

## From the Superintendent's Desk:

### Madison Students Recognized for Sustained Academic Achievement - Educators Provide Professional Development

Public schools throughout the state of Michigan, including Madison, recently received their respective 2017 score for the Michigan Context and Performance (CAP) Report Card. A CAP score is provided for elementary and middle schools. Often, scores or recognition, such as a district's CAP score, is based on multiple years of student achievement rather than just one year. Recognition of this kind indicates short-term proficiency and long-term sustained growth. Each school's CAP Score is based on three years of M-STEP data for third through eighth grade subject tests. Madison Middle School is proud to have sustained tremendous growth over a three-year period. Consequently, Madison Middle School received a CAP Score of 111.14, ranked at the 95th percentile, and received a CAP Grade of A. Madison Elementary School reached the 75th percentile and earned a CAP Grade of B.

In alignment with this achievement, last Friday over 100 Madison faculty joined school board members and stakeholders for a School Improvement Summit. The Summit included an opportunity for individuals to celebrate the recent award for becoming a 2018 State Academic Champion and to learn more about how tremendous academic achievement is sustained at Madison Schools. Individuals proceeded through three "breakout sessions" presented by teacher-leaders and administration focused on Individualized and Customized Learning at the elementary, Teaching in the Middle to the Whole Child at the middle school, and Creating a Career & College Ready Culture at the high school.

Participants who attended the Summit served as learners alongside faculty during each session. Madison School District will soon participate with an AdvancED accreditation process and external review April 29 - May 2. Professional development aligned with aspects of the accreditation process, specifically the AdvancED Performance Standards. Through this Summit process participants learned more about important topics at Madison Schools, became more familiar with the AdvancED accreditation process, and helped shape improvement efforts moving forward.

### High School – College & Career Readiness

The Madison High School portion of the afternoon was spent discussing how the high school staff are working to establish a college and career ready culture. While the state of Michigan has a widespread problem of getting its students to advance to post-secondary options, Madison is implementing courses and programs focused on college and career readiness.

Madison has expanded the existing “Seminar Series” empowering students through three seminar courses, Sophomore Seminar, Junior Seminar, and Senior Seminar. In a student’s sophomore year he/she participates in a job shadow experience, visits both a 2yr and 4yr college, takes the ASVAB, reviews PSAT scores and understands how test scores play a role in future planning, and begins to develop a familiarity with the 6 career pathways. Junior Seminar equips students with content-specific test-taking strategies in preparation for the SAT, provides individualized remediation via Khan Academy, and requires students to progress on their career planning continuum through an extensive study of the career pathways. Senior Seminar teaches personal finance and budgeting, communication and public speaking, and employability skills that ensure students can accurately complete an online job application, submit a high-quality resume, and present themselves professionally in a job interview.

Madison and the state of Michigan has set a goal of 60% of students obtaining a degree or certification after high school by 2025. Madison intends to achieve this through strategies aligned with Michigan College Month in October, FAFSA College Cash, and celebrating Decision Day. Additionally, a Post-Secondary Advisory Committee was formed to identify the strengths and weaknesses of current efforts and to create an action plan of how to improve. This plan includes utilizing technology, as well as, engaging and supporting students and families throughout the college and career planning process. The ultimate goal is for every single Madison High School Graduate to arrive at graduation with a future career plan that they are equipped to execute.

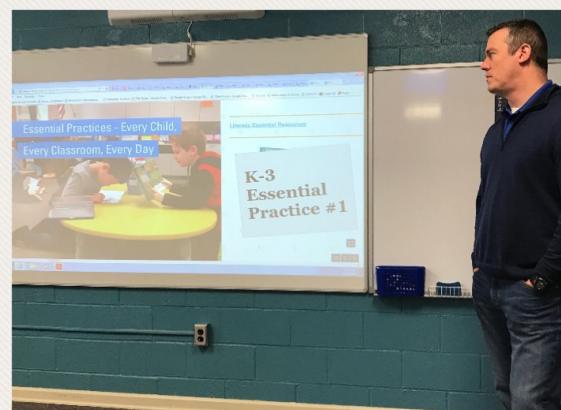
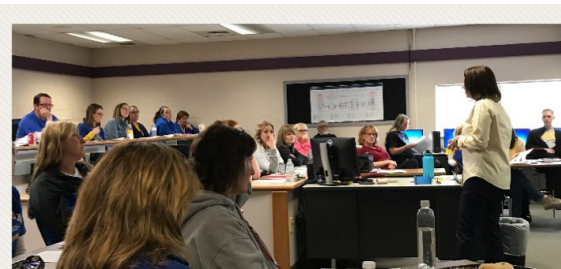
Madison High School has a unique academic programming that goes beyond what is required of the Michigan Merit Curriculum. Students at Madison take 5 to 6 credits of English, while the MMC requires only 4. Students can personalize their math experience by fulfilling their math requirements in as little as five courses or spreading their requirements out over 10 courses.

The LISD TECH Center offers specific career technical education (CTE) courses with aligned certification and training. Madison takes advantage of this excellent opportunity with over 74% of students attending the LISD TECH Center. Madison also has one CTE accredited program on campus in Biomedical Science. Students enrolled in a CTE course can participate in CollegeNow and TECH5. Additionally, Madison offers 6 Advanced Placement courses, dual-enrollment, and the opportunity to attend the JC/LISD Academy. A Middle College Branch Model will launch fall 2018 where students may earn a high school diploma and gain college credit, up to an associate’s degree, once committing to a 5-year plan.

It is recognized that every district faces challenges pertaining to student progress as they prepare for college and career. However, Madison has addressed many challenges by designing the Seminar Series, employing a Student Success Coach, implementing online learning for credit recovery, working to increase parent involvement, and offering various interventions and supports. In a recent survey administered to Madison High School students, 83% of students stated they planned to participate in some form of post-secondary training after graduation. 59% of those students go on to follow through with that promise. The goal is to increase that number by utilizing these strategies in addition to an intentional practice of ensuring students graduate with an individual plan that they are well-equipped to execute.

## Middle School – The Madison Way

Similar to the high school’s academic programming, Madison Middle School offers customized learning to make sure each student is challenged, yet assisted, through various interventions and supports. For example, if a student is thriving in all their classes except for math, the student may have the opportunity to move to the next grade while, at the same time, taking math again to master concepts and achieve proficiency. This allows the student to keep pace with their own development in other courses, while learning the skills they need in the



subjects they may not be proficient in.

Computer Science courses this year participated in the Hour of Code. Middle school and elementary school students gathered to learn more about programming, code, and computer science. Project Lead the Way (PLTW) and Science, Technology, Reading, Engineering, Arts & Mathematics (STREAM) programs at Madison have expanded throughout the middle school and high school. Students now have the opportunity to code, develop their own apps and programs. They are also able to use 3D printers to design and produce various items. The STREAM program also includes a PLTW Medical Detectives course where students solve a murder mystery. Other PLTW units include Design and Modeling, Energy and the Environment, and the Magic of Electrons.

Teachers and administration motivate students to maintain a quality work ethic and appropriate behavior with the implementation of Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports (PBIS). PBIS has helped to emphasize “The Madison Way”. Students are issued Mad Money for exhibiting positive behaviors. There are new PBIS lessons presented each week.

### ***The Madison Way - We are... Respectful. Responsible. Safe. Ready.***

Students are rewarded for their positive behavior and attitude with Mad Money which can be used for a chance to win special prizes during assemblies throughout the year. The effectiveness of these programs has been outstanding. Last year in the first trimester, there were 223 disciplinary referrals. Throughout the first trimester of this school year, there were only 62! Administration wanted to address the culture and climate of the middle school and early results are very positive. In addition to these new lessons, middle school teachers are more effectively utilizing new technologies and strategies including Canvas a Learning Management System (LMS). Canvas gives students web-based access to assignments, lesson, and resources anywhere and at any time without the need to carry books.

## **Elementary – Literacy and Learning**

The first goal of the District Improvement Plan and the Third-Grade Reading Law is to empower all students to be successful readers and writers. Accepting the fact that students develop at different rates, Individualized Reading Improvement Plans may be developed to help students progress. In the near future, the Third-Grade Reading Law will require all third-grade students not scoring proficient on the state summative assessment to be retained.

Madison teachers and administration are addressing this through balanced assessments, instructional strategies, and utilizing data points to track the progress of students. These practices are intended for specific grades under the new legislation. Madison will go one step further, requiring all students to participate with this process. The goal of these new initiatives is to enhance and individualize progress and to develop each student attending Madison at his or her pace. However, support at home is also necessary to further the education of each and every child. Teacher-leaders and administration developed home reading plans that encourages the family to be involved with literacy efforts and the learning process.

## **Madison School District – Academic State Champion**

Madison School District received notification that it is recognized as a 2018 Academic State Champion by Bridge Magazine. Based on a study conducted by Stanford University, Madison is named one of only 30 schools in the state of Michigan to receive Academic State Champion honors.



Each year Bridge recognizes high performing schools. This year’s report showcased the progress students made from third to eighth grade. In five years, between the end of third grade and the end of eighth grade, Madison students can expect to, on average, achieve growth of 6.1 grade levels. The 6.1 grade level rise in just five years is tied for the second-best growth in the state among all public schools. 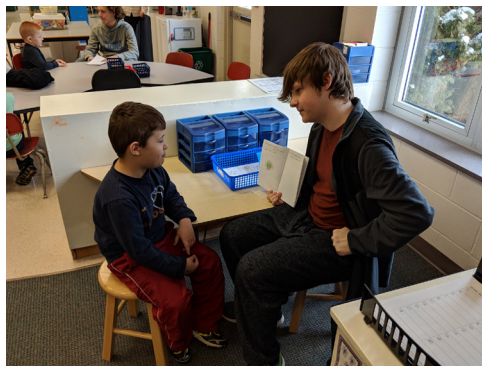


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## HS Spanish Visits Kindergarten Class

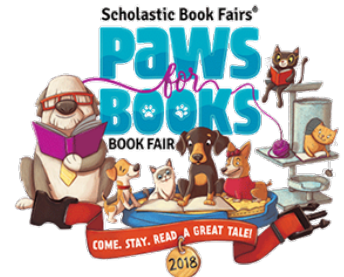

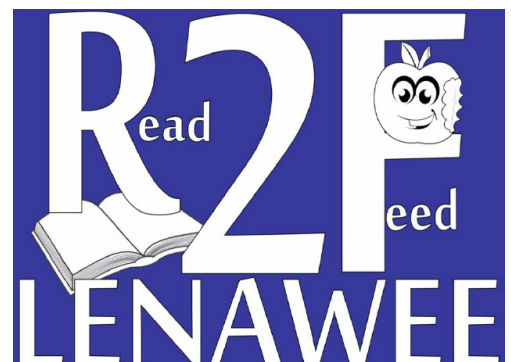
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## Read to Feed

## News From the Elementary Art Room

It's time to start returning the permission slips for this year's Earth Day Recycled Fashion show! This will also give us an idea of how many students will be in this year's show. We do have a lot returned already but more participants = more fun! There are permission slips available in the art room.



In the meantime, our budding artists have been working on a variety of different art projects that connect to what they are learning in the classroom and to the world around them.

Our lower grade levels learned about migration patterns and painted winter cardinals as their source of inspiration. Many of our students were surprised to learn that the cardinal doesn't migrate in the winter to warmer climates and can find food in cold winter weather while other birds migrate south.

Our upper grades practiced learning one-point linear perspective drawing. A formula and technique to draw images that appear dimensional. 4th grade learned how to create their names in 3D block lettering using this same technique. 5th grade also designed the interior of a room in 3D. This project required imagination, creativity and a logical mind set. Our 3rd graders learned about Native Americans and how they wrote stories by drawing pictures on to buffalo skins. At the end of this project volunteers proudly deciphered and interpreted their own stories as they shared their own stories and designs.

During Reading Month our students will focus on language arts. Using Art as a springboard, our students will design and write informational and fictional books. We will also be practicing the art of fine hand writing while learning how to do calligraphy. Be on the lookout for our posters!

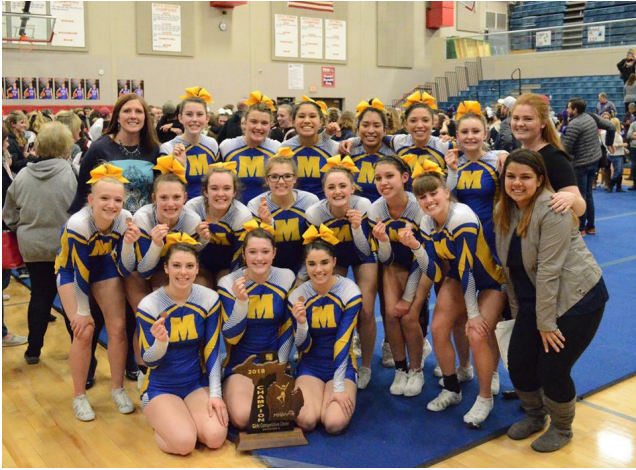
