This summer Madison School District will join other school districts and educational organizations, throughout Lenawee County, to offer a Summer Literacy "Popup" Lab. The Cradle to Career (C2C) Reading by 3rd Grade Network has provided leadership and collaborated with Madison administration, faculty, and staff to plan for this exciting opportunity. Madison's "pop-up" literacy activities will be available at no cost. Students will engage in reading and writing activities throughout the summer, over an eight-week period. Students are invited to join us Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. in the Performing Arts Center (PAC) lobby beginning June 19th. A parent or guardian is required to be in attendance during the lab.

Mellissa Wilson, Lenawee Intermediate School District Director, Center for Educational Materials and Technology & Curriculum Consultant states, The Lit Labs offer opportunities for children to develop literacy outside of the school hours by engaging in free reading, writing, and science activities.

- 3. Empower families to share their voice (story) in order to strengthen the literacy environment in the home, regardless of education level, income, or native language of the primary caregivers
- 4. Continue to build organization-wide and classroom-level partnerships with local businesses and other organizations that facilitate opportunities for children read and write during the summer beyond school assignments

The Lenawee Summer Literacy Initiative was developed by the Lenawee ISD in collaboration with the Cradle to Career, Reading by 3rd Network. Working through the collective impact model, the strength of the summer learning initiative stems from strategic partners and district connectors working to align community, school, and families to a common goal. The MAISA GELN Early Literacy Taskforce Essential School-Wide and Center-Wide Practices in Literacy document identifies 10 research-based system-level practices that can be implemented at the organizational level in educational and care settings that serve young children. Each of the ten recommended school-level or center-level systems and practices should occur in all Michigan schools and early childhood care settings. Practice 9 specifically addresses summer learning as an important piece of the literacy puzzle: "An Ambitious Summer Reading Initiative Supports Reading growth."

The Cradle to Career Reading by 3rd Grade Network, working through the LISD, and with local school districts will provide 13 free, weekly "pop-up" activities to engage students reading, writing, and STEM activities throughout the summer. We will strive together to reduce the impact of summer learning loss by providing weekly Lit Lab Pop-Ups throughout the county. The Lit Lab Pop-Up program is literally a "county-wide" initiative, with each Lenawee county school district playing host to a Pop-Up, the Adrian BGC, and an additional evening Pop-Up hosted by the Lenawee Habitat for Humanity at Parish Park.

The Lit Lab Pop-Up offer opportunities for children to develop literacy outside of the school hours by engaging in free reading, writing, and science activities, including Makerspace challenges. The Lit Lab stations will be led by local district educators and assisted by volunteers from the Lenawee Foster Grandparent Program.

Every week, children and adults will select a book of their choice from the "little free little book fair," to build home libraries and increase read aloud opportunities. Goodwill Industries of Southeastern Michigan has donated over 7,000 lbs of gently used books for use in this project. Families will be given "Home Lit Kits" to encourage a child's literacy development at home.



GSRP Preschool provides learning opportunities for youngest students

Madison's Great Start Readiness preschool program is now accepting new students. Children who are turning four years old, but who are less than five years old by September 1 are eligible. Children must reside in Lenawee County and meet state criteria for enrollment.

Someone from the GSRP office will contact you concerning your eligibility.

Please note that children are not placed into the program on a "first come first serve basis," but are prioritized by the family's income and number of other risk factors.

Latch-Key Registrations for 2018-19 School Year

Open registration will begin on May 4, 2018. There are 96 online applications that will be available for the year.

If you are interested in the 2018-2019 Latch-Key before and after school care program, an application can be completed on My School Bucks. A non-refundable \$10.00 application fee will be added to your account. An application must be completed for each child.

Your child's application will only be approved after all outstanding obligations are cleared from your child's My School Bucks account.

If you receive child day care assistance from the state, please notify me before the beginning of the school year as there is a form that needs to be completed and submitted to the State.

Fees and payment:

Morning OR Afternoon Session:

- \$22.50 per week for the first child and \$18.50 per week for each additional child

Morning AND Afternoon Session:

- \$40.00 per week for the first child and \$33.00 for each additional child

Late Fee Charges after 5:30pm*

- \$10.00 will be added to the account for 1-15 minutes past the end of the program
- \$20.00 will be added to the account for 15-30 minutes past the end of the program
- *State paid childcare will not cover late fees.

Flat rates will continue to be added to your account until you contact us to withdraw your child from Latch-Key. Your child may be removed from Latch-Key after two weeks of non-payment. Outstanding accounts will be turned in to the Central Office for further processing.

Payments will only be accepted on online on My School Bucks.

The goal of our Latch-Key program is to provide your child with a safe and fun learning environment in which s/he will continue to grow cognitively, physically, socially and emotionally.



Boys and Girls Track Continue to Dominate TCC

At the April 24 TCC meet at Summerfield, the boys track team extended their win streak in the conference to 30, while the girls won their 82nd straight meet. The Trojan girls won 14 of the 17 events. Reese Dillard claimed a pair of wins in the 800 (2:46.84) and 1600 (11:43.99) races. The girls swept all of the relay events as well.

For the boys, Anthony Contreras won the 110 hurdles (17.32) and the pole vault (11-0 1/10). The boys also swept all four relay events.

At the April 21 invitational at Pittsford, the girl took home first place with a score of 122 1/2 over Pittsford, Hillsdale Academy, Sand Creek, Morenci, and Lenawee Christian, among local teams.

Chelsea Short won the 200 (27.2) while Rachel Isom, Becky McTaggart, Sierra Hernandez, and Chelsea Short won the 4x100 (52.60). Short, McTaggart, Hernandez and Kaiya Wall won the 4x200 in (1:50.66). Horn and Anne Wong each jumped 9'6" in the pole vault to take first and second spots.

Alex Kelly finished first in the 300 hurdles (43.41) for the boys. Hayden VanValkenburg took second in the shot put.



Morlock Wins Madison Ryder Cup for Boys Golf Team

A group of county schools competed at Hantz Golf Club in Tecumseh on April 27. Grady Morlock led the way for the Trojan golfers, finishing tied for eighth place with a team-best round of 82.

On April 25 at Clinton's TCC Jamboree, Greg Lamprecht-Carson finished with a score of 42, which was third best on the day. Morlock shot a 44, Gavin Blaker was at 50, while Justin Nowak and Brayden Hernandez both shot 65. The team finished in the third place with a score of 201 behind Clinton and Whitmore Lake.

Back on April 21, the golf team hosted its annual Ryder Cup at Wolf Creek Golf Club. Morlock finished with the best round of the day with an 84 to give him the win. Blaker and Morlock shot 107 and 126 re-

MEAL CHARGING

The purpose of having a meal charging policy is to establish consistent clear meal account procedures throughout the district. There is a fine line between considering the fiscal integrity of the district and the solvency of the food service program while also meeting the nutritional needs of students.

Goals:

- A. To ensure that students have a healthy meal and that no child goes hungry.
- B. To treat all students with dignity and confidentiality in the serving line.
- C. To foster clear positive communication among staff, administrators, teachers, students and parent/guardian.
- D. To establish fair practices that can be used consistently throughout the district regarding meal charges and the collection of charges.
- E. To encourage parent/guardian to assume the responsibility of meal payments and to promote self-responsibility of their child/student.

SCOPE OF RESPONSIBILITY:

The Nutrition Department:

- A. Responsible for maintaining meal account records.
- B. Responsible for notifying the student's parent/guardian with phone calls or written documentation after credit limit has been reached. Responsible for working with households toward a reasonable resolution.

The Parent/Guardian:

A. Responsible for immediate payment.

MEAL ACCOUNTS:

The District strongly discourages meal charges, but understand that it occasionally happens. Meal charges are a temporary solution and are not intended to address broader issues of a parent/guardian's inability to pay for a meal for his/her child. In those instances, an application for Free or Reduced Meal Benefits should be completed. Free and Reduced Meal Applications are available in the cafeteria, the school office, and on the district website.

Parents/guardians are encouraged to make meal payments in advance. Personal checks and cash deposits are accepted at the student's home school. For convenience, deposits may also be made by credit/debit card after setting up an account for the student on Mosaic (MySchoolBucks), the district's online payment system. All students may have a personal account regardless of paying status (free, reduced or full pay).

Similar to a bank account, each student has a school ID number which stays with them for their duration in the Madison School District. When using the Mosaic (MySchoolBucks) system, parents/guardians can access cafeteria purchases and account balances at any time. Lunchroom cashiers will verbally notify students at the register when their meal account balance is low, specifically when it reaches the value of two equivalent lunches or less.

MEAL CHARGING POLICY:

Although not required by law through the National School Lunch Act or the Healthy Hunger Free Kids Act, limited meal charging will be allowed, as a courtesy to families, under the following conditions:

- A. Students may charge any combination of meals (breakfast and lunch) up to a total of \$12.50.
- B. No charges may be made in the ala carte line.

Middle and High School

Only reimbursable meals may be charged.

- A. Students may charge any combination of meals (breakfast and lunch) up to \$12.50.
- B. Students will be notified verbally at the register when their balance is low, specifically the dollar value of two lunches or lower and/or when they are in arrears.
- C. When a student charges a meal, their meal balance becomes a negative balance.
- D. Repayment is expected for all charged meals and meal supplements.
- E. Once a student has reached the charge limit, students will be provided with a meal supplement (a protein, a fruit or vegetable and milk for lunch and graham cracker packet, a fruit or vegetable and milk for breakfast).
- F. All unpaid charges will be added to the list of any outstanding fees or unpaid fines at the end of the school year. Payment must be made in full to the Food Service Department.
- G. All unpaid charges will be added to the list of any outstanding fees or unpaid fines at the end of the school year. Payment must be made in full to the Nutrition Service Department or grades, report cards, diplomas and other privileges may be withheld.
