From the Superintendent's Desk:

I am pleased to share a new partnership between Madison School District and the Family Medical Center (FMC) of Michigan. This opportunity is provided by a Michigan Health Endowment Fund Grant intended to provide School Based Telehealth in Rural Communities. As communicated by the FMC, the goal of this partnership is to offer students improved access to behavioral health services. Services may address ADHD, depression, anxiety, and substance abuse disorders. We are honored to have a Madison graduate, Joy Carpenter, serving as the Coordinator for this program. Please feel free to contact any building principal if you have questions regarding this opportunity for students enrolled at Madison.

Family Medical Center and Madison Schools are partnering, through a grant from the Michigan Health Endowment Fund, to bring behavior health services into the schools in rural communities. Through this program your child can receive assessments, testing, therapy and psychiatry services, with social workers, Psychologists and Psychiatrist, during school hours. The goal of this program is to improve access to behavior health services, specifically to address ADHD, depression, anxiety, and substance abuse disorder. The Madison School District based behavioral health tele-health clinic gives your child an opportunity to be seen by a licensed healthcare provider without having to leave school.

I, Joy Carpenter, will be the Coordinator of this program to ensure that services are provided to the students in a confidential and timely fashion. I will be in close contact with school staff to coordinate the clinic time and dates. I will also be available to families to coordinate with your health plan, if appropriate, and provide you with assistance getting behavior health services for your child.

I am very excited to be a part of a much needed program to Lenawee County. I began my schooling at Madison Elementary and proudly graduated from Madison in 2004. I moved forward with my schooling at Eastern Michigan University. I will be looking forward to be working closely with the parents and teachers at Madison to bring the best care to your children.



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A Message to Our Visitors:

If you are a visitor to Madison Schools please be sure to stop in to the office to sign in and obtain your visitor's pass. If you wish to meet with a member of our staff concerning your child's progress, please call to schedule an appointment at a mutually convenient time.

Winter Weather Reminders

The Transportation Director and Superintendent jointly make the decision to delay or close school after travelling district roadways to determine if it is safe for our buses to operate.

The decision to remain open, delay, or close is usually a difficult one, but it comes down to one overriding factor—the safety of operating our buses on the roads in our school district.



The decision to close or delay school will be announced on local radio stations WABJ, WLEN, and WQTE, and Toledo television stations 11, 13, and 24. We will also utilize our Blackboard Connect phone notification system and publish the information on the district website.

If you do not believe it is safe for your children to attend school, please exercise your parental authority and keep your children home. We will respect that decision.
