From the Superintendent's Desk:

I have been told that hiring the very best faculty and staff is one of the most important tasks that we have as administrators. Since the end of last school year several individuals have been hired to join the faculty at Madison. Please join me to welcome these individuals to the Madison family!

MIDDLE SCHOOL TEACHER – TIFFANY BARBER (ELA)

Mrs. Tiffany Barber has been hired as a middle school English Language Arts teacher at Madison Schools. Mrs. Barber is a 2009 graduate of Onsted High School. Her undergraduate work was completed with honors from Eastern Michigan University in 2014 with a major in English and a minor in Psychology. Her student teaching experience was in seventh-grade English Language Arts at Tecumseh Middle School. For the past two years, Mrs. Barber was employed by the Killeen Independent School District in Texas as a middle level teacher. She taught grades sixth through eighth, which included working with gifted and talented students as well as special needs students included in the general education setting.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TEACHER – ASHLEY BEAGLE (Kindergarten)

Mrs. Ashley Beagle taught in Florida before moving back to Michigan last year. During the 2016-17 school year, Ashley served as a building substitute teacher. In the event a sub wasn't needed, Ashley would work as part of the elementary team time staff, and would also assist in the elementary office. As the building sub, Ashley demonstrated a positive, "can-do" attitude with a strong work ethic. She established caring relationships with the students she taught. DISTRICT HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONAL – BRIGETTE CAMERON

Ms. Brigitte Cameron holds a Master of Science degree in Athletic Training and a Bachelor of Science degree in Exercise Science/Pre-Athletic Training from Adrian College (AC). She is a Certified Athletic Trainer, a Nationally Registered Emergency Medical Technician (EMT), and is certified in First Aid & CPR. Ms. Cameron's thesis "Knowledge of Coaches and Parents Regarding Recognition and Pre-hospital Care of Potentially Catastrophic Injuries in Youth Sports" was completed as part of her studies at AC. Ms. Cameron has served young children at Camp Ak-O-Mak where she offered programs intended to enhance the ability and physical capabilities of children and young adults. Various clinical rotations provided the opportunity for Ms. Cameron to work with institutions and organizations including, the Madison Township Fire Department, Promedica Health Systems, Siena Heights University, Adrian College, Madison Youth Athletic Council, and Athletico Physical Therapy.



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MIDDLE SCHOOL TEACHER – KYLE CESSNA (Math)

Mr. Kyle Cessna is a 2003 graduate of Madison High School. He feels drawn to his alma mater and the Madison School District community. We are excited to have him back on our team. Mr. Cessna completed his Bachelor of Arts degree in 2009 from Central Michigan University with a minor in Mathematics and a major in Physical Education. Most recently, he completed his Masters of Arts degree in Educational Leadership at Concordia University. Mr. Cessna instructed students in the area of mathematics for one year at Gila Ridge High School in Arizona, for six years at the Adrian Public Schools 7/8 building, and one year at Onsted High School. He is well regarded for his professionalism and commitment to students at each of these educational institutions. He has engaged in several outstanding professional development series, including Kagan Cooperative Learning structures and the Direct Interactive Instruction initiative.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TEACHER – JILL HARDWAY (BSY – 4th)

She arrived to Madison from Waldron, where she has served as teacher, Title I coordinator, principal, athletic director, and more. INSTRUCTIONAL TECHNOLOGY COACH - GREG MARTEN

Beginning with the 2017-18 school year Mr. Greg Marten will, in collaboration with Mrs. Wonders and classroom faculty, serve as facilitator of elementary Science, Technology, Reading, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics (STREAM) curriculum. In addition, he will assist faculty as an Instructional Technology Coach. Greg is certified as an elementary teacher and also has a master's degree Instructional Technology. For the past 15 years Greg has served the Lenawee County community through an employee of the LISD. Greg has been influential in our county to advance the use of instructional technology. Our expectation is that Greg will have an immediate impact on our students and faculty. Greg has worked collaboratively with Jeanelle Wonders throughout the summer. She and Greg together will help facilitate the experiential component of STREAM instruction and learning and, in collaboration with faculty, focus on the literacy component of this learning process. In addition, the two will help launch the implementation of Canvas, our learning management system utilized throughout the District.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TEACHER – HOLLIE MILLER (3rd)

Hollie Miller applied to Madison and stated the following objective, "Seeking a teaching position that will allow for continued growth, awareness, understanding, and contributions as we teach the next generation of lifelong learners in our ever-changing society." Hollie arrives to Madison Schools with a well-rounded background. She earned a degree in elementary education, an early childhood education ZA endorsement, a certificate in child and parent advocacy, a certificate on emotional impairments, and a master's degree in autism spectrum disorders. We welcome Hollie as she arrives from Paddock Elementary in Milan, where she has served as a teacher since 2014.

MIDDLE SCHOOL TEACHER – JOSIAH OSBORNE (SPECIAL EDUCATION)

Josiah Osburn is a graduate of Hudson High School. In 2011, Mr. Osburn earned his Bachelors of Science in Special education from Eastern Michigan University, with an endorsement in Deaf and Hard of Hearing and a minor in History. His experience, both in Ohio and Michigan schools, includes working with students who are Otherwise Health Impaired, Deaf and Hard of Hearing, Intellectually Impaired, and Emotionally Impaired. In addition to serving as an intervention specialist, co-teacher, and self-contained resource room teacher, Mr. Osburn is an author, coach, and champion of causes in the community. This past year, Mr. Osburn was a behavior specialist for the Madison School District. He has demonstrated great capacity to build relationships with students, collaborate with all stakeholders, and effect positive change.

HIGH SCHOOL TEACHER – RACHEL WALLACE (Spanish)

Rachel is a graduate of Siena Heights University. Rachel has a Master's Degree in Spanish and has lived/studied abroad while a student. Rachel began her teaching career at Perrysburg Middle School where she taught middle school Spanish for two years before moving to Adrian and teaching at Adrian High School. Over the past 4 years, Rachel has taught a variety of Spanish courses at the high school and has served as an adjunct professor at Adrian College. Last Minute Back-To-School Shoppers?

Please do not bring pets on school district property.

Per Board Policy 8390, animals are not permitted on campus.

Animals permitted in schools and elsewhere on District property shall be limited to those necessary to support specific curriculum-related projects and activities, those that provide assistance to a student or staff member due to a disability (e.g., seizure disorder), those that provide a reasonable accommodation to a student in accordance with a Section 504 Plan, or those that serve as service animals as required by Federal and State law.

Taking into consideration that some animals can cause or exacerbate allergic reactions, spread bacterial infections, or cause damage and create a hazard if they escape from confinement, the Principal may permit non-service animals to be present in classrooms to support curriculum-related projects and activities only under the following conditions:

- A. the staff member seeking approval to have a non-service animal in his/her classroom shall:
 - 1. provide a current satisfactory health certificate or report of examination from a veterinarian for the animal;
 - 2. take precautions deemed necessary to protect the health and safety of students and other staff;
 - 3. ensure that the animal is treated humanely, keeping it in a healthy condition and in appropriate housing (e.g., a cage or tank) that is properly cleaned and maintained; and,
 - 4. keep the surrounding areas in a clean and sanitary condition at all times;
- B. other staff members and parents of students in areas potentially affected by animals have been notified in writing and adjustments have been made to accommodate verified health-related or other concerns.

Latch-Key News and Changes for 2017-18

If you are interested in the 2017-2018 Latch-Key before and after school care program, an application can be completed on ***My School Bucks***.

If you receive child day care assistance from the state, please notify the Director. A child day care form needs to be completed and submitted. Per the CDC State of Michigan policy, parent(s) are responsible for late fees.

Fees and payment:

There is a non-refundable \$10.00 application fee. An application must be completed for each child.

➤ Morning **or** Afternoon Session:

\$22.50 per week for the first child and \$18.50 per week for each additional child

➤ Morning **and** Afternoon Session:

\$40.00 per week for the first child and \$33.00 for each additional child

➤ Late Fee Charges after 5:30p: \$10.00 will be added to the account for every 15 minutes past close.

Flat rates will continue to be added to your account until you contact us to withdraw your child from Latch-Key. Two non-payments will be cause for your child to be removed from Latch-Key. Outstanding accounts will be turned in to the Central Office for further processing.

Payments will only be accepted on online on My School Bucks.

The goal of our Latch-Key program is to provide your child with a safe and fun learning environment in which s/he will continue to grow cognitively, physically, socially and emotionally.


7th & 8th Grade Volleyball Information

Calculator Buying Guide

Students entering sixth grade will use the TI-34 II Explorer Plus Calculators. Seventh grade students will use the TI-84 Silver Plus Graphing Calculators. Eighth grade students will use the TI-84 Silver Plus and the TI-Nspire. High School students will use the Inspire and Nspire CX. Buying a TI-84 graphing calculator or Nspire is a great investment. Calculators are provided for students to use in the classroom. However, students will benefit from having their own calculator to use at home. Please check with your child’s teacher for the specific calculator model.
