From the Superintendent's Desk:

Although the fall season, with crisp weather and distinct colors is my favorite time of the year, I very much enjoy the spring season as well. I began my career teaching high school science at Manchester. Each spring we used a small green house to raise plants and conduct experiments as a relevant way to illustrate the concept of life cycle. GSRP Preschool provides learning opportunities for youngest students

Madison's Great Start Readiness preschool program is now accepting new students. Children who are turning four years old, but who are less than five years old by September 1 are eligible. Children must reside in Lenawee County and meet state criteria for enrollment.

To apply: Please visit <u>lenaweefreepreschools.org</u> to submit the interest form. The GSRP office will then send you an application through the mail.

Complete and send the application to the GSRP at the Porter Center. (2946 Sutton Road, Adrian, MI 49221)

Someone from the GSRP office will contact you concerning your eligibility. Please note that children are not placed into the program on a "first come first serve basis,' but are prioritized by the family's income and number of other risk factors.

Latch-Key Changes for 2017-18

If you are interested in the 2017-2018 Latch-Key before and after school care program, an application can be completed on <u>MySchoolBucks.com</u>. An application fee will be added to your account.

Your child's application will only be approved after all outstanding obligations are cleared from your child's *MySchoolBucks* account.

If you receive child day care assistance from the state, please notify me before the beginning of the school year as there is a form that needs to be completed and submitted for payment.

Fees and payment:

There is a non-refundable \$10.00 application fee. An application must be completed for each child.

> Morning or Afternoon Session:

\$22.50 per week for the first child and \$18.50 per week for each additional child

Morning and Afternoon Session:

\$40.00 per week for the first child and \$33.00 for each additional child

> Late Fee Charges after 5:30pm

\$10.00 will be added to the account for every 15 minutes past close.

Flat rates will continue to be added to your account until you contact us to withdraw your child from Latch-Key. Your child may be removed from Latch-Key after two weeks of non-payment. Outstanding accounts will be turned in to the Central Office for further processing.

Payments will only be accepted on online through MySchoolBucks.com

The goal of our Latch-Key program is to provide your child with a safe and fun learning environment in which he/she will continue to grow cognitively, physically, socially, and emotionally.

Madison Instrumental Music 2017-18



Dear Parents of a child entering the 6th grade next fall,

Recently your child attended a concert showcasing all of the musical opportunities available to them in string orchestra and band.

The four string orchestra instruments are: Violin, Viola, Cello, Bass

The Band Instruments

- •Flute, Clarinet, Alto Saxophone, Trumpet, Trombone
- •Baritone and Tuba-- These are low brass instruments. Students will often start on Trumpet or Trombone and switch to these instruments.
- •Percussion Students must play one of the instruments above first in order to play percussion. They must audition to show competent rhythm and note reading skills. Percussion is very competitive. We can only have 2 to 3 percussionists per grade level.

Why Join the Band or Orchestra?

- •Improved concentration, coordination, self-discipline
- •Current research suggests a correlation between instrumental music studies and higher standardized test scores
- •Performing is a great learning experience and a way to share music with the community
- •It is a wonderful outlet for young students to express his or her artistic ability
- Make new friends
- •Helps build the appreciation of music
- •Raise self-confidence, no one sits on the bench

Who can join?

Students entering the 6th grade for the 2017-2018 school year who have the desire to learn how to make music. No advance musical training is required. The students will start from the very beginning learning how to hold the instrument and learning how to read music.

How do you rent or buy an instrument?

SHAR Music and Marshall Music offer programs where you can pay a small monthly fee to rent an instrument. Money that you put in rental fees will go toward the purchase of any instrument that they sell. These rental programs include maintenance and upkeep on the instrument being rented. If finances are an issue, we will work something out. We have several school instruments available for use.

Washington DC 2017

All current 7th grade students are invited to attend the trip as 8th graders next year. There are still available seats, but they are filling quick! Students must be in good standing in order to attend. Beginning the first day of the final trimester, March 13, 2017, students who earn 4 behavioral referrals, and/or have been suspended in or out of school are NOT considered to be in good standing. This also includes any infractions incurred during September and October of the new school year (2017-2018). If students fail 4 or more classes during the second and third trimesters of the current school year cumulatively, they will not be considered to be in good standing. There is the option of due process where the student may appeal their case to a committee panel for review. The total cost for the DC trip is \$699. Spring Athletics News

Varsity Track

Friday, May 19th - Regionals at Hillsdale College

The girls track team placed 1st at Regionals Friday, May 19 with 123 points. The Trojan girls qualified for the State Meet in 11 events. Sonni Rodriguez broke the school record in the 3200 meter run and the 800 meter relay team of Megan Rosales, Delaney Stersic, Sierra Hernandez, and Chelsea Short broke their own school record.



The boys track team placed 4th at Regionals Friday night with 62.5 points. The Trojan boys qualified for the State Meet in seven events.

Wednesday, May 24th - TCC League Meet

The girls track team placed 1st at the TCC league meet with 172 points earning their 11th consecutive league championship. Megan Rosales broke her own meet record and school record in the 200 dash with a time of 25.7 seconds. The 4 x 2 team of Rosales, Delaney Stersic, Sierra Hernandez and Chelsea Short broke the meet record with a time of 1:47.1 seconds.

The boys track team placed 1st at the TCC league meet yesterday with 146 points earning their 4th consecutive league championship.

Saturday, May 27th - MITCA Team State @ Clare

The girls track team placed 3rd at the Team State Championship on Saturday, May 27 with 899 points. It was the girls 7th consecutive top 4 finish. Kiarah Horn broke her own school record in the pole vault with a jump of 10' 7 1/2"

The boys track team placed 5th at the Team State Championship with 743 1/2 points. It was the boys 3rd consecutive top 5 finish.

Tuesday, May 30th - County Meet @ Onsted

For the third straight year, a member of the girls track team was awarded the Lyndi Bailey Outstanding Female Performer award. This year, Megan Rosales shared the honor with Tecumseh's Christina Sawyer. Rosales won the 400-meter dash with a time of 57.85 seconds, more than seven seconds faster than the second place finisher.

A 4x200 relay team consisting of Rosales, Delaney Stersic, Sierra Hernandez, and Chelsea Short set the meet record with a time of 1:44.77. Rosales also finished in second in the 200-meter behind teammate Chelsea Short.

Also announced at the county meet was head track coach Josh Powers earning Lenawee County Boys Coach of the Year. The boys won a fourth straight TCC title in 2017, and finished fourth and fifth at regionals and MITCA Team States.


Both the boys and girls track teams are hoping to take home more hardware on Saturday, June 3 at the MHSAA Division 3 Individual State meet at Comstock Park.

Laura Teunion-Smith hit a home run and drove in two. Kayla Wohlgamuth smacked a triple. In Game 2, Madison Weber threw a one-hit shutout, striking out five. Teunion-Smith finished 4-for-4 with another home run. Korie Fowler was 3-for-3 with a double, an RBI, and two runs. Weber helped her own cause with two hits and two driven in.



Wednesday, May 31 @ Hudson

The Trojans swept a doubleheader from non-league foe Hudson to wrap up its regular season schedule. Madison won Game 1 by a final of 8-1 as Ysabela Soto pitched all seven innings, allowing just one unearned run and struck out nine Tigers. Soto went 2-for-4 at the dish with a home run and Madison Weber had two hits and a pair of RBI.

In Game 2, Madison rolled to a 17-1 mercy rule victory. Weber pitched and earned the victory, allowing one earned run in three innings pitched. She struck out six Hudson batters. Weber helped her own cause at the plate with a 3-for-4 performance, including a home run and 5 RBI. Rachel Isom finished 3-for-4 with three driven in and Laura Teunion-Smith knocked in three runs. Kayla Wohlgamuth added two hits and two RBI, Soto scored three runs,

Madison finishes the resular season with a 23-14 record (10-4 in the TCC) and will now advance to the district tournament this weekend. On Saturday, June 3, the Trojans will face off against Monroe Saint Mary Catholic at 11:30 a.m. at the Madison Baseball & Softball Complex.

Tuesday, May 23 vs LCS @ Adrian College




Tuesday, May 30 @ Hudson




Trojans Student-Athletes to compete at the collegiate level


