#### From the Superintendent's Desk:

Madison Youth Athletic Council (MYAC)
Approaching Three Years of Offering Youth Athletics at Madison School District

When I arrived to the District five years ago, many people communicated to me that there was a significant void for students who attended Madison Schools. I listened as numerous faculty and parents stated how a youth athletic program at Madison Schools was desperately needed. At that time, students registered to participate in youth athletic programs through Sand Creek, Adrian, Lenawee Christian, Adrian Parks & Recreation, and the YMCA. A couple of these opportunities no longer exist. Parents, faculty, and staff communicated that youth would enjoy, and ultimately be empowered by, playing sports with their peers; the students who they interact with at school, and sit next to in class and in the cafeteria.

In order to successfully implement this program, by-laws were crafted determine how a Madison Youth Athletic Council (MYAC) organization would function and operate. Proposed by-laws were officially adopted at the regular meeting of MYAC membership **May 21, 2014**.

The purpose of this Council is to constitute an organization for the development and coordination of youth athletic opportunities at Madison School District.

The organization is an instrument of, and exclusively for, the benefit of the District and/or its students. A student must be actively enrolled at Madison and registered in eSchool as a Madison School District student to participate in any MYAC-sponsored activity.

#### **Mission Statement**

Madison Youth Athletic Council, in cooperation with our community, strives to develop and coordinate youth athletic opportunities intended for the youth attending Madison School District.

#### **Vision Statement**

Developing individual excellence through athletic activities so that each student can reach his or her full potential Madison Youth Athletic Council Board

I have tremendous appreciation for, and am grateful to the leadership of the officers who worked with the District – as volunteers – to make the Madison Youth Athletic Council a reality. At the time, that included:

Now, almost three years later thousands of Madison students have participated in football, cheer, wrestling, basketball, baseball, and softball through the school-sponsored MYAC organization. In addition, over \$20,000 has been raised by MYAC over the past three years, which has helped improve resources, assets, and facilities such as the score boards in the middle school gym, Madison Indoor Athletic Facility, and the youth baseball and softball fields, to name a few.

#### Madison receives incentive check from Consumers Energy

Madison School District has received its second of three rebate checks from Consumers Energy for participation in their Business Energy Efficiency Program.

Madison unveiled its Strategic Five-Year Facility Maintenance Plan - "2020 Vision", in 2015. The plan's Guiding Principles included the following:

- Provide a progressive, innovative, and safe learning environment to enhance student instruction and performance.
- Allow the District to function in the most efficient and cost-effective manner possible.
- Utilize technology to manage aspects of the facility to lower unnecessary expenses.
- Improve the branding and marketability of the District through progressive and innovative, yet cost-effective, enhancements.

Among the improvement projects for consideration was replacement of the outdated light fixtures throughout campus with energy-efficient LED fixtures. Superintendent Ryan Rowe stated, "Updating these fixtures has not only provided improved physical comfort, but has resulted in decreased energy expenses when compared to previous years. Further maximizing our savings was participation in the Consumers Energy Business Energy Efficiency Program. As a result, the District has received rebates totaling \$21,272.40."

#### **Elementary Library News**



#### **Collaborative Art Project**

From HS Art Teacher Linda Hooker:

After a lecture on creativity I had my high school students use the same 6 shapes to create a monster. Out of 70 drawings there was not one that even looked similar to any of the others. This is how I show creativity and how everyone has it.

Every HS student made a monster book mark that they would present to their buddy. So we went down to the 2nd grade class rooms with Mrs. Hall and Mrs. McNeil to share our creativity. #### How you can help prevent substance abuse

The Madison Administrative Team recently met with Kelly McNicol, Substance Abuse Prevention Specialist at Communities In Schools (CIS) of Lenawee. The intent of the meeting was to discuss and determine steps in which Madison School District and CIS may partner to educate students about various facets of substance abuse. The District appreciates Kelly's expertise, advice, and guidance as we -- parents, students, faculty and staff -- work together to talk about substance abuse. Kelly has provided the following, *Parents: You Are the Greatest Influence*.

#### Parents: You Are the Greatest Influence

"Research shows that the main reason that kids don't use alcohol, tobacco, or drugs is because of their parents -- because of their positive influence and because they know it would disappoint them. That's why it is so important that parents build a strong relationship with their kids and talk to them about substance abuse -- the earlier the better!" (National Crime Prevention Council, 2017).

#### 5 Key Things Parents Can Do

#### Build a warm and supportive relationship with your child.

This starts from the time your child is born but continues through adulthood. Things you can do to develop this relationship include:

- •Take time to learn about your child's hobbies.
- •Engage in activities with your child.
- •Work through challenges together.
- •Strive for honest and direct communication.
- •Allow him/her an appropriate degree of independence but make sure expectations have been discussed.
- •Offer encouragement examples of encouraging statements include (video examples can be found by visiting www.drugabuse.gov/family-checkup/question-2-encouragement):
  - o "Keep on trying."
- o "You are learning a lot."
- o "I like the way you did that."
- "I know that wasn't easy."

#### Communicate with your children about your stance on drugs and alcohol.

Good communication can be the backbone of your relationship. Youth are more willing to listen and bring personal issues to parents when they feel they will be listened to. Tips to encourage communication include:

- Be present and tuned in.
- Show understanding.
- · Listen with respect.
- Be interested.
- · Give encouragement
- · Avoid negative emotions.

#### Monitor, supervise, and set boundaries regarding your expectations.

Research shows that parents who do this consistently with their kids reduce the risk of their children using drugs. Setting clear and consistent boundaries with age appropriate consequences teaches self-control and responsibility. Tips to assist you:

- •State the boundary and consequence and be sure he/she understands.
- Catch the problem early.
- •Avoid arguments or threats.
- •Remember to use a firm and calm voice.
- •Follow through each time.
- •Offer encouragement each time a rule is followed.

#### Model appropriate behaviors.

A parent's attitude and behaviors towards drugs and alcohol have great influence over his or her children's attitude and behaviors towards drugs and alcohol and can have lasting effects into adulthood. Tips to assist you:

- Do not become intoxicated or brag about being intoxicated in front of your child.
- When it comes to prescription drugs, follow the doctor's instructions. Do not save, use or share (this is actually illegal) left over medications. Instead, dispose of them properly at a local drug take back event or by using Red Barrel drop box (located at most of Lenawee County's police stations).

#### Build resiliency in your child to reduce their chances of using drugs.

Researchers have studied the lives of children who have chosen to not use drugs. Through this research it has been revealed that there are certain elements and developmental assets that can build enough resiliencies in children to reduce their chances of using drugs. Their data lead to 40 developmental assets that promote prevention and resiliency. These 40 assets fall into 8 categories. 


