New Fundraiser & Student Activity Procedures


As you know, parents are often asked to pay for their child's various school-related activities, and there are also a number of fundraising opportunities that occur for District-sponsored athletic teams and organizations throughout the school year.

If you manage a student group or organization that is hosting a fundraiser, or plan a student activity which requires a fee, we are asking that you please complete a Fundraiser Request and Approval Form. This form is available on the district website at www.madisonk12.us. (Click on Resources, then Applications and Forms). A copy is also available later in this newsletter. Please submit this form to the building principal at least five days prior to the activity taking place. A second form is to be submitted once the activity is complete; reporting all funds collected.



Many families have asked me about a more efficient and effective way of the District accepting payment, such as through an e-checks, debit card, or credit card to pay for student activities. The District has implemented a new online student fee payment option for parents and students, called **My School Bucks**.

E-checks, debit cards, and credit cards will be accepted through a secure online portal. This will enable parents to pay for

Fog Delays

The humid days of early fall can sometimes cause fog to develop overnight. On foggy mornings the areas traveled by our busses are checked at approximately 5:45 a.m. If it is determined that our bus drivers do not have the necessary visibility to safely operate our busses the start of school will be delayed.

School delays will be announced through our BLACKBOARD CONNECT Notification Service, on the Adrian radio stations and on television stations 11, 13, & 24 in Toledo.

Fog is often rather tricky. It can be a problem in one part of the county, but not in others. It also can arrive and/or leave rather abruptly. While it is our preference to make decisions on fog delay by 6:00 a.m. those decisions sometimes have to be changed as the weather changes. Please continue to listen to the news media noted above on foggy mornings to obtain the most up to date information.

As always, we expect parents to make the final decision about the safety of their children attending school on inclement weather days. Children will not be penalized if their parent decides to delay their arrival to school on a foggy morning when school is not delayed.

New Elementary Arrival and Dismissal Procedures and the Importance of Developing Student Independence and Teaching Bell to Bell

At the start of the 2015-16 school year, the state of Michigan required a change in the amount of instructional time our students receive. In order to comply, we added 10 minutes to our school day by changing our starting time from 8:40 to 8:30 this year. With change comes challenges. The hallways have been very congested, making hallway travel difficult, especially for our youngest students. In effort to ease this issue, we are added the following procedures to our daily routine:

- 8:05 a.m. Main entrance doors will open. Students may enter the building where they may either go to breakfast or sit in front of their locker until classrooms open for the day.
- 8:20–8:21 a.m. Music will play for one minute over the PA to alert students, parents, and faculty that classroom doors will open in five minutes, and students should be ready to enter the classrooms at 8:25.
- 8:24–8:25 a.m. Music will play for one minute over the PA to alert students and faculty that in one minute, students may enter the classroom, and teachers will be in the hallway to welcome and monitor students.

At this time, parents should exit the building unless they have signed in to volunteer, or have a scheduled meeting with school personnel. After 8:24 parents will no longer be able to walk their students to class. If a student needs assistance getting to class, school personnel will be happy to help them.

- 8:29 8:30 a.m. Music will play for one minute, alerting students that they need to report to class. Students arriving to class after the music stops at 8:30 will be marked tardy. Students arriving to class after 8:40 will be marked absent for ½ day.
- 3:30 3:31 p.m. Music will play to signal dismissal. At this time, students will leave class with their teachers and exit the building. Students leaving before 3:30 will be marked tardy for the afternoon. Students leaving before 3:20 will be marked absent for ½ day.
- 3:39 3:41 p.m. Music will play for two minutes, alerting students that they have two minutes to get to the bus, as busses leave at approximately 3:41.

Madison Elementary School, with your cooperation, will enable your children to develop his or her full potential to be successful in an ever-changing world. You, as parents, can help reduce congestion in the hallways by exiting the building by 8:25. In addition, we strive to teach our students to be independent and to gain more independence with each passing year. Parents can help with this, too. After 8:25, please exit the building unless you need assistance in the office. Reasons would include scheduling meetings with school personnel, attending a scheduled event or meeting, signing in or out your child, or dropping off something in the office.

Dismissal is also a very busy time of the day at Madison Elementary. We have over 800 students exiting the building in a short period of time. It is our wish that the dismissal process goes as smoothly and safely as possible. We ask for your cooperation in the following areas:

- Submit any transportation changes to the office by no later than 2:00 p.m. This allows us time to get a message
 to your child and his/her teacher before dismissal time. Transportation changes will not be accepted after 2:00
 p.m.
- We also ask that you wait for your child in the grass area by the parking lot. Please do not wait by the bus exit doors or by the east side of the building.
- When your child leaves the class line, teachers ask them to wave or give them a "high five" so that they are aware that the child's parent has arrived.

Thank you for your assistance with this. We certainly appreciate working together with you to provide the safest and highest quality education with the fewest possible disruptions.


8th Grade Washington, D.C. Informational Meeting Planned



Silent Dinner a Success



PTLW Biomedical Sciences Pathway Expands to Third Course

Madison High School has implemented the third course in the PLTW (Project Lead the Way) Biomedical Sciences pathway for the 2015-2016 academic school year. The Medical Interventions (MI) course, taught by Mrs. Katie McGormley, involves advanced study of human medicine, research processes and an introduction to bio-informatics, Immunology, Surgery, Genetics, Pharmacology, Medical Devices, and Diagnostics.

The course emphasizes preventative interventions as well as the important role of scientific thinking

and engineering design in the development of interventions of the future. Recently, students conducted an **ELISA** (enzyme-linked immunosorbant assay) lab to investigate an outbreak on a college campus. Students analyzed 9 patient cerebrospinal fluid samples to test for the presence of bacterial meningitis.







It is important that help be obtained for the handicapped at the earliest possible age. In the State of Michigan, this help is free and is available through your public schools. A team of educational specialists evaluate the child to determine the type and degree of disability and the best kind of program placement. This evaluation often includes medical specialists. Pre-primary Special Education services are available for: Emotionally Impaired, Mentally Impaired, Physically & Otherwise Health Impaired (POHI), Hearing Impaired, Visually Impaired, Speech & Language Impaired, Specific Learning Disabled.
