From the Superintendent's Desk:

Planning for the Future of Madison School District

Each year the Madison School Board, faculty, and various Madison community members meet to review aspects of the District's Strategic Plan at the School Board and Stakeholder Workshop. From information gathered at the workshop, plans begin to emerge to improve *student* achievement, facilities/maintenance, educational opportunities and fiscal responsibility, community and stakeholder engagement, student leadership and involvement, and enrollment management.

For the past two years an increased emphasis has been placed on establishing a *Strategic Five-Year Facility Maintenance Plan*. Madison has experienced tremendous growth over the past 20 years. In fact, until last year, an addition or significant renovation has occurred each year to improve the educational environment for Madison students. It is estimated that the buildings now cover over seven acres!

Through discussions at the Workshop, it was determined that there is a greater need to focus on improving and maintaining aspects of the current facility, rather than expanding through additions like those that occurred from 1994 to 2014. The team committed to four outcomes as the District proceeds with the Facility Maintenance Plan.

Improvements and advancements that occur to the existing facility will:

- provide a progressive, innovative, and safe learning environment to enhance student instruction and performance.
- allow the District to function in the most efficient and costeffective manner possible.
- utilize technology to manage aspects of the facility to lower unnecessary expenses.
- improve branding and marketability of the District through progressive, innovative, yet cost-effective enhancements.

Examples of these improvements include:

The recent purchase of a computerized unit using technology to determines the outside air temperature to assist
in properly heating our buildings. Instead of heating the building based on the time of day, this new system will
adjust building temperatures based on the weather outside; providing an energy savings to the district and a
more comfortable learning environment.

Although a substantial investment was made to purchase this unit, a large portion of the cost was offset by a rebate through the utility company. The district expects this unit to assist in reducing heating costs.

A lighting assessment is currently underway to determine potential advantages through upgrading building lights
to LED fixtures. We already know that some areas of the facility are able to operate more efficiently using LED
Troffer Fixtures or Retrofit Kits. These simple upgrades will emit a better quality light, decrease electrical costs by
up to 80% and provide an updated, progressive appearance.

Funds saved on current electrical costs will be redirected to further improve other areas identified through the Strategic Five-Year Facility Maintenance Plan.

I look forward to updating you on the status of other projects as the Board continues to review, and potentially approve, aspects of the plan. Some of the projects will be more visible to our families and students than others. For example, restroom renovations would be more visible to visitors than replacing a portion of the rubber membrane covering the roof. However, each project will be reviewed individually to determine the best course of action in achieving the desired outcomes mentioned earlier and providing the best possible learning environment for our students.

Stay tuned as we work through these decisions together. Great things are happening at Madison!

Winter Weather, School Delays, and Closings











We have had a beautiful fall this year, but as residents of Michigan, we know that winter weather is just around the corner. With snow and ice headed our way, it is a good time to review our school delay and closing procedures. The Transportation Director and Superintendent jointly make the decision to delay or close school after travelling district roadways to determine if it is safe for our buses to operate. We also watch local news channels to stay on top of the most up to date weather forecasts.

The decision to remain open, delay, or close is usually a difficult one, but it comes down to one overriding factor—the safety of operating our buses on the roads in our school district.

Regardless of what other area districts decide, when we think it is safe for our buses to operate, Madison schools will be open. The decision to close or delay school will be announced on local radio stations WABJ, WLEN, and WQTE, as well as Toledo television stations 11, 13, and 24. We will also utilize our Blackboard Connect phone notification system and publish the information on the district website.

We never expect a parent to substitute our judgment for theirs on inclement weather days. Ultimately, it is the parents that should decide if it is safe for a child to attend school on an inclement weather day. If we decide to keep school open, parents can choose to send their child to school or keep them home.

If you do not believe it is safe for your children to attend school, please exercise your parental authority and keep your children home. We will respect that decision.

We also ask that you respect our decisions on mornings affected by weather. Be assured that while you may not always agree with the decision that was made, these decisions always involve a tremendous amount of thought and concern for the welfare and education of our students. Please note that perfect attendance awards are not impacted by a parents' decision to keep a child home on an inclement weather day. If a child is not in school, they have to be marked absent, but the absence will not be counted against what is otherwise perfect attendance.

Class of 2020 Visits Washington, D.C.

In a whirlwind trip to our nation's capital, forty nine eighth grade students spent three beautiful fall days exploring history concepts that they have been learning in the classroom.

During their time in Washington, D.C., students visited several memorials and monuments including the Vietnam Wall, Korean War, Lincoln Memorial, Iwo Jima, and the 9/11 Memorial at the Pentagon. While visiting the National Archives, students viewed historical documents such as the Declaration of Independence, and the Constitution of the United States.

Students also visited the Natural History Museum and the United States Holocaust Museum. Here, students were able to get a much more in-depth learning experience of the tragedy that befell the Jews and others during World War II.

The highlight of the trip was watching Keegan Newcomb, Allison Wilt, Abbey Dusseau-Garno, and Skyler Lamley represent Madison while participating in the wreath laying ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknowns in Arlington National Cemetery. Students also had the opportunity to watch the Changing of the Guards during this time.

This trip is special as it helps students make real-life connections to concepts that they study in the classroom. It also gives them the opportunity to practice many practical life skills and independence.

Our students were complimented several times on their behavior and made it a great trip. We hope that they made memories to last a lifetime and we very much appreciate the support of the parents who allowed their children to travel with their classmates and teachers.

Scholarship Opportunities

Think of scholarships as "free money" for use toward your college education. A little planning and work on your end could pay of big! Stop into the Counseling Office for details about these and other scholarship opportunities:

Write about an everyday hero and you could earn \$2500 for college expenses. No minimum GPA is required. Entries must be postmarked by December 1.

Applications for the Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award are due on December 4. Students must have at least a 3.5 GPA to be eligible to apply.

Students with a 3.0 GPA or higher are encouraged to apply for the William Coyne Memorial Scholarship. Applications are due April 1, 2016.






NHS Senior of the Month

Girls Golf Enjoys Successful Season

In only its third year, the Lady Trojan golf team turned heads with win after win this season. Their consistently strong play earned them a long list of accolades and saw the girls ranked as high as 2nd in the state.

The team accumulated seven tournament titles during the season including the Hillsdale Invitational, Onsted Invitational, Solheim Cup, Madison Pre-Regional, County Invite, IGL Championship, and the regional tournament. This is the district's first-ever regional trophy in golf.



Not only did the girls hold on to the top spot in the league

for two years running, they were undefeated for nine holes both years. They hold the 18 hole record, 9-hole record, and overall record. Five players earned all-league recognition: Nicole Olden, Kayla Bozyk, Kendall Hudson, Katelyn Payne (1st team), and Kali Harrington (2nd team). Nicole was the overall league medalist for the second year in a row.

The team improved 52 strokes in the State Finals and moved up three places from last year, finishing 10th overall.
