From the Superintendent's Desk:

In the January newsletter, I briefly touched on the District's Strategic Five-Year Facility Maintenance plan called the "2020 Vision." There are several components to the plan which will provide for a progressive and cost-effective approach to teaching and learning environment in our schools. This list of projects to consider was developed by Board members, faculty, administration, parents, students, alumni, and business leaders at the annual School Board & Stakeholder Workshop. Some of these include:

- Roof replacement
- Lighting upgrades
- Bricks & mortar repair
- Exterior wall repair & insulation
- Window & HVAC replacement
- Upgrades to some classrooms, restrooms & locker rooms
- Updates to the middle school gymnasium
- Installation of an integrated elementary science lab
- Sidewalk and parking lot improvements

And perhaps most timely,

• Enhanced security at building main entrances

At the December Board of Education Meeting, the 2020 Vision was discussed in detail, including the plans for enhanced security at each of our main entrances; such as constructing a vestibule area for guests, access cards for faculty, and a buzzer system in place for visitors during the school day.

Due to recent events, the timeline for this project has been moved ahead. In fact, some of these increased security measures have already been adopted. Guests have limited access to the building, and a new doorbell system is in place. A more permanent secure entry system will be installed soon.

These security measures also support earlier conversations at Board meetings regarding visitor policies as they relate to:

- the value of instructional time
- student independence
- school procedures

In limiting the number of visitors in the building, we have already found reduced foot traffic in our hallways, students displaying greater independence, and an easier transition into the start of the school day. We thank you for understanding these new policies and procedures and how they support the District's vision for an ever-improving learning environment for our students.

One unexpected outcome from these changes is the increase in the number of parents using the drop-off lane in front of the elementary entrance instead of parking in the lot. This has created heavier traffic before school; however, please know that students may enter the building as early as 8:05 a.m. and drop-off lane traffic is lightest between 8:05 and 8:15. In arriving a little earlier, most of the parking lot congestion can be avoided. As noted above, our parking lots and sidewalks are one of the suggested projects of the 2020 plan and we will continue to work toward traffic improvements on campus.

Thanks, as always, for supporting the students of Madison.





Please make sure your child is
getting enough rest every night so he

Newborns: 16-18 hours per day Preschoolers: 11-12 hours per day Young Children: at least 10 hours

per day

Teens: 9-10 hours per day **Adults:** 7-8 hours per day

A lack of sleep can lead to chronic diseases and conditions and affects our attention and mood.

The National Sleep Foundation recommends:

- Keep a regular bed time and waking time; even on weekends.
- Make sure bedrooms are quiet and dark, and at a comfortable temperature.
- Use your bed only for sleeping; not for watching tv, listening to music, or using electronics.
- Avoid large meals before bedtime.

Kids and the Internet Managing Online Usage 10 Tips for Parents

The tips below are paraphrased from the American Academy of Pediatrics guidelines for helping parents monitor their child's use of digital media. You can read more on their website at www.healthychildren.org/English/family-life/Media/Pages/Tips-for-Parents-Digital-Age.aspx

- 1. **Treat online usage the same as you would any other interaction your child has.** Know your child's friends, what television shows he watches, which books he reads, and what he is doing online.
- 2. Set limits and encourage play time. Make unplugged playtime a daily priority, and be sure to spend time in active play when you are able.
- **3. Families who play together, learn together.** Play your child's video games with her to demonstrate good sportsmanship and gaming etiquette.
- **4. Be a good role model.** Teach them how to interact kindly online. Limit your own screen time and be sure to spend time in face-to-face interactions with friends and family.
- 5. Know the value of two-way communication. Children learn best through two-way conversation. It is critical to language development that they spend time talking with others. Face to face is best, but video calls to far away family members are a good way to include two-way conversation into media use.
- **6. Create tech-free zones.** Keep family meal times and other social gatherings tech-free. Recharge devices outside the bedroom overnight to reduce the temptation to use them when children should be sleeping.
- 7. Don't use technology as an emotional pacifier or babysitter. It can be tempting to use tech as a distraction or a way to keep kids busy, but encourage your child to find other ways to beat boredom.
- **8. Apps for kids.** Do your homework to be sure that the apps your child is using are age appropriate.
- **9. It's okay for your teen to be online.** Just be sure to talk to your child about what is, and is not, appropriate to share online. Monitor their usage and encourage them to talk to you if they have questions or concerns.
- 10. **Kids will be kids.** They will make mistakes online, but sexting, bullying, and self harm are real problems that need to be addressed. Monitor your child's media use and seek professional advice if there is a problem larger than you can handle alone.




