Traffic Flow for Madison Elementary School and Safe Routes to School

In an effort to reduce traffic flow at Madison Elementary School before and after school, and as service to you the parents, the District is seeking interest in facilitating a commuter bus stop location. Parents who sign up would be able to meet a Madison bus at the corner of 223 and Treat (very north end of the Family Restaurant parking lot). The bus would depart the lot at 8:00 a.m. to bring students to school and meet parents/guardians at 3:45 after school.

At this time the District is seeking interest of those only interested in both the morning AND the afternoon elementary commuter bus run. Please e-mail Jerry Isom at jerry.isom@madisonk12.us with your name as well as your child(ren)'s name(s) with the subject line "Commuter Bus Run".

Benefit to the school is:

- Less congested traffic flow and parking lot with a more efficient drop off and pick up process

Benefits to parents/guardians are:

- Opportunity to meet the bus between 7:55 and 8:00 a.m. and depart to work or home with no delay
- Eliminate the need to rush to school between 3:00 3:30 to park and pick up your child. Simply meet the bus at 3:45 p.m. with plenty of room to park

The District would like to hear from parents/guardians interested in this opportunity. The first 60 parents/guardians to respond via e-mail will be able to take advantage of this opportunity. Please e-mail Jerry Isom between now and the end of the day Thursday, November 3rd. Based on the level of interest the commuter bus may begin Monday, November 7th. Those participating would be notified by the end of the day, Friday, November 4th.

On a separate but related note, Madison School District is working with MSU's Safe Routes to School (SRTS) team to conduct a study to determine what options may be feasible to provide safer routes for students to walk and bike to and from school. This process has the potential to lead to grant funds to support such an initiative. Concerned citizens have for some time advocated for a solution so that students can be safe as they walk or ride a bike to and from campus.

This prompted the District to submit a Request for Technical Assistance to Michigan State University. I recently received correspondence from Mr. Wayne Beyea, Senior Specialist and Instructor and Director, Sustainable Built Environment Initiative at Michigan State University. He informed me that the MSU Safe Routes to School (SRTS) team had selected Madison School District, one of a select group of schools, for full action plan assistance. Members of the administrative team, a parent, and Chief Shadbolt met at Madison Schools Monday, October 24th for an organizational meeting. Outcomes were established, including a schedule, expectations, and an executed scope of work for the study. I will communicate updates as progress continues.

A Message to Our Visitors:

If you are a visitor to Madison Schools please be sure to stop in to the office to sign in and obtain your visitor's pass. If you wish to meet with a member of our staff concerning your child's progress, please call to schedule an appointment at a mutually convenient time.

We ask that special deliveries to school such as birthday treats, forgotten items, etc. be left in the school office for pick-up by your

student when there is a break in instruction.

These policies help keep our school safe and minimize classroom disruptions. We thank you for understanding.



Winter Weather, School Delays, and Closings











We have had a beautiful fall this year, but as residents of Michigan, we know that winter weather is just around the corner. With snow and ice headed our way, it is a good time to review our school delay and closing procedures. The Transportation Director and Superintendent jointly make the decision to delay or close school after travelling district roadways to determine if it is safe for our buses to operate. We also watch local news channels to stay on top of the most up to date weather forecasts.


The decision to remain open, delay, or close is usually a difficult one, but it comes down to one overriding factor—the safety of operating our buses on the roads in our school district.

Regardless of what other area districts decide, when we think it is safe for our buses to operate, Madison schools will be open. The decision to close or delay school will be announced on local radio stations WABJ, WLEN, and WQTE, as well as Toledo television stations 11, 13, and 24. We will also utilize our Blackboard Connect phone notification system and publish the information on the district website.

We never expect a parent to substitute our judgment for theirs on inclement weather days. Ultimately, it is the parents that should decide if it is safe for a child to attend school on an inclement weather day. If we decide to keep school open, parents can choose to send their child to school or keep them home.

If you do not believe it is safe for your children to attend school, please exercise your parental authority and keep your children home. We will respect that decision.

We also ask that you respect our decisions on mornings affected by weather. Be assured that while you may not always agree with the decision that was made, these decisions always involve a tremendous amount of thought and concern for the welfare and education of our students. Please note that perfect attendance awards are not impacted by a parents' decision to keep a child home on an inclement weather day. If a child is not in school, they have to be marked absent, but the absence will not be counted against what is otherwise perfect attendance.



Class of 2021 Visits Chicago


