The Board enjoyed a photo opportunity with Midwest Energy representative, Patty Clark, to commemorate the gift of funding to support programs such as The Leader In Me and Rachel's Challenge.

- I. LISD Superintendent Jim Philp has asked for some time at this meeting to update you on the Lenawee Intermediate School District. It is my understanding that he has a short video to share with you.
- II. When the ¼ of a mill additional Building & Site millage was approved last May we committed to use that additional millage for the next two years to support the work of the FAN committee in renovating the year around sports facility adjacent to the baseball and softball fields. I have been approving small purchases and projects from those funds, but we now have a request from FAN to purchase the artificial turf needed for the building. Because of the size of the purchase Board approval is necessary. We have two bids:

Boone Action Turf for \$21,147.50 ProGrass for \$39,685.00

We have seen samples of the Boone Action Turf product. It looks excellent and should serve our purposes extremely well. I am recommending you accept the Boone bid.

On a related note – work is progressing very well on the facility. Electrical and insulation work has been completed and the steel siding has been installed. I commend Brad Anschuetz and Jerry Isom for overseeing and coordinating the project.

- III. At your October meeting we had a first reading on Policy 8661 Transportation of Students In Parades. The proposed policy is included in this packet for further consideration and hopefully adoption.
- IV. Kris has some recommendations in her report on coaching positions for the winter sports season.
- V. The last item on the agenda for this meeting is a technology update from Tom Madziar. Tom, like nearly all of our teachers, is doing some great things with technology. We will end the meeting by making a trip to Tom's room where he has a presentation prepared for you. I believe you will find his presentation insightful and rewarding. We hope to provide more of these opportunities for you at meetings when we have a light agenda.
- VI. Our unaudited enrollment on the October 2<sup>nd</sup> official count day is 1,558.74, a decline of 31.32 students from our 1,590.06 October 2012 enrollment.

- Unfortunately, it is also 66.26 students less than projected in our initial 2013-14 budget, or more than \$520,000.
- VII. Three committees of elementary teachers have been meeting weekly to work on some of the more significant issues that have to be addressed as we continue our discussions on a Year Around or "Balanced School Year" for elementary students whose parents might prefer that type of an educational experience for their children. We are a long way from having any recommendations for your consideration, but the teachers are having some great discussions and are doing some exciting work.
- VIII. Congratulations again go out to our Varsity Volleyball team on their MHSAA District Championship. Their season came to an end in the Regional Championship game Thursday evening to an excellent Mendon team. (Many believe Mendon should end up winning the State Championship.) Nonetheless, our team had a season to remember. Outsized by nearly every opponent they played, they finished with 49 wins, including the Lenawee County Championship. Great job!
  - IX. I extend my very best to each of you and your families as we prepare to celebrate another Thanksgiving. We all truly do have so much to be thankful for both in our personal and professional relationships. Too often we focus on only the challenges that confront us, overlooking the many, many wonderful things that are part of our daily lives. I know I am certainly guilty of that. Over the past couple of weeks I have spent a lot of time in the evenings visiting a nursing home; what a tremendous reminder that if we and our loved ones are enjoying good health we really are blessed. I hope this Thanksgiving is full of blessings for each of you.

# **Strategic Planning-Community and Stakeholder Involvement**

Rebecca Schwan constructed a survey to be completed by Madison stakeholders based on feedback received at the Madison School District School Board and Stakeholder Workshop. The intent of the survey was to collect perceptual data regarding how Madison can improve opportunities for two-way communication between school and stakeholder. Alert messages to inform families of the opportunity to complete the survey were sent October 16<sup>th</sup> and then again November 1. Approximately 135 individuals completed the survey providing guidance and direction to the District as to how constituents may be better informed. Some aspects of this feedback align with current efforts contained within the Title I Parent Involvement Plan and Policy. Results of the survey presented this evening will be posted on the website and action plans will be constructed to improve community and stakeholder communication and involvement.

Board Report Kristin Thomas, Principal November 18<sup>th</sup>, 2013

- I. November 8<sup>th</sup> Early Release The HS faculty divided their early release time between our two academic initiatives, Writing in the content areas and addressing the needs of our struggling learners (bottom 30%). We revisited some of our Academic Literacy Strategies, specifically how to effectively annotate text. We also looked at student assessment data next to student course grades to identify areas where our curriculum may not align with student performance on national assessments. We ended the day in grade level teams reviewing students who were failing at progress report time and developing plans/interventions to help these students.
- II. Parent-Teacher Conferences HS Parent Teacher Conferences were held in the lobbies of the HS Activity Center and the Performing Arts Center. We chose a different venue for conferences this year after receiving feedback that parents were concerned with the lack of confidentiality in the cramped space of the Media Center. I think we will be holding our Parent Teacher Conferences in this area of the school in the future...it was much nicer for both parents and teachers! Attendance was exactly the same as last year....55%.
- III. College Application Week Nov 4<sup>th</sup> Nov 8<sup>th</sup> was College Application Week at Madison High School! During this week, all of our seniors either applied to a college (or several), made contact with the military, or took part in a job fair at Siena Heights University. I cannot say enough about the work that Mrs. Stelzer put into this week to ensure that all of our seniors have a post-high school "plan". Each day of the week there was a different theme or activity for all students. Please visit the HS Facebook page to see photos and the post-high school plans of each of our seniors.
- IV. Practice ACT All of our juniors took the Practice ACT this past month. We moved the practice test up to allow students and our College Readiness teachers to have scores back before the 2<sup>nd</sup> trimester begins. Our College Readiness teachers will be working closely with our juniors over the next 12 weeks to prepare them for the Michigan Merit Exam in March.
- V. Celebrations We have much to celebrate at the High School! In addition to our girls Golf Team (who we recognized last month), our Cross Country Teams and our Varsity Volleyball Team have experienced tremendous success this year! Both our girls and boys Cross Country Teams took home league championships. Chris Kangas, David Gilbert, and Megan Rosales ran at the State Meet and did very well. Chris Kangas received Academic All-State Honors, as well. Our Varsity Girls Volleyball Team has a very impressive overall record which includes a District Championship and a potential Regional Championship! It is good to be a Trojan!!!

Madison Middle School Brad Anschuetz, Principal November 18, 2013 Board Report

I. Mrs. Jill Brandeberry made arrangements for four of our sixth grade students to present at the Michigan Capital building on 23 October. These students were Chelsea Short, Brooke Strong, Erica Lynn and Alex Kelly. Her students showcased some of the educational technology initiatives that Mrs. Brandeberry has implemented in her classroom. Senator Caswell and Representative Jenkins met with our students. It won't be long in education before every student has a one-to-one technology device in their hands during all class sessions.

Madison Seventh Graders (Chelsea Short, Brooke Strong, Erica Lynn and Alex Kelly) were just introduced on the Senate floor.



- II. On the second early release date, the middle school teachers worked on Academic Writing in the Content Classroom. Our focus for the year is on "Academic Writing in the Common Core" and "Close and Critical Reading". By undergoing a yearlong study our faculty will be able to learn and then implement small chunks of professional knowledge into their lesson design. Teachers will collect student artifacts as outcomes from their lessons and activities. These artifacts then become discussion points at our team meetings. Team members reflect upon quality instruction based on the student artifacts in front of the team. Colleagues are talking about lesson design and how strategies can be enhanced for future learning.
- III. Renee Forche and Deanna Garno, our eighth grade Language Arts teachers, and Danyelle Matthews, Social Studies teacher, are collaborating across their curriculums to teach a unit together. One common source the two content areas will be using is the book "Break the Chains". The more we can connect content areas the greater the potential for deeper learning. We will invest resources to support any such endeavors.
- IV. Literacy Coach, Alison Cincelli, and Principal Tiffany Peterson, from Carrollton Middle School, visited Madison Middle School Thursday, 31 October, to learn about our programming for interventions and curriculum.
- V. This past Friday, November 1<sup>st</sup>, all buildings participated in Pajama Rama! Students purchased a bracelet for \$1 and they were able to wear their PJ's! All money raised (\$714) goes to help homeless students in Lenawee County.

# I. Professional Development –

On Friday, November  $8^{th}$  the elementary worked together with Kelly Cichy, Dina Payne and Gary Nowak to continue the work with Next Generation Science Standards. In the morning, K-12 science teacher representatives from several schools in the county, including Dina and Gary, continued their work and were able to finish broad 'I Can' statements for K-2, 3-5, 6-8 and  $9-12^{th}$  grades. Kelly, Dina, and Gary worked with our faculty on the structure/process we will be following with the science work ahead. Additionally, they provided support as we worked together in grade levels to develop grade specific 'I Can' statements. At upcoming grade level team meetings we will continue this work by aligning this work vertically (across the grades).

We are very fortunate to have the expertise, enthusiasm, and leadership from our staff and LISD leaders as we continue the process of developing our science curriculum!

### II. Tropa de Niños Piqueños (Troop of Young Children) –

Last Spring, a group of elementary children worked together with Mrs. Raquel Ybarra to prepare for Cinco de May performances for our school. Since that time, this group has continued to perform a variety of Mexican Folkloric dances around Lenawee County. On May 3<sup>rd</sup> of this year, the students had 3 performances at school and 2 performances at the Adrian Public Library (a First Friday Downtown invitation) which lead to a busy summer. On May 5<sup>th</sup> the children participated in a parade and performed at Sunny Side Café for the Cinco de Mayo festivities. They won 1<sup>st</sup> place for best cultural and performance and the trophy is showcased in the Elementary office. #### III. Parent Involvement Plan –

The elementary has been working on our Parent Involvement Plan this fall. #### **8661 - TRANSPORTATION OF STUDENTS IN PARADES**

The Board of Education authorizes the transportation of students by private vehicle in District sponsored parades and celebrations under the following conditions:

Any such transportation must be approved in advance and in writing by the principal in accordance with the Superintendent's administrative guidelines.

The parent of the participating student will be given, on request, the name of the driver and the description of the vehicle.

No person shall be approved for the transportation of students in a private vehicle who is not an employee of this Board; an approved volunteer; or the parent of a student enrolled in this District and the holder of a currently-valid license to operate a motor vehicle in the State of Michigan.

A person transporting students shall be the holder of automobile liability and personal injury insurance in the amount required by District administrative guidelines. The Superintendent may withdraw the authorization of any private vehicle driver whose insurance is not adequate.

Any private vehicle used for the transportation of students must conform to registration requirements of the State and must be in a safe operable condition.

In addition to the driver, one adult for each 15 students shall ride on each vehicle throughout the parade and shall supervise students riding on the vehicle. School behavior and discipline guidelines shall be in effect for all students participating in a District parade or celebration.

Drivers and supervisors who are not professional staff members are requested to report student misconduct to the principal.

Students riding on a float or parade vehicle are to remain seated with their legs completely inside the vehicle unless the vehicle has side railings that extend to at least the height of the student's chest. The railings must be secure and spaced close enough together to prevent a student from falling off the vehicle.

Students shall not be allowed to enter or exit a parade vehicle unless the vehicle is completely stopped and the student has received permission from the adult supervisor to do so.

Expenses incurred by drivers of private vehicles in the course of transporting students in a parade or other District celebration will not be reimbursed by the District.
