## MADISON ELEMENTARY RECEIVES STEM GRANT FROM TOSHIBA AMERICA FOUNDATION FOR \$1,000

Adrian, MI (11/28/2017) – Madison Elementary School is pleased to announce that third grade teacher, Ms. Sherri Gamble applied for and received a \$1,000 STEM grant from the Toshiba America Foundation (TAF). These funds will support the Engineering Design Process for 3rd grade students learning about Maglev Trains.

Third grade students at Madison Elementary School will explore different properties of magnets and in the end create their own Maglev Train that carries pennies across a track. Students must use their new knowledge of magnets to be able to be successful.

"Grants like this help provide teachers with the resources they need to be more effective teachers," said Madison Principal, Nate Pechaitis. "This year we have had an increased focus on the application of science and engineering practices. In addition, we have been intentional about teaching science through literacy. Students have found their learning to be more purposeful, and as a result, they have been more engaged. As we continue to center our efforts on initiatives like this, support from the Toshiba America Foundation is most helpful. We are grateful for their assistance to help us obtain resources to advance this type of learning. We are also proud of the efforts of our teachers like Ms. Gamble, who make this happen. She and the rest of our third grade team are changing our instructional model for the better."

Toshiba America Foundation's grants fund projects designed by individual classroom teachers. This "direct-to-teacher" approach brings immediate results. Teachers are able to change the way they teach Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) subjects because the grant supports equipment for hands-on experiments and inquiry-based approaches to the curriculum. At TAF, we believe that STEM is a lot more fun than just reading a textbook. TAF grants provide teachers with the tools they need to be more effective educators. The grants make the classroom a more exciting place for both teachers and students.

"With this 'hands-on' engineering project opportunity I am hoping to help third graders build a love for science," said Ms. Sherri Gamble. "I am so excited and incredibly thankful my students will get this opportunity! Thank you, Toshiba America Foundation!"

#### Scholastic Book Fair Coming in December


Don't forget to stop by the Scholastic Book Fair in the District Library. It's a great way to encourage reading and a great place to find teacher gifts!


#### 5th Grade Camp & Outdoor Education

Madison School District offers convenient and easy online payments for school-related activities and purchases by using MySchoolBucks.com.


Beginning this school year, you can add money to your child's lunch account. There are two sections of the site that you should be aware of:

#### 1. Meal Accounts

To add money to your child's lunch account, click on the "Meal Accounts" link at the top of the MySchool-Bucks site (circled in red). There you will be able to add a student to your account, check the account balance, and add funds. This is the only location you should visit to add money to your child's lunch account.

#### 2. School Store

The "School Store" link (circled in blue) is next to the Meal Accounts link at the top of the MySchoolBucks site. This link is used for specific school activities such as field trips, apparel orders, fundraisers, and more. You cannot add money to your child's lunch account from this section of the site. Please look for the specific item you wish you pay for. Examples of items in the school store can be seen in the second image.



To avoid paying for the incorrect activity, please follow these guidelines when using this online payment option.

#### **Guidelines for shoes:**

The shoes you collect are not just shoes, they give a chance at a livelihood that someone may not have had before. The gently worn, used and new shoes you collect should be in good condition meaning that the soles are intact, they have laces (if necessary), there are no holes, they are dry and clean, and that they still have life left in them. If you wouldn't give them to a friend, then they are not worthy to submit with your collection.



#### What is a micro-enterprise?

By definition, micro-enterprises are small businesses with minimal employees and capital. In developing countries due to economic necessity micro-entrepreneurs represent the vast majority of small businesses. Due to a lack of formal training and jobs available to the poor, micro-enterprises add value to the economy by creating work opportunities, enhancing income, and lowering the overall cost of business. Micro-enterprises in developing countries allow impoverished people to start and maintain their own businesses. These efforts might mean selling re-purposed shoes from a carpet on the sidewalk to a small retail shop.

The micro-enterprise industry represents one of the most effective ways to lift many families out of the extreme poverty in devastated economies. The shoes you donate help these micro-entrepreneurs live a better life, while helping charities, schools, churches, and civic groups in the US make a difference in their communities.

#### **LCEF Scholarship Applications Are Now Open**

Student scholarships represent the Lenawee County Education Foundation's single largest area of student support. In 2017, the LCEF awarded \$578,000 through 412 separate student scholarships. Student scholarships provide Lenawee County students and families with financial support that assists them in pursuing higher education. Scholarship eligibility varies and is generally established by the donor.

The outside hitter through three years in her career has compiled 210 blocks, 557 digs, and 1,379 kills. She led the county with 5.64 kills per set this season.


