Superintendent's Report

April 18, 2016

I. Madison Project Lead the Way (PLTW) Biomedical Sciences (Oral Report)

Katie McGormley and Bonnie Dietrich will be present Monday evening to provide an update regarding current and future initiatives pertaining to Madison's PLTW Biomedical Sciences Program.

II. Hiring of Early Elementary Principal (Action Item)

The Madison administrative team is pleased to recommend Abby Miller to you as Early Elementary Principal of Madison Elementary School effective July 1. This recommendation is based on the vacancy created through the retirement of Linda Kaufman. Linda will have been an educator for 39 years including 20 years at Madison where she served as Early Elementary Principal for the past seven.

Abby is an outstanding candidate from a pool of three impressive internal applicants. She was chosen for her vision and passion for early elementary education and for her knowledge of curriculum and instruction. Abby holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Early Elementary Education (ZA endorsement), Middle School Science (DX) and Social Studies (RX) endorsements, and a Masters of Arts degree in Reading Education (Reading Specialist endorsement). Abby will conclude this school year as a 5th grade teacher - her 12th year of teaching at Madison. The addition of Abby Miller to the administrative team at Madison will continue the rich tradition of providing quality early elementary education opportunities for the students of Madison Schools. I recommend the Board approve Abby Miller as Madison Early Elementary Principal effective July 1, 2016.

III. May 3rd Election (Information Item)

I ask that you continue to educate your family members, friends, and neighbors about the two millage items pertaining to Madison Schools placed on the May 3rd ballot for residents of Madison School District. The 18 mill operational renewal is not levied on a person's primary residency, only on second homes, and commercial and industrial property. The additional 0.25 mill Building and Site request would cost a typical home owner (\$100,000 home with a \$50,000 taxable value) approximately \$1.00 a month or \$12.00 per year. Potential projects to maintain and improve the current facility are outlined on the Website for individuals to review. I have attached a proof of the ballot in the Board Packet as it will appear for voters May 3rd.

A two-page summary regarding the two items placed on the ballot is included in your packet. An example of the ballot is also provided. Per Roxann Holloway, a qualified voter can request an absentee ballot from the Madison Township Clerk by mail until 2:00 PM on Saturday, April 30th. As long as the clerk receives the absentee ballot back by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, the ballot will be counted.

Absentee Ballot Applications are available at www.michigan.gov/sos. Another option if the voter is in the area, they can go directly to the township hall and request an absentee ballot anytime up to 4:00 p.m. the day before the election. The voter will need valid picture I.D., if they choose to go in person. Individuals may view the Strategic Five-Year Facility Maintenance "2020 Vision" Plan via the Website. Strategic action steps to provide the following are included in this document.

- ▶ provide a progressive, innovative, and safe learning environment to enhance student instruction and performance.
- ▶ allow the District to function in the most efficient and cost-effective manner possible.
- ▶ utilize technology to manage aspects of the facility to lower unnecessary expenses.
- ▶ improve branding and marketability of the District through progressive, innovative, yet cost-effective enhancements.

IV. LISD Budget Review (Information Item)

Board member representatives Mark and Nancy are scheduled to join me for the LISD Budget Review Meeting Thursday, April 21, 2016 to be held at the LISD TECH Center starting at 6:00 p.m. Other Madison board members are welcome to join us, if you choose. Please let me know if you wish to attend and I will RSVP those interested. Dinner will be served.

V. Spring Athletics – Potential Overnight Trips (Action Item)

At this point each year Kris and I, per Board Policy, present potential overnight trips to you for consideration and preliminary approval. The track team and the golf team if/when they qualify for regional and state meets would travel out of town and have overnight accommodations – depending on location - as they attend their respective competitions. I recommend the Board approve each of the potential overnight trips pertaining to regional and state competitions to allow for preparation of accommodations for these teams if/when the track team and golf team qualify for regional and state competition. Detailed information regarding travel accommodations will be provided at the board meeting in May.

- ▶ utilize technology to manage aspects of the facility to lower unnecessary expenses.
- ▶ improve branding and marketability of the District through progressive, innovative, yet cost-effective, enhancements.

Building & Site Sinking Fund

Historically, additions and improvements to our school facility were funded primarily through the Building & Site Sinking Fund and the General Fund. Whenever feasible, Madison has used the Building & Site Sinking Fund, rather than a school bond, thus maximizing the return on each dollar provided by our taxpayers.

A school bond yields large sums of revenue, but the district must pay it back with interest, similar to a home mortgage. The Sinking Fund provides revenue that can be used annually as it is received. There is no borrowing and no interest. *Every tax dollar is utilized for the repair and maintenance of our facilities.*

The current 1.25 mill Building & Site Sinking Fund is set to expire in 2016.

Information for Homeowners

The 1.25 mills currently in place through 2016 produces approximately \$218,750 annually. This proposal will allow the school district to levy and increase its building and site sinking fund millage previously approved by voters. The Board is requesting an additional 0.25 mill to offset the decrease in taxable value and help address areas of facility maintenance and renovation. If approved, the district would receive \$1.50 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation for a period of five years (2016-2020) to continue to provide for a sinking fund for the purchase of real estate sites for, and the construction or repair of, school buildings and all other purposes authorized by law. The estimated revenue the District would collect is approximately \$262,477.

Operating Expense Millage Renewal

Property Value Decrease

Property values have decreased over the past several years. 1.0 mill of tax generated \$198,000 in 2009. That same mill only generates approximately \$175,000 today. Between the decreased value of homes and the phasing out of the industrial personal property tax, the District collects less tax revenue today than it did five years ago.

The current 18 mill Operating Millage, which is assessed on businesses and those with a second home (non-homestead), expires in 2017.

Information for Homeowners

To eliminate the cost of holding an election in 2017, the Board is requesting that the Operational millage be renewed at the May 3, 2016 election. This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the statutory rate of not to exceed 18 mills which is assessed on businesses and those with a second home (non-homestead). This is required for the school district to receive its per pupil foundation allowance and renews millage that will expire with the 2016 tax levy. If approved, the millage would be renewed for a period of five years (2017-2021).
