GSRP Preschool Provides Learning Opportunities for Youngest Students

Madison's Great Start Readiness preschool program is now accepting new students. Children who are turning four years old, but who are less than five years old by September 1 are eligible. Children must reside in Lenawee County and meet state criteria for enrollment.

Madison School Board Policy 9150 and the Madison Elementary School Student Handbook outlines visitor policies, procedures, and guidelines. It is important to communicate expectations so that the goals of empowering student independence and maximizing instructional time can both be achieved.

8th Grade Chicago Trip Information

Attention 8th Grade Students and Parents:

Last year it was voted on, through the democratic process by 8th grade students and families, that this year's class trip will be to Chicago, IL, October 27-29, 2016. The total cost of the trip, \$670, is priced for 50 participants traveling on one bus. Currently there are 49 students who have been making payments to attend the trip, which leaves 1 open seat. If your student is interested in going, they will need to make payment of \$555 (the total due thus far), to www.MYSCHOOLBUCKS.com asap. This will be a first-come first-serve basis. Once the 50th student is registered, we will have a wait list to determine if a second bus will be needed. This is contingent on there being an additional 30-40 students interested in attending the trip. Adding a second bus drastically changes the cost of the trip and without more participants there may be a cut off.

The final payment for the trip, \$125, is due Friday, September 16, 2016. All accounts must be PAID IN FULL by this date in order for the student to attend the trip.

Middle & High School Dress Code Reminders

Before you head to the stores to begin your back to school shopping, please take a moment to review the Dress Code policies in place in the Middle and High Schools.

Dress Code

Students should dress for success. If students are to have an appropriate environment in which to learn and if parents and visitors are to have a favorable impression of our school, it is important that our students and staff dress in a manner that indicates their respect for one another and their appreciation that school is a place for work. The school Principal or Designee will be the final judge about whether a student's clothing is appropriate for school.

- Students shall not wear distracting and/or inappropriate clothing, such as shirts with inappropriate wording, logos in bad taste, clothing that represents gang affiliation, or clothing that is a threat to a student's health and safety, etc. Any items determined to be gang related will be confiscated and will not be returned.
- Students shall not wear slippers, hoods, bandannas, hats, gloves, and/or sunglasses at school. This is enforced both in class and in the hallways.
- Students shall not wear shirts and blouses that expose the midriff, and/or have a low neckline that exposes cleavage. All garments must be long enough to clearly overlap the beltline or stay tucked in.
- Male students must wear shirts that have sleeves. Sleeveless shirts for females are permitted, if the top of the shoulder and all undergarments are covered. Shirts should be buttoned up front in a normal manner.
- Shorts must be in good taste and not shorter than either the end of one's fingertips (fingertip length) when the arms are placed in a relaxed manner at one's side or within six inches of the top of the kneecap. Bike shorts, stretch spandex shorts, or thermal underwear are not permitted on or under clothing.
- Skirts must be in good taste and within three inches of the top of the kneecap.
- Leggings, jeggings, tights, and spandex-type bottoms (yoga pants, compression leggings, etc.) are not permitted unless worn underneath: shorts (within six inches of the top of the kneecap), skirts or tops (within four inches of the top of the kneecap) that comply with the dress code.
- Pants must be worn at the waist (*top of the hip bone*). Pants that do not stay at the waist are considered inappropriate attire. All undergarments must be covered.
- Jeans, pants, or shorts with frays, holes, cuts, or slits above the knee are not permitted.
- Undergarments /Sleepwear/Loungewear may not be visible and/or worn as outer garments.
- Students shall not wear jackets during the school day (dress up attire excluded). A jacket is defined as any loose-fitting top capable of concealing or obscuring objects. In addition, students shall not wear gloves during class. (The classroom teacher when environmental conditions are extreme will exercise professional discretion.)
- Students shall not wear chains of any sort, including but not limited to chains attached to wallets. Any chain brought to school will be considered a dangerous weapon as previously defined.
- Students shall not carry backpacks, purses, or gym bags to and from class except for physical education courses.
- Students shall wear items of clothing as they are intended to be worn.
- Students shall not write on their bodies. This creates a distraction to the learning environment and is not a healthy action.

Nurse's Notes:

If your child needs to take medication(s) at school a medication form signed by parent and doctor is required. This form must be turned into the office with the medication in the original container. Over the counter medications, such as Tylenol and Motrin will also need a signed form. The medication form can be found on the website at www.madisonk12.us/nurses-office/ or in the building offices.

If you have any health concerns about your child, including any allergies or medical conditions that the school nurse should be aware of, please contact us. Nurse Ellen will be at Madison from 10:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. every day (when school is in session). Please be sure to update your contact information and that of your emergency contacts. It is important that we have current information if there is a health issue with your child.

Middle School Sports Participation

A message from Athletic Director Kris Isom and Superintendent Ryan Rowe

Middle School athletics at Madison is designed to empower student-athletes to explore, experience, and enjoy MHSAA-sanctioned athletic competition. Students today, more than ever, participate with extra-curricular activities including but not limited to travel teams, dance teams/groups, scouts, etc. that has potential to coincide with Madison Middle School sports. If a middle school student at Madison does choose to participate with athletics the student-athlete is strongly encouraged to commit solely to the sport in which he/she is participating.

Rules and expectations regarding attendance at practice and competitions is communicated through handbooks as well as the parent meeting for each individual sport. Scheduling conflicts are often anticipated prior to the season depending on individual circumstances and, this warrants dialogue between the student, parent/guardian, and coach. When a scheduling conflict is anticipated based on the participation of a middle school sport and a non-school sponsored activity, a meeting must occur prior to the start of the season. A meeting requested by the parent and facilitated through the Athletic Director (AD) shall occur to determine if a participation with both the middle school sport and the extra-curricular activity is viable. The determination shall be made through input of the coach and ultimately decided by the AD so that the student and parent/guardian is fully aware if the student should indeed proceed with participation of the specific Madison Middle School sport.

It is noted that student-athletes are no longer considered “exploring” a sport once they enter high school. Rather, the student-athlete is making a significant commitment which requires 100% commitment to the team.

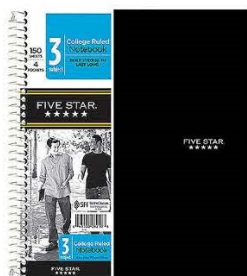


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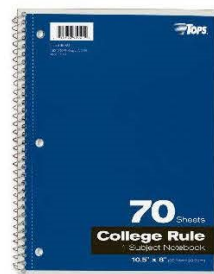

Title I Parent's Right to Know Letter

July 2016

Dear Parent/Guardian:

In 2001, the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) became law and is our country's most important federal education document. NCLB was designed to make changes in teaching and learning that will help increase academic achievement in our schools.

The law requires that schools receiving Title I funds notify parents of their right to obtain information about the qualifications of their child's teachers. Our elementary and our middle schools receive Title I funding and we are happy to share this information with you at your request. Nothing is more important to your child's education than having a well-prepared and highly qualified teacher. The law requires that all teachers and paraprofessionals in core content areas be "highly qualified" to teach in a school that receives Title I funding.

A "highly qualified teacher" must have:

1. A four-year college degree
2. A regular teaching certificate/license
3. Proof of his/her knowledge in the subject they teach

Michigan has some of the most qualified teachers in the country, and we are extremely proud of the quality of the teaching staff in the Madison School District. All of our teachers have at least a Bachelor's degree and many have advanced degrees. They all also have a State of Michigan required teaching certificate. In addition, each of our teachers is also involved in professional development activities throughout the year. All of our teachers are also evaluated annually and were determined to be effective or highly effective in their most recent evaluation.

A highly qualified teacher knows what to teach, how to teach, and has a full understanding of the subject matter being taught. We are confident that every teacher in our District is fully qualified and dedicated to teaching your child (ren).

I encourage you to support your child's education and communicate with your child's teacher(s) on a regular basis. By partnering, families and educators can provide your child with the best education possible.

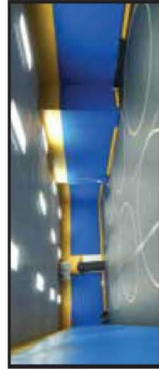

Proceeds Support the Madison Indoor Athletic Facility



The 11,000 square foot Indoor Athletic Facility features a multi-purpose area complete with artificial turf, batting cages, weight room, restrooms, and wrestling room.

It is estimated that over 1,200 students, from ages 8 -18, will benefit from having access to this space.
