March is our Happy Camper Reading Month and we have lots of activities in the Elementary Library to encourage your student to read.



Second Grade Tiger drawings are in progress while making connections to animals. Third graders created Native American picture word drawings and medicine bags. Fourth grade made connections to math and patterns while drawing Tessellation patterns. Fifth grade Cityscape silhouettes were created while students considered country, city differences and comparisons. 
Open Mic Night

Varsity Girls Basketball Districts

In the first round of districts, the varsity girls defeated Sand Creek 49-32 to advance to the semifinals on Wednesday, March 1 against Addison at Manchester. With a win, the girls will go to the finals on Friday, March 3. Nicole Olden had 16 points and Laura Teunion-Smith finished with 14 points, seven rebounds and five assists. Rachel Isom and Megan Rosales each had seven points and Courtney Benschoter added five points and five assists.

The Trojans finished perfect in the Tri-County Conference once again, extending their conference win streak to 36 games dating back to 2015. The girls have won six straight TCC titles and have gone 82-2 in that span.
