#### From the Superintendent's Desk:

As we turn the page on a new year, I wanted to take a moment to look back and celebrate a few of the many successes from 2015:

A Strategic Five-Year Facility Maintenance Plan was created following a comprehensive assessment of our buildings this fall. Board members, faculty, administration, parents, students, alumni, and business leaders, as part of the District's Annual School Board & Stakeholder Workshop, developed this plan to maintain a progressive, yet cost-effective, teaching and learning environment now through the year 2020. This plan, and subsequent action steps, is referred to as Madison's "2020 Vision." We look forward to sharing the detailed plan with the Madison family in the upcoming months.

Over 300 elementary students enrolled for the second year of the Balanced School Year (BSY) program. Students, their families, and BSY staff continued to enjoy frequent and timely breaks throughout the school year allowing for rest, relaxation, and/or vacation during non-peak travel times. Students were also offered tuition-based academic enrichment opportunities, allowing for the opportunity to stay engaged during their time off.

Renovations of the Madison Indoor Athletic Facility were completed last January. The complex has been in near constant use as Madison student-athletes occupied this space for athletic training and conditioning.

Finally, the Madison Youth Athletic Council (MYAC) offered multiple athletic opportunities to Madison students. Last year, in MYAC's first full year, over 300 students in grades Young 5s through 6th grade participated in at least one sport. Volunteers offered youth football, cheerleading, basketball, wrestling, baseball, and softball.

As we reflect on 2015, Madison School District would like to thank the students, staff, parents, and community for these and many more successes. We are looking forward to working with each of you as we strive toward new goals in 2016.

#### **Celebrating Computer Science Education Week**

Did you know there are currently 15,000 computer science job openings in the state of Michigan, and 604,689 across the United States? Mrs. Brandeberry's middle school technology classes took the opportunity to explore different aspects of working in the computer industry during Computer Science Education Week.

Xavier Sanford and Vincent Williams (photo 1) write binary code. A computer science major can earn 40% more than the college average, but fewer than 40,000 computer science majors graduated into the workforce annually.

Did you know that 80% of computer software jobs are held by men? Alyssa Mendizabal and Jocelyn Morgan hope that more females consider the Computer Science industry as they plan for the future. Here they are pictured (photo 2) writing algorithms in class.

The Hour of Code is an international effort to encourage all students, worldwide, to try computer coding and learn more about Computer Science. It is the belief of the organizers that *every* student should have the opportunity to learn computer science. It helps nurture problem-solving skills, logic and creativity. By starting early, students will have a foundation for success in any 21st-century career path.

During the week of December 7, seventh grade students wrote hundreds of lines of computer code as a part of the Hour of Code. There is a misconception that computer jobs are lonely jobs. In reality, programmers usually work as a team. CJ Lewis and Abby Morris (photo 3) work together to debug their program. Also working together, Alexa Cabrera and Jesus Casarez-Ruiz (photo 4) use conditionals to code their project.





Public Act 198 of 1971, the Mandatory Special Education Act, establishes the right to handicapped person(s) from birth through the age of 25, to equal opportunity within the public schools. THIS MEANS THAT HANDICAPPED CHILDREN DO NOT NEED TO WAIT UNTIL THEY ARE SCHOOL AGE TO BENEFIT FROM SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES. It is important that help be obtained for the handicapped at the earliest possible age. In the State of Michigan, this help is free and is available through your public schools. A team of educational specialists evaluate the child to determine the type and degree of disability and the best kind of program placement. This evaluation often includes medical specialists. Pre-primary Special Education services are available for: Emotionally Impaired, Mentally Impaired, Physically & Otherwise Health Impaired (POHI), Hearing Impaired, Visually Impaired, Speech & Language Impaired, Specific Learning Disabled.
