From the Superintendent's Desk:

At this time last year I communicated aspects of the District's Strategic Five-Year Facility Maintenance plan, the District's "2020 Vision." Several initiatives were completed between the end of the 2015-16 school year and the recent holiday break. Each project was focused on providing a progressive and cost-effective approach improving the teaching and learning environment in our schools. This list of projects was developed by Board members, faculty, administration, parents, students, alumni, and business leaders at the annual School Board & Stakeholder Workshop.

We are pleased to share that over a six-month period between June and December the following projects were completed:

- A portion of the roof was replaced with a new rubber membrane. Portions of brick walls adjacent to the roof were also covered with a rubber membrane to protect it from inclement weather conditions
- Lighting fixtures in classrooms, hallways, the cafeteria, and portions of the parking lot were replaced with energy efficient LED lights
- Exterior wall repair & installation of insulation (Drive-It) occurred in both courtyards
- Numerous classrooms adjacent to the two courtyards and the playgroup classroom received energy-efficient windows
- Drop ceilings were installed in over 30 classrooms located in the elementary and middle schools
- A sidewalk was installed from the elementary school leading to the buses
- New carpet was installed in several classrooms

We are proud to communicate that several of these projects have contributed to increased energy efficiency throughout campus. In addition to the cost savings the District recently received a rebate check for one portion of the LED lighting project.

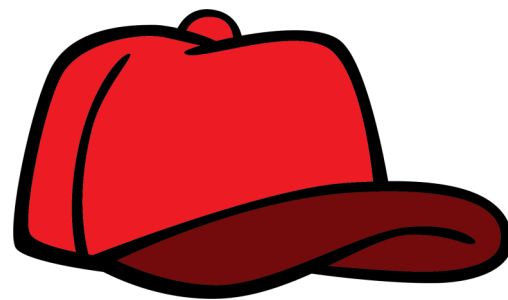

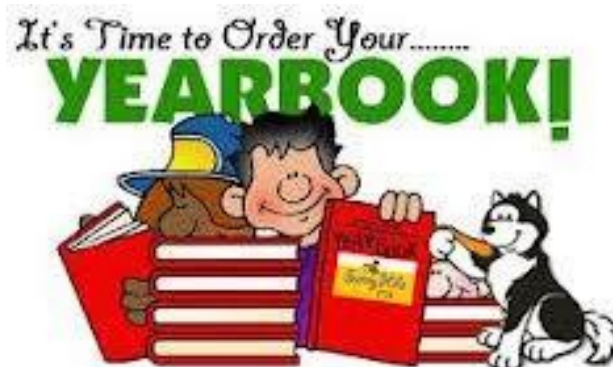

The five time defending TCC champs went undefeated in conference play and have games against Whiteford, Sand Creek, at Britton Deerfield, and Summerfield to finish off the TCC schedule. The team will then host Manchester and Onsted on Friday, February 24 for Senior Night.



The MHSAA Class C District Tournament will be at Manchester beginning on Monday, February 27. The girls will match up with Sand Creek in the opening round. Manchester, Grass Lake, Hudson, Addison and Clinton are the other teams participating in the district tournament.
