1. FMLA/Maternity/Disability Leave Request - Sara Jackler (Action Item)

Sara Jackler has submitted a request for an FMLA Maternity Leave. She has requested a 12-week maternity leave from Wednesday, November 29 through Friday, March 2nd. Sara plans to return Monday, March 5 (the first day of third trimester). Sara will use accumulated sick days for the time the physician determines she is disabled. I recommend the board approve this FMLA request.

2. Second Reading and Approval of Proposed NEOLA Board Policies (Action Item)

At your October meeting the board had a first reading on numerous new and updated NEOLA policies. The proposed policies are included in this packet for further consideration and adoption. I recommend the Board approve the policies as presented.

3. LCASB Legislative Breakfast (Information Item)

The Lenawee County Association of School Board (LCASB) Legislative Breakfast will occur Friday, December 8, 7:30-9:00 a.m. The breakfast will be held at Britton Deerfield Schools – Deerfield Building, 252 Deerfield Rd. Senator Zorn and Representative Kahle have both confirmed their attendance. Please let me know if you are able to attend.

4. Lease Agreement with Adrian Dirtbags Baseball Organization (Action Item)

The Adrian Dirtbags baseball organization is again interested in leasing the Madison Indoor Athletic Facility, January through March 2017. Kris and I spoke with Madison varsity coaches and MYAC officers regarding requested timeslots for weekends throughout the three month period. Eric Dopp will again be the point person for the Dirtbags organization this year. I recommend the District enter into a lease agreement with the Adrian Dirtbags baseball organization for the months of January through March 2018.

5. School Bus - Approval to Seek Bids (Action Item)

Madison School District last purchased a school bus June 2016. Although I budgeted for purchase of a school bus last year, it was determined to hold off considering the limited increase in funding and other expenditures throughout the District. With increased enrollment this fall and the addition of bus runs this school year I would like to explore the option to purchase a new or used low mileage 84 passenger bus. Upon your approval I will ask Jerry to acquire bids. Again, similar to the most recent purchase in 2016, the District will explore the option to purchase a low mileage used bus rather than a new bus, if a vehicle meets the District's specifications and one is available. I recommend the Board approve the District seek bids for an 84 passenger school bus.

6. Winter Athletic Season – Potential Overnight Trips (Action Item)

Kris has provided the following information regarding opportunities for three winter athletic teams, based on competition this season, to have student-athletes travel out of town with potential overnight trips. Kris and I recommend, per Board policy, that the Board approve the three potential overnight trips for these athletic teams. We will keep you updated throughout the season.

Wrestling- Individual Regional Meet at Williamston and the State Meet. Teams provide transportation.

Bowling- Jackson for Regional competition and the State meet, usually in Lansing. Participants provide their own transportation.

Competitive Cheer- Delta Complex in Grand Rapids and State meet. Team provides transportation.

7. Resolution - School Finance Research Collaborative (Action Item)

Chris Wigent, Executive Director - Michigan Association of School Administrators recently provided information pertaining to the School Finance Research Collaborative (SFRC). MASA and MASB fully support the important work that the SFRC is undertaking and recognize the important data to be collected and analyzed regarding the true cost of educating students who attend Michigan's public schools. He states that there is one very important question commonly asked among Michigan's public school district leaders: How much does it cost to educate a child? He states that never in the history of our state has a comprehensive school adequacy study been performed to get the answer to that critical question.

Now, education experts and business leaders from all over the state have formed the broad-based, bipartisan Michigan SFRC. This group believes that it's time to change the way Michigan's schools are funded to ensure that every student gets the education needed to reach his or her full potential. The Collaborative is working with two nationally renowned firms to commission Michigan's first-ever comprehensive school funding adequacy study. Their work will build on the Michigan Education Finance Study that was commissioned by the Legislature and released in 2016.

Included in your board packet is a draft resolution for you to consider for adoption. The resolution states support for the SFRC and the work its doing to determine the true cost of educating Michigan's public school students. Early next year, the SFRC will release its adequacy study, giving policymakers in our state a clear, comprehensive and accurate accounting of how much it truly costs to education all Michigan students. More information about the SFRC is available by viewing a video and visiting the group's website at www.fundMIschools.org. I recommend the board adopt the resolution as presented.

Board Report Kristin Thomas, Principal November 20, 2017

I. PT Conferences - Fall Parent-Teacher Conferences were held on October 19th. Overall, 50% of our parents were in attendance. This is down slightly from last year. Participation by grade level is below:

9th grade – 55% 10th grade – 50% 11th grade – 50% 12th grade – 42%

- II. Junior Seminar Many of you are aware that we have traditionally offered a course, College Readiness, for juniors 2nd trimester to help them prepare for the college entrance exam administered in April. While this has been a valuable course for our students, we have chosen to "reframe" this course for the coming year. Next trimester we will be teaching Junior Seminar. The purpose of Junior Seminar will be two-fold Post-Secondary Planning and preparing students for standardized assessments. As we continue to foster a college & career ready culture, we recognize the importance of exposing our students to the different career pathways and helping them identify potential careers they are interested in exploring. It is our desire that each of our students has taken ownership of their future plan prior to graduation day. Our second mission will be to provide students with test-taking strategies that will certainly benefit them on the SAT, but other employment/certification tests, as well.
- III. College Application Month October was College Application Month. Congratulations to our senior class on taking the next steps in establishing their future plans. We had 164 college applications completed! To conclude College Application Month, we held a *Be Gold* assembly and were fortunate to have two Madison Alumni share their *Be Gold* story with our students and encouraged them to take ownership of their choices and decisions. Zac Denig, class of 2012, is currently working at Madison as a parapro while he awaits admittance into the US Airforce Academy. Zac was diagnosed with testicular cancer just prior to starting his freshman year of college at Trine University. Allen Heldt, class of 1998, currently owns Morning Fresh Bakery and is on the Adrian City Commission. Allen shared his journey as a student living in 15 different homes and growing up in extreme poverty and making the decision to use his situation in life, not as an excuse, but as motivation to succeed.

I also would be remiss if I did not acknowledge the work that our Guidance Counselor, Jen Stelzer, does to assist our students in this process. During October our students accomplished:

- 164 applications submitted for 57 college-bound seniors during Michigan College Month (20 prior to MCM)
 - i. 3 have enlisted with the military
 - ii. 7 plan to enter the workforce
 - iii. 3 other (MCTI, Hope, etc.)
- Applications were submitted to 32 Michigan colleges and 16 out of state colleges
- 35% of seniors have filed the FAFSA (as of 11/15/17)

- IV. American Sign Language I wanted to make the board aware of some challenges we are encountering with our ASL program. Currently, Mrs. Shirk is on requested leave. Unfortunately, it does not appear that Susan will be able to return this year and finding a certified ASL teacher is nearly impossible. As a result, we are evaluating the sustainability of our ASL program. I will keep you informed as we move forward.
- V. Potential student trip to Nicaragua Our HS Spanish Teacher, Rachel Wallace, is seeking permission to explore the feasibility of taking a group of high school students to Nicaragua. Mrs. Wallace will be hosting an informational meeting with parents and students on November 29th at 7pm. If there is sufficient interest, Mrs. Wallace will be seeking board approval of a trip abroad for Spring Break 2019.
- VI. High School Musical I want to publicly acknowledge the Cast & Crew of this year's musical, *The Little Shop of Horrors*!. This production, under the direction of Erin Pifer, was fantastic! We are blessed with many, many talented students and I am extremely proud of their commitment to the Arts. ©

I. You would be very proud of our students and the way they carried themselves on the recent **Washington D.C. 8th Grade Class Trip**. There are always some students whose conduct goes above and beyond your expectations. This is an experience that will rank high on the list of lifetime highlights for many of our students. The exposure and experiences gained by this trip will broaden our students' worldly perspective. As you know, students with more worldly experiences make better readers because they have more familiarity from which to relate to the text they are reading. Exposure to humanities is something a lot of our students need desperately.

I am very thankful for everyone on our staff for making this opportunity possible. Some staff gave up time with their family to chaperone and endure the 12 hour bus ride (one way). Some staff organized mini excursions to the Henry Ford Museum and Adventures Park for the 64 students that did not attend the trip. The Adventure Park challenged our students physically and mentally with obstacle courses and zip-lining. It certainly takes a team effort to make these opportunities available to our students. A special thank you to Mrs. Danyelle Matthews for shouldering the leadership responsibilities for this trip and the stress that comes with the commitment. V. Mrs. Sylvia Sotelo orchestrated a field trip for 23 of our eighth grade students to the **Just Build It Career Expo** at Eastern Michigan University. This expo is sponsored by the Washtenaw Contractors Association. Students whose EDP career pathways are engineering, manufacturing, and industrial technology are invited to attend and gain hands on experience.

VI. This year marks our 12th year of providing Madison School District students a Merrier Christmas. A *Giving Tree*, filled with Christmas wishes from some of our students and their families, will be setup in the middle school office. This program will support 12-14 families representing our K-12 buildings. The delivery date for this year is Monday, 18 December. All stakeholders are encouraged to **support the** *Giving Tree Project*.

VII. Our sixth grade students participated in the **Reproductive Health Educational Program** the first week of November. Ms. Jill Hogle coordinates this program for the middle school. She is assisted by Mrs. Mindy Jordan and Mr. Josh Powers. Eighth grade students will receive the training following the break.

VIII. This past October 68% of our parents attended **Parent Teacher Conferences** (258 out of 379). Historically, the fall conference participation averages between 71 -73%.

Co-Laboratory/STREAM Instructional Model: The first round of our new instructional model has been
a good learning experience for everyone. Students have enjoyed their time in the Co-Laboratory,
focusing on science and engineering practices. The theme was ecosystems. Lots of studying about
plants, animals and their structure and function, as well as their dependency on one another, their
habitats, and the impact of different variables as they are introduced to their ecosystems. This was
connected to the topics being studied in the gen ed classrooms through literacy.

We have definitely seen a greater focus on science, and an overall better connection to literacy, as well as literacy interventions. Although our beginning is just a beginning, and we have seen some huge positives, we have also seen some challenges with the logistics. For instance, technology class typically focused on students' general computer skills, like typing for example. We have gotten away from that. In addition, we need to improve the schedule, and make the time in the lab as a collaborative time with teachers and lab facilitators.

We are currently discussing ways to improve the process. This was the main topic of our last school improvement meeting.

- 2. Recommendation to hire Parent Educator: Daphney Hubbard is a very genuine, hardworking, experienced professional. Her former employers describe Daphney as "reliable," "flexible," "caring," "compassionate," and "multi-tasker," which are skills needed for this position. She has experience working with young children and families with diverse cultural and economic backgrounds. Daphney is knowledgeable in child development, effective parenting techniques, and community resources. She exhibits strong organizational, communication, and interpersonal skills. I believe Daphney is going to hit the ground running and will be an asset to our Madison Family.
- 3. Canvas Professional Development: To advance the elementary Canvas initiative, additional professional development is offered to those teachers who are interested. Teachers who attend will earn a performance based stipend for this professional development/work. The sessions will be led by Greg Marten, our Instructional Technology Coach. During the sessions, Greg will teach teachers how to upload content to a course based on grade level science content. Each session will explore additional features and components of Canvas. In addition, teachers will use their learning to refine, revise, enhance, and add to content, as well as continue with other science UbD units.
- 4. Data Meetings/Individual Reading Improvement Plans (IRIPs) Progress: We recently held data meetings to discuss the progress on our IRIPs. Per the 3rd grade reading law, students are screened. Those not performing proficiently are given IRIPs. These plans are individualized based on both students' strengths and deficiencies. The bulk of our professional development this year has been to improve small group instruction in the classroom, mainly tying literacy to science. We have worked extremely hard to increase the amount of small group instruction in our classrooms. We have about

370 students who are being progress monitored in the elementary school. So far, the data has shown that about 80% of our students on plans are near or above their targets. Those who are not, we are finding are showing more significant interventions/needs. We are very pleased so far. Our faculty has put in a tremendous amount of work, and it shows.

<u>Madison School District</u> <u>Resolution of Support</u> School Finance Research Collaborative

WHEREAS, the Michigan Constitution states that The legislature shall maintain and support a system of free public elementary and secondary schools as defined by law, and

WHEREAS, Michigan ranks 32nd in student achievement nationwide, according to recent research; and

WHEREAS, the Governors 21st Century Education Commission states that the urgency could not be greater regarding the falling K-12 performance, further stating that Michiganders underperform their peers, ranking 41st on fourth-grade reading performance nationally; and

WHEREAS, the Commission further stated that Michigan needs to efficiently distribute resources, and efficient distribution requires a transparent calculation of what it costs to meet performance standards, that students with greater educational needs should be provided with additional resources where needed to have an equal chance of meeting the performance standards; and

WHEREAS, in 2016 the State of Michigan conducted a comprehensive statewide cost study (Adequacy Study) that produced and provided valuable information but used only one methodology and did not fully examine special education costs due to data availability issues, did not examine preschool, charter schools, career and technical education, the impact of high concentrations of special needs students and the cost challenges faced by geographically isolated schools and or very small school districts; and

WHEREAS, the way we fund Michigan's public schools is fundamentally broken; and that Michigan needs to develop funding formulas that efficiently and effectively distribute these resources to the proper entities to support student success; and

WHEREAS, we must reexamine our approach so ALL students, regardless of their circumstances, can achieve and succeed; and

WHEREAS, the School Finance Research Collaborative is a broad-based, diverse and bipartisan group of business leaders and education experts, from Metro Detroit to the U.P., who agree it's time to determine the cost of student achievement for all students Pk-12 and then change how our schools are funded; and

WHEREAS, the School Finance Research Collaborative is supporting Michigan's first comprehensive school adequacy study using multiple methodologies to determine the cost of educating a student; and

WHEREAS, the School Finance Research Collaborative has hired the nation's top two school finance research firms to examine cost issues associated with key factors, including preschool, poverty, special education, Career and Technical Education, English Language Learners, at-risk students, and schools that are geographically isolated; and

WHEREAS, adequacy studies have been performed in more than 30 other states over the past 15 years, with over 90% of these studies using multiple methodologies, as Step One in considering any comprehensive school reform; and

WHEREAS, the School Finance Research Collaborative adequacy study is expected to be completed in early 2018, and will provide lawmakers and the public with the best, most accurate and most reliable information on what it truly costs to educate ALL Michigan students.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Madison School District supports the School Finance Research Collaborative and its efforts to determine the true cost of educating ALL Michigan public school students (pk-12).
