From the Superintendent's Desk:

In 2012 Madison School District adopted a Five-Year Strategic Plan (2012-2017) to guide the decision-making process regarding student achievement, facilities/maintenance, educational opportunities, fiscal responsibility, community and stakeholder engagement, student leadership and involvement, and enrollment management. The Madison Board of Education, faculty, and various stakeholders gather annually to review aspects of the District's Strategic Plan, including the District's Mission (Purpose), Vision (Direction), and Belief Statements.

The Workshop provides an opportunity for stakeholders to discuss various aspects of the school's mission, vision, and strategic plan. The Madison Board of Education and administration utilize this opportunity to collaborate with parents, students, district school improvement team members, faculty, staff, and alumni. The strategic plan, mission, and vision is reviewed and revised, as needed, to assure the purpose and direction of the district aligns with the strategic plan. Aspects of the strategic plan may be adopted following the Workshop and subsequent feedback. The final plan is the product of collaboration with stakeholders, meaningful dialogue, and research. The strategic plan represents the community's desire to provide a stable, yet progressive learning opportunity at Madison School District for all students.

Mission (Purpose) and Vision (Direction)

There was an intended outcome to have participants review and provide feedback regarding potential modifications to the District's Mission and Vision.

The following modifications were proposed by participants at the Workshop and the Board of Education approved the changes as presented at their meeting September 19th.

There was an intended outcome to have faculty illustrate how supports, interventions, and opportunities are provided when data indicates that a student, throughout their pre-K through 12th grade experience - is either deficient or excelling at their grade level. (Supports, interventions, and opportunities may relate to academic, athletic, social, emotional, and/or behavioral aptitude).

Christie Cadmus presented information regarding the Great Start Readiness Program (GSRP) and administration illustrated *supports, interventions, and opportunities* specific to their building.

Educational Opportunities and Fiscal Responsibility - Madison School District will evaluate and enhance opportunities for students while maintaining a responsible fund balance.

There was an intended outcome to have faculty present a comprehensive look at Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) curriculum and programming offered to students who attend Madison Schools. Dr. Kelly Cichy from Siena Heights University presented information regarding STEM-related challenges and opportunities for students who attend Madison Schools.

Facilities/Maintenance - Madison School District will create a five-year facility maintenance plan to address infrastructure/maintenance issues.


There was an intended outcome to have administration and supervisors provide an update on aspects of the District's Strategic Five-Year Facility Maintenance Plan. A walk through occurred to view aspects of additions and enhancements. For the past few years an increased emphasis has been placed on the Strategic Five-Year Facility Maintenance Plan to:

- Provide a progressive, innovative, and safe learning environment to enhance student instruction and performance.
- Allow the District to function in the most efficient and cost-effective manner possible.
- Utilize technology to manage aspects of the facility to lower unnecessary expenses.
- Improve branding and marketability of the District through progressive, innovative, yet cost-effective enhancements.

Those who participated with this year's School Board and Stakeholder Workshop recognize that efforts have, and will continue to, improve aspects of the current facility. Investments such as utilizing LED lights rather than inefficient bulbs, replacing single pane windows with energy efficient windows, placing Drive-It (an insulated material) on the exterior of the building), replacing outdated portions of roof membrane, and updating plumbing fixtures are just a few examples of investments made to accomplish the four outcomes listed above. We look forward to updating you on potential projects as the Board reviews and potentially approves aspects of the Plan.

Fog Delays

The humid days of early fall can sometimes cause fog to develop overnight. On foggy mornings the areas traveled by our busses are checked at approximately 5:45 a.m. If it is determined that our bus drivers do not have the necessary visibility to safely operate our busses the start of school will be delayed.

School delays will be announced through our BLACKBOARD CONNECT Notification Service, on the Adrian radio stations and on television stations 11, 13, & 24 in Toledo.

Fog is often rather tricky. It can be a problem in one part of the county, but not in others. It also can arrive and/or leave rather abruptly. While it is our preference to make decisions on fog delay by 6:00 a.m. those decisions sometimes have to be changed as the weather changes. Please continue to listen to the news media noted above on foggy mornings to obtain the most up to date information.

As always, we expect parents to make the final decision about the safety of their children attending school on inclement weather days. Children will not be penalized if their parent decides to delay their arrival to school on a foggy morning when school is not delayed.





A team of educational specialists evaluate the child to determine the type and degree of disability and the best kind of program placement. This evaluation often includes medical specialists. Pre-primary Special Education services are available for: Emotionally Impaired, Mentally Impaired, Physically & Otherwise Health Impaired (POHI), Hearing Impaired, Visually Impaired, Speech & Language Impaired, Specific Learning Disabled.
