Madison's Great Start Readiness preschool program is now accepting new students. Children who are turning four years old, but who are less than five years old by September 1, are eligible. Children must reside in Lenawee County and meet state criteria for enrollment.

The writing requirement, due the first day back to school in the fall, focuses on encouraging students to become stronger readers by reading all year long. Madison Middle School 2015-16 Handbook Highlights

Merit System

Students that meet the following criteria will be rewarded at the end of the first and second trimesters with the following incentives: sundae parties, bowling trip, field trip to the movies, ice-skating, possible sporting events, etc.

- (a) No more than one disciplinary referral for the trimester.
- (b) Earning no out of school suspensions or time in the Behavior Intervention Program.
- (c) Less than four countable absences for the trimester.
- (d) A grade of C- or better grade in all classes for the trimester.

The ultimate goal is to qualify for the end-of-year trip. To qualify, a student must meet requirements a-c above. In addition to those requirements, the following criteria must also be met:

- (e) A student must achieve a grade of a C- or higher in all classes for the first trimester, second trimester, and the third trimester progress report. (f) A student must have qualified for one out of the two trimester merit trips.
- *Students that have not qualified for the end-ofthe year trip, but choose to attend the event will be considered insubordinate and receive a 3-day suspension.

Cell Phone Policy

While Madison realizes that parents may want their children to have a cell phone for family contact before or after school there is no need for cell phones during the school day. They are a distraction and inappropriate in a classroom, the cafeteria, etc.

When students report to school their cell phones are to be immediately turned off, placed in their lockers,



and left in the locker throughout the day. If a cell phone is discovered in a student's pocket, purse, etc. it will be confiscated and will be returned only as outlined in the Student Handbook.

If an emergency develops during the school day, parents may contact the Middle School office at 517-263-0743 and a message will be delivered to their child.

Absence Policy in Brief

There have been some important changes to the Absence Policy for 2015-16. A *summary* is available here for reference. The entire policy is available online by visiting: http://www.madisonk12.us/handbooks/ Please review this information carefully to ensure that your child does not lose credit for excessive absences.

When students are absent from school a parent/guardian must do one of the following: Call the office at 263-0743 by 7:45 a.m. to notify us of the absence either on the day of the absence itself or the day that a student returns to school following an absence; or a parent may send a note with the student when the student returns to school. Absences not reported within these provisions will be unexcused and considered as truancy.

After an absence: When a student returns to school after an absence, he/she must report to the office to receive admittance "blue slip."

Accumulated absences: Upon reaching the 6th countable absence per class in a trimester and each subsequent absence up to eight, the student must make up the missed time by attending after school detention or completing assignments in the CAP program. Students that have 9 or more countable absences during a trimester will not earn credit for the trimester. A letter will notify a student of his/her 5th countable absence in a trimester class. The letter will remind parent(s)/guardian(s) and student of the required make-up time for reaching absences sixth through eight, and the failure to earn credit upon reaching the ninth countable absence. An absence report may be obtained from the office.

**A student who misses ten or more minutes at any time during a class period will incur an absence.

Attendance make up time remaining at the end of a trimester must be completed within one week after the last day

Madison Middle School 2015-16 Handbook Highlights

Positive Behavior Support System and Mad Money at Madison Middle

Madison Middle School is committed to creating a school environment that promotes and instills characteristics that will allow students to be successful. A Positive Behavior Support System is a means to create a proactive discipline structure. It allows for the modeling of desired behaviors and a balance in addressing both positive and negative behaviors. Research has shown that implementation of a Positive Behavior Support System will result in an improved school climate, reduced discipline referrals, increased attendance rates, and increased student achievement.

Madison Middle School has developed the motto, "We Are Respectful, We Are Responsible, We Are Safe, We Are Ready, We Are Madison." In order to recognize students exhibiting these behaviors, "Mad Money" is used. Any staff member that observes a student displaying these behaviors can award him/her with a "Mad Money" ticket. The tickets will be placed into a container in the office and used in drawings to award these students various types

Middle & High School Dress Code Reminders

Before you head to the stores to begin your back to school shopping, please take a moment to review the Dress Code policies in place in the Middle and High Schools. A short description of what is/is not acceptable is provided here. The full Dress Code policy may be viewed on the website at: www.madisonk12.us/handbooks/.

Students shall not wear distracting and/or inappropriate clothing such as shirts, with inappropriate wording, logos that are offensive and/or are in bad taste, clothing that represents gang affiliation, or clothing that is a threat to a student's health/safety, etc.

Students shall not wear shirts and blouses that expose the midriff, and/or have a low neckline that exposes cleavage. All garments must be long enough to clearly overlap the beltline or stay tucked.

Male students must wear shirts that have sleeves. Sleeveless shirts for females are permitted if the material covering the shoulder is at least three inches wide and all undergarments are covered. Shirts should be buttoned up in front in a normal manner and cover the back completely. No cut-off shirts are permitted.

Leggings, jeggings, tights, and spandex-type bottoms (yoga pants, compression leggings, etc.) are not permitted unless worn underneath: shorts (within six inches of the top of the kneecap), skirts, or tops (within four inches of the top of the kneecap) that comply with the dress code.



Shorts must be in good taste and not shorter than either the end of one's fingertips when the arms are placed in a relaxed manner at one's side or within six inches of the top of the kneecap. Compression shorts, stretch spandex shorts, or thermal underwear are not permitted on or under clothing.

Skirts must be in good taste and within four inches of the top of the kneecap.

Middle and High School Culture of Achievement Program (CAP)

Students who come to class consistently unprepared, or who are inconsistent with their homework preparation do not achieve their fullest potential. When students complete their homework assignments they are acquiring the practice they need to become independent thinkers and problem solvers. The Culture of Achievement Program is a program designed to hold students accountable and encourage homework completion.

Students who come to class without completed homework will be required to stay after school to complete their missing assignment(s) in the CAP room. The CAP room is supervised by classroom teachers who are available to help students with assignments if needed. CAP runs from 2:45 p.m. to 4:15 p.m., and students who live within the school district are provided with transportation home. However, if a student successfully completes their assignment(s) before 4:15 pm, they are permitted to leave with a parent/guardian.

Parents will be notified that their child has been assigned to CAP via the Blackboard Connect notification system. Students who have been assigned to the CAP Program and choose not to attend, will receive disciplinary consequences.

Due to scheduling changes in the Middle School, CAP will be held after school only in 2015-16.



Nurse's lit your child needs to take medication(s) at school a medication form signed by parent and doctor is required. This form must be turned into the office with the medication in the original container. Over the counter medications, such as Tylenol and Motrin will also need a signed form. The medication form can be found on the website at www.madisonk12.us/nurses-office/ or in the building offices.

If you have any health concerns about your child, including any allergies or medical conditions that the school nurse should be aware of, please contact us. Nurse Ellen will be at Madison from 10:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. every day. Please be sure to update your contact information and that of your emergency contacts. News from the Dining Room

School Lunch Price Change: Due to governmental guidelines, the cafeteria is required to raise school lunch prices to \$2.30 for Middle and High School students. Elementary students will still receive free breakfast and lunch under the CEO program. Reduced breakfast prices will remain at 30 cents and lunch will continue to be 40 cents.

> Middle/High School Breakfast: \$1.00 (\$.30 reduced) Middle/High School Lunch: \$2.30 (\$.40 reduced)

Elementary Breakfast/Lunch: Free through CEO program

Free and Reduced Price Meal Applications: Children need healthy meals to learn. Madison School District offers balanced breakfast and lunches every school day. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals. Free and Reduced Price Meal applications are available in each of the offices and on the district website.



Meal Substitutions: If a doctor has determined that your child has a disability, and the disability would prevent the child from eating the regular school meal, the school will make any substitution prescribed by a licensed physician at no extra charge. The physician's statement, including prescribed diet and/or substitution, must be submitted to the food service department.

Rosales Competes in Summer Track Events

With her eye on someday competing at the college level in track and cross country, Madison junior, Megan Rosales, is spending her summer training for and competing in some of the country's most elite running events. Competing as a part of the Stan Edwards' Maximum Output Track Club, she qualified for the USA Junior Olympic Championships in Jacksonville, Florida and AAU Junior Olympic Championships in Hampton Roads, Virginia.

She ran well at the USA Junior Olympic Championships, claiming first place in the 800-meter run with a time of 2:23.37 and finishing second in the 400-meter dash in 58.68. Megan is celebrating a string of recent successes includ-

ing winning the Division 3 state title in both the 400-meter dash (57.58) and 4x400 relay (4.04.24). She also placed second in the 300-meter hurdles, finishing just seven-hundredths of a second behind the first place runner with a time of 46.28.

She also holds the school record for the 400-meter dash and was named the Lyndi Bailey Outstanding Female Track Athlete in May of this year.

Megan will be competing in the 400-meter dash and 4x400 relay in the AAU Championships this week. We wish her the best of luck and can't wait to see what is next for this dedicated athlete!



A team of educational specialists evaluate the child to determine the type and degree of disability and the best kind of program placement. This evaluation often includes medical specialists. Pre-primary Special Education services are available for: Emotionally Impaired, Mentally Impaired, Physically & Otherwise Health Impaired (POHI), Hearing Impaired, Visually Impaired, Speech & Language Impaired, Specific Learning Disabled. In 2001, the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) became law and is our country's most important federal education document. NCLB was designed to make changes in teaching and learning that will help increase academic achievement in our schools.

The law requires that schools receiving Title I funds notify parents of their right to obtain information about the qualifications of their child's teachers. Our elementary and our middle schools receive Title I funding and we are happy to share this information with you at your request. The law requires that all teachers and paraprofessionals in core content areas be "highly qualified" to teach in a school that receives Title I funding.

- 3. Proof of his/her knowledge in the subject they teach

Michigan has some of the most qualified teachers in the country, and we are extremely proud of the quality of the teaching staff in the Madison School District. All of our teachers have at least a Bachelor's degree and many have advanced degrees. They all also have a State of Michigan required teaching certificate. In addition, each of our teachers is also involved in professional development activities throughout the year. All of our teachers are also evaluated annually and were determined to be effective or highly effective in their most recent evaluation.

A highly qualified teacher knows what to teach, how to teach, and has a full understanding of the subject matter being taught. We are confident that every teacher in our District is fully qualified and dedicated to teaching your child (ren).

I encourage you to support your child's education and communicate with your child's teacher(s) on a regular basis.
