers will implement explicit vocabulary instruction in all classrooms in all content areas throughout each week.

Activity (I): Word Work Curriculum will be implemented in all classrooms in all content areas throughout each week.

Activity (I): Reading A-Z License – teachers will use reading A-Z on-line access to differentiate instruction and assessment. The materials will be used to provide leveled reading materials as well as a variety of different genres for study.

Activity (PD): Teachers will participate with professional development related to responding to text and/or research-based PD related to literacy

Strategy 4 (Monitoring, Assessment, and Follow-Up): Teachers will model depth of knowledge levels 2 and 3 (Skills and Concepts & Strategic Thinking and Reasoning) on a daily basis.

Students who master depth of knowledge level 2 use information or conceptual knowledge to carry out a procedure. Students who master Level 3 break information into parts to explore understanding and relationships to make judgments.

Activity (PD): Teachers and administrators will participate with professional development related to Webb's Depth of Knowledge to learn how to develop curriculum based on Bloom's levels and learn how to create meaningful assessments.

Activity (I): Teachers will implement skills learned in Depth of Knowledge professional development in each classroom during the first trimester.

Activity (M): Monitor implementation of Depth of Knowledge Strategy using classroom walk-throughs and professional learning community work.

Activity (M): Process Checks – Monitor student data and student progress
