Annual Summer Tax Resolution

The following preamble and resolution were offered by Member Julie Ramos, and supported by Member Tina Claiborne.

WHEREAS:

This Board previously adopted a resolution to impose a summer tax levy to collect one-half of annual school property taxes, including debt services, upon property located within the school district and continuing from year to year until specifically revoked by this Board of Education.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. This Board, pursuant to 1976 PA 451, as amended (the "Revised School Code"), hereby invokes for 2018 its previously adopted ongoing resolution imposing a summer tax levy of one-half of school property taxes, including debt service, and continuing from year to year until specifically revoked by this Board and requests each city and/ or township in which this District is located to collect those summer taxes.
- 2. The Superintendent or designee is authorized and directed to forward to the governing body of each city and/ or township in which this District is located a copy of the Board's resolution imposing a summer property tax levy on an ongoing basis and a copy of this resolution requesting that each such city and/ or township agree to collect the summer tax levy for 2018 in the amount specified in this resolution. Such forwarding of the resolutions and the request to collect the summer tax levy shall be performed so that they are received by the appropriate governing bodies before January 1, 2018.
- 3. Pursuant to and in accordance with Section 1613(1) of the Revised School Code, the Superintendent or designee is authorized and directed to negotiate on behalf of this District with the governing body of each city and/ or township in which the District is located for the reasonable expenses for collection of the District's summer tax levy that the city and/ or township may bill under MCL 380.1611 or MCL 380.1612. Any such proposed agreement shall be brought before this Board for its approval or disapproval.
- 4. All resolutions and parts of resolutions insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this resolution are hereby rescinded.

- 2. School administrators notified the Student's parents of the specific charge underlying the discipline recommendation, as well as the date, time, and place of the disciplinary hearing.
- 3. Pursuant to the request of the Student's parents, and as authorized by Section 8(b) of the Michigan Open Meetings Act, MCL 15.268(b), the disciplinary hearing was conducted in a closed session meeting of the Board.
- 4. The hearing afforded the Student and the Student's representatives an opportunity to respond to the charge and to present pertinent evidence for the Board's consideration.
- 5. The Board has carefully considered all of the evidence produced in this student discipline hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. A preponderance of the evidence establishes that on October 4, 2017, the Student videotaped other individuals in the restroom, where those other individuals have a reasonable expectation of privacy, and distributed, disseminated, or transmitted the captured video to other persons in violation of the Student Code of Conduct (Serious Offense as deemed by administration and Disruptive Conduct, Board Policy 5136 (Wireless Communication Devices), and Sections 539d and 539j of Michigan's Penal Code, MCL 750.539d, 750.539j.
- 2. Based on careful consideration of all of the following factors, the Board determines that expulsion is warranted:
 - The student's age;
 - The student's disciplinary history;
 - Whether the student has a disability;
 - The seriousness of the behavior;
 - Whether the behavior posed a safety risk;
 - Whether restorative practices are a better option; and
 - Whether lesser interventions would address the behavior.

- 3. The Student is permanently expelled from the District.
- 4. During the time of the expulsion, the Student may not be on school grounds or attend any functions at the District without prior written approval from the Superintendent.
- 5. Consistent with Sections 11a and 1311(1) of the Revised School Code, the Board finds that the interests of the District are served by this resolution.
- 6. Administrators are directed and authorized to implement all terms of this resolution and are delegated all necessary authority to do so.
- 7. All resolutions and parts of resolutions that conflict with the provisions of this resolution are rescinded.

The administration has recommended that a student whose identity is known to the Board (the "Student") be expelled for (a) kissing another student multiple times against the will of the other student; (b) placing his head in the lap of another student against the will of the other student; (c) unbuttoning the pants of another student and touching the student's genitals against the will of the other student while also having attempted to remove the other student's pants and undergarments; (d) attempting to engage in fellatio with another student against the will of the other student, which included

requesting that the other student engage in fellatio with him; and (e) exposing his genitals to another student.

- 2. School administrators notified the Student's parents/guardians of the specific charge underlying the discipline recommendation, as well as the date, time, and place of the disciplinary hearing.
- 3. Pursuant to the request of the Student's parents/guardians, and as authorized by Section 8(b) of the Michigan Open Meetings Act, MCL 15.268(b), the disciplinary hearing was conducted in a closed session meeting of the Board.
- 4. The hearing afforded the Student and the Student's representatives an opportunity to respond to the charge and to present pertinent evidence for the Board's consideration.
- 5. The Board has carefully considered all of the evidence produced in this student discipline hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. A preponderance of the evidence establishes that on November 27, 2017, the Student (a) kissed another student multiple times against the will of the other student; (b) placed his head in the lap of another student against the will of the other student; (c) unbuttoned the pants of another student and touched the student's genitals against the will of the other student while also having attempted to remove the other student's pants and undergarments; (d) attempted to engage in fellatio with another student against the will of the other student, which included requesting that the other student engage in fellatio with him; and (e) exposed his genitals to another student in violation of the following policies found within the Madison Elementary School Student Handbook, Madison School District Board Policy, and Michigan's Penal Code: Expectation of students to abide by State laws [pg. 23 of the Madison Elementary School Student Handbook], Harassment [pgs. 28-29 of the Madison Elementary School Student Handbook], Anti-Harassment [Board Policy 5517], and Criminal Sexual Conduct [MCL 750.520c].

Superintendent's Report January 22, 2018

1) October 23 Board of Education Meeting Minutes (Information Item)

The meeting minutes for October 23 did include the approval of two resolutions. However, the resolutions themselves were not included. Therefore, the consent agenda at this meeting will include board approval to modify the meeting minutes to include two resolutions which will then be placed in the official records.

2) Reorganization Meeting Items (Action Item)

Organizational meeting items will be determined as the Board is accustomed to doing each January. We will facilitate this process as part of the regular board meeting.

3) School Board Appreciation Month (Information Item)

January is School Board Member recognition month in Michigan. I often say, "Great things are happening at Madison". I want to express my sincere appreciation to the board members for their continued support. I, on behalf of the entire Madison family wish to thank you for your extraordinary support. This month provides an opportunity for us to thank you for your dedication, commitment, and continued service to the students at Madison. Thank you for dedicating time and energy to always do what is in the best long-term interest of the students we serve.

4) 2017-18 School of Choice (SOC) Summary (Information Item)

A few of you have asked about the 2017-18 SOC figures for Madison and other public school districts in Lenawee County. I have provided an unaudited summary for your review.

5) Change of Board of Education Meeting Date (Information Item)

A reminder that due to the meeting date in February occurring on Presidents' Day the board moved this meeting to February 12 rather than February 19.

6) Purchase of School Bus (Action Item)

At the November board of education meeting the board provided approval to develop specifications and to seek bids for a used low mileage school bus. \$92,000 was budgeted this year for purchase of a school bus. As I communicated in November, Madison School District last purchased a school bus in June 2016. The school bus purchased at that time had 16,000 miles and was purchased for \$68,800.

The lowest responsible bid received is from Hoekstra Transportation at a quote of \$73,500. The bus will have approximately 22,000 miles. A new school bus is quoted

at \$99,364. The district does have the option to purchase two buses at a discounted price of \$71,000 each. One bus would be delivered no later than June 30, 2018 and the other delivered after July 1, 2018. I recommend the board approve purchase of at least one bus, with the determination to purchase a second bus at the discounted rate to be made by the superintendent and business manager. This determination would be made after careful review of the budget and budget revisions following the spring count.

7) Approval of 2018-19 8th Grade Trip (Action Item)

Mr. Anschuetz will communicate details of the proposed 2018 8th grade trip. Aspects are also included within his written report to the board. The District is seeking board approval to allow further planning and preparation to occur. I recommend the board approve the proposed 8th Grade Trip.

- I. The event walked parents through the PSAT, the redesigned SAT, ACT Workkeys, and M-Step assessments, College Readiness, and planning for senior year and beyond. Several families were in attendance and the feedback we received afterwards was extremely positive.
- III. VIP Breakfast The VIP Breakfast for 1st trimester was postponed until January 26th.
- IV. Music All of our music programs, Choir, Orchestra, & Band performed in holiday concerts prior to our Christmas Break. It is great to see so many of our students participating in our growing music programs.
- V. Scheduling for the 18-19 school year Within the next few weeks, Mrs. Stelzer will begin the scheduling process for the upcoming 18-19 school year. We have included reminders to students and parents on the trimester progress reports about scheduling with the hopes that parents and students will take a vested interest in this process!

Board Report Brad Anschuetz Madison Middle School January 22, 2018

- I. Mrs. June Cessna and Mrs. Stephanie Fetter will work in collaboration to cover Mrs. Jodi Swinehart's leave of absence. Mrs. Cessna worked in the Madison School District as the Administrative Assistant to the Superintendent until her retirement in 2007. She has spent 30 hours of training with Jodi over the past two weeks in preparation for running the middle school office. Mrs. Fetter works part time for the administrative offices of Adrian College. She is currently completing an assignment in the Adrian College Registrar's Office. The Madison family wishes Jodi and the Swinehart family well in the days ahead. Jodi is expecting a full recovery and will return after spring break.
- II. Mrs. Sylvia Sotelo is seeking student recommendations for participation in this year's "Payback for Education" on May 9th. Some 20-25 eighth-grade Madison students will be invited to participate in the program. As a participant, students will spend the day at a local business job-shadowing in a career interest of their choice, enjoy lunch at the Siena Heights University Field House, and meet students from other Lenawee County Schools.
- III. On Martin Luther King Day our teachers continued to develop Units of Study on the Canvas learning management system. VI. Madison Middle School administered the Preliminary Scholastic Assessment Test (PSAT) on 11 January to all eligible eighth-grade students. The PSAT is a product of the College Board program. Research indicates that students who take the PSAT are more likely to score higher on the SAT during their junior year of high school. This statistic is due, in part, to the familiarity of taking a timed, high-

stakes test. Furthermore, the information gained from the PSAT will be used to meet the academic needs of the student.

Students taking the PSAT will receive a report that includes a composite score in Critical Reading, Mathematics, and Writing skills. This report will also inform the student if they are below, at, or above the benchmark scores to predict readiness for college.

- VII. There were 383 students enrolled at Madison Middle School for the first trimester. A total of 140 students made VIP Honor roll, of which 43 earned all A's. Another 28 students made the Honor Roll. This means that 44% of the student body received honors for their grades the first trimester. On a similar note, 211 students qualified for the merit trip to MJR theaters.
- VIII. Students from Madison Middle School were selected to present the work that they are doing, in Mrs. Jill Brandeberry's technology course, at the State Student Technology Showcase. The showcase is held at the Capitol in Lansing, Michigan. Sixth graders Seth Kably, Ashlin Hill, Aubree Pizana, and Emily Murry presented their websites to Governor Snyder, Representative Kahle, Senator Zorn, and many others. They discussed how they built their websites using HTML and CSS language. They also talked about how persistence, attention to detail, and creativity are important aspects of coding.
- IX. The 7th and 8th grade Boys' Basketball teams were both crowned Madison Tournament champions in December and completed identical 9-2 seasons. Congratulations to both teams on their success.

8th Grade Trip - October 4-6, 2018 Northern Michigan Tour

Pending Board approval of next year's eighth grade class trip to Northern Michigan, an informational meeting is scheduled for January 31, 2018 at 5:45 p.m. in the cafeteria for interested parents and students. The travel dates are scheduled for October 4-6, 2018. The cost is \$549 per student. This price includes transportation by a chartered bus, all entry fees to museums and exhibits, lodging, and all meals (students bring money for the first stop on the way).

Why Northern Michigan?

After careful consideration of all the information provided, including student participation data for the past five years and the influx in cost, the 8th grade team chose Northern Michigan as the destination for the 2018 class trip. Educational opportunity remains a key focus of the trip along with fostering student independence, and peer comradery. Over the years, we discovered that most students at this age are naturally more excited to be away from their parents and to be with their peers. The destination point of interest is secondary to the goal of independence and peer interaction. The number of students attending has dwindled down quite significantly due to the increasing costs of traveling. We would like as many 8th graders as possible to attend the trip and many students have never seen all the beauty our great state possesses.

Who is eligible to attend the trip?

All current 7th grade students are invited to attend the trip as 8th graders next year. Students must be in good standing in order to attend. Beginning the first day of the final trimester, March 5, 2018, students who earn 4 behavioral referrals, and/or have been suspended in or out of school are NOT considered to be in good standing. This also includes any infractions incurred during September and October of the new school year (2018-2019). If students fail 4 or more classes during the second and third trimesters of the current school year cumulatively, they will not be considered to be in good standing. Students not in good standing are afforded a due process hearing where the student may appeal their case to a committee panel for review.

What adults are going to supervise my child(ren)?

A group of classroom teachers and/or administrators will be attending the trip to chaperone. Once in Northern Michigan we will have security guards at our hotel, along with licensed tour guides for most stops.

How much does it cost?

The total cost for the Northern Michigan trip is \$549. For your convenience, this has been broken out into installment payments. Payments can be made by ANYONE who wants to help a student accomplish this feat. Relatives, divorced families, etc. may create their own account in www.MySchoolBucks.com and select the student they will be making payments for. Payments may be made using credit or debit card by visiting www.MySchoolBucks.com, or you may make cash or check payments to *Madison School District*.

• Will there be any fundraising?

If any parent(s) would like to have a fundraising committee, please contact Mr. Anschuetz or Mrs. Matthews. Students may fundraise for the cost of the trip only and there will be no refunds of fundraised monies. Any extra monies will be donated to the account designated for the eighth grade class trip. Students, of course, are encouraged to raise money on their own to help parents off-set the cost of the trip, and/or to have extra spending money on the trip.

Will my child(ren) need spending money?

Although it is recommended that your child have a little extra money for traveling, it is not completely necessary. All meals are included in the cost of the trip (except for the first breakfast), however, it has been my experience that the Meal Money students are given does not necessarily cover the cost of HOW much students want to eat. If your child would like to buy a souvenir or a snack, they may do so with their own spending money. The cost of the trip includes most of the meals, lodging, transportation, the group photo, and admission fees.

• Can I get my money back if it is decided later my child(ren) will not be going?

The cost of the trip is based on a set number of students going. The first payment will act as a deposit for the trip. In the event that a student backs out of the trip, then the student will be reimbursed the difference between the costs accrued for the student not attending the trip and the amount already paid by the student. Any refund requests for the remaining balance paid by a parent will have to be presented to a committee panel consisting of teachers and administrators. Once the panel has reviewed the reason for the refund request you will be notified of the decision. The most important fact we would like to stress is that the decision will be made based on the circumstances for the request and what will best serve the student population going. Any fundraising monies raised will be forfeited.

1. Percentage of students moving to proficient levels of reading per grade level:

In the beginning of the year, we spoke to you about the 3rd grade reading law, and how that will impact our instruction and learning. Students who are not proficiently reading have Individual Reading Improvement Plans (IRIPs). In addition, they have Home Reading Plans. Our teachers have done a fantastic job to carry out these plans. We continue to monitor data on a monthly basis, and make any adjustments we see fit. Following one trimester of instruction and interventions, we are pleased to see the great improvement our students are making. As you can see in the chart below, the percentage of students moving to proficiency is encouraging.

2. MLK Day Professional Development:

Based on ongoing data meetings, monitoring plans, having rich discussion about our literacy instruction, we planned our MLK Professional Development to focus on the specific needs of our different grade levels. Building continuity and consistency among the different classrooms and grade levels is important. We feel we need to provide an established minimum standard of care to our students, so no matter what classroom they are in, we are certain they are receiving a rich literacy learning experience based on research-based best practices.

On January 15th, teachers of 4-year-olds through 3rd grade spent the morning learning about Phonics Dance. This was facilitated by Ginny Dowd. Ginny trained our staff seven or eight years ago, and it was time for a refresher for those who went through the first time, and also an initial training for those who have joined us since. Phonics Dance is our phonics curriculum in the early elementary school. We use this, along with EBLI, to help children decode words, master letter-sound relationships, understand word structure, develop word-solving strategies, and making meaning of words.

Our 4th and 5th grade teachers spent the morning learning more about how to improve reading comprehension through student collaboration and responding to text. Our teachers are telling us, as is our data that our children struggle to move beyond basic comprehension. They are pretty good at retelling/summarizing what they have read. However, their deep thinking and communicating about their reading is a challenge. Our focus is moving students' thinking from "within the text" to "beyond

and about the text". Each grade level will be making a collective effort to improve this process. They will be teaching students how to better respond to their reading. They will be collecting responses to text from their students for the next few weeks. We will be meeting together to examine student responses and plan next steps. In the meantime, Heidi Miller will be coaching teachers and students as they increase their focus on this work.

In the afternoon, our teachers worked on refining Science UbD units and working with Greg Marten to coordinate their classroom learning with Co-Lab Learning.

3. Schoolwide Celebration in December

As part of our PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention Support), we had a 45-minute character education assembly called The NED Show. Using humor, storytelling, audience participation and amazing object lessons including yo-yo and magic tricks, students learned about NED. NED is a loveable cartoon character whose name is an acronym for Never give up, Encourage others, and Do your best. After the assembly, staff had access to an extensive collection of resources. The lesson plans, videos, and classroom activities centered upon the NED traits and easily integrated into our existing curriculum (Second Step). The students and staff enjoyed the assembly and the message that was delivered.

In addition, about three hundred qualifying upper elementary students attended merit trips for their commitment to hard work and kindness. Third graders went to Ten Pin Bowling Alley in Tecumseh; fourth graders visited the Adrian Skatery; fifth graders went to a Toledo Walleyes game.

4. Madison Co-Laboratory and STEAM Instructional Model

As we move forward, Technology Class will remain a special and the Co-Lab will be used for a collaborative teaching experience to enhance your NGSS UbD units. Based on observations and feedback, we made the decision that our students will attend Technology Class as a special in the Computer Lab with Jeanelle Wonders as their instructor. The curriculum in Technology will be mostly similar to years past. As for the Co-Lab, Greg will be reaching out to each grade level to first confirm the scope & sequence of their NGSS UbD units for the rest of the year, and see if the UbD Framework is still accurate. Once he determines what content is being taught in classrooms through the UbD units, he will determine the appropriate Science and Engineering practices (and perhaps technology) to enhance the learning of the content. The practices he will focus on in the lab are those that are listed for each NGSS topic. They can be found here: NGSS Standards by Topic. Then, he will help plan/prepare/facilitate the lab experience with each grade level. Once he knows what needs to happen, he will work with teachers to determine the level of his involvement, as well as the scheduling of lab times for each class. This model will be evaluated again for its effectiveness.

The primary role of the classroom teacher will be to continue to strengthen the literacy connections to the NGSS UbD units through small group instruction. In addition, they will work collaboratively with Greg in the Co-Lab for some of the experiential components to the UbD units.

As instructional technology coach, Greg will continue to work with grade levels or individuals to improve the use of technology to enhance learning in the classroom. For instance, he has been working with third grade teachers and students on some block base programming. This will support the math learning about area and perimeter if appropriately brought together. He is wanting to enhance this learning by

applying their new programming skills to math concepts of area & perimeter through the use of simple robots. In addition, Greg is collaborating with teachers to help them use technology to drive their instruction. I recently sat in a third grade classroom, where students logged into Canvas to take a quiz. The analytics that Canvas can provide are tremendous. This was the first step in this direction in the elementary. We are anxious to see this continue.
