From the Superintendent's Desk:

Although the fall season, with crisp weather and distinct colors is my favorite time of the year, I very much enjoy the spring season as well. I began my career teaching high school science at Manchester. Each spring we used a small green house to raise plants and conduct experiments as a relevant way to illustrate the concept of life cycle. As you are well aware spring signifies an opportunity for growth, especially for those whose livelihood depends on the production of plants or crops.

This idea is somewhat contrary to what we envision with education. For many, spring signifies the conclusion of yet another school year, the final chapter for educators and students alike. Throughout my career whether I was at Manchester, Onsted, the LISD, or Madison, spring signified the end to yet another year, but also provided me an opportunity to grow, the chance to improve, to plan and prepare to make the next school year even better than the last. As a father I am well aware of the successes and challenges parents face as they do their best to support their children. I sincerely thank the parents, grandparents, and guardians who have contributed as a positive role model for children throughout this school year. I want you to know that your contribution is recognized and very much appreciated.

I would also like to extend condolences to the friends and family of former Lenawee County sheriff, Adrian police officer and Madison Township supervisor Larry Richardson. Larry passed away Wednesday, May 30th. He was 72 years old. Larry was an advocate for children, strong supporter of the Madison School District, a leader in our community, and a very nice man.


With only one class set of the books currently, Mrs. lott will be purchasing more sets of the "Paddle-to-the-Sea" books for all of the third grade classes to personally use.





MYAC Board Member Positions Available



GSRP Preschool provides learning opportunities for youngest students

Madison's Great Start Readiness preschool program is now accepting new students. Children who are turning four years old, but who are less than five years old by September 1 are eligible. Children must reside in Lenawee County and meet state criteria for enrollment.

The GSRP office will then send you an application through the mail.

Complete and send the application in the self-addressed envelope provided by GSRP, or deliver it to the GSRP at the Porter Center. (2946 Sutton Road, Adrian, MI 49221)

Someone from the GSRP office will contact you concerning your eligibility.

Please note that children are not placed into the program on a "first come first serve basis," but are prioritized by the family's income and number of other risk factors.

Latch-Key Registrations for 2018-19 School Year

Open registration will begin on May 4, 2018. There are 96 online applications that will be available for the year.

If you are interested in the 2018-2019 Latch-Key before and after school care program, an application can be completed on My School Bucks. A non-refundable \$10.00 application fee will be added to your account. An application must be completed for each child.

Your child's application will only be approved after all outstanding obligations are cleared from your child's My School Bucks account.

If you receive child day care assistance from the state, please notify me before the beginning of the school year as there is a form that needs to be completed and submitted to the State.

Fees and payment:

Morning OR Afternoon Session:

- \$22.50 per week for the first child and \$18.50 per week for each additional child

Morning AND Afternoon Session:

- \$40.00 per week for the first child and \$33.00 for each additional child

Late Fee Charges after 5:30pm*

- \$10.00 will be added to the account for 1-15 minutes past the end of the program
- \$20.00 will be added to the account for 15-30 minutes past the end of the program
- *State paid childcare will not cover late fees.

Flat rates will continue to be added to your account until you contact us to withdraw your child from Latch-Key. Your child may be removed from Latch-Key after two weeks of non-payment. Outstanding accounts will be turned in to the Central Office for further processing.

Payments will only be accepted on online on My School Bucks.

The goal of our Latch-Key program is to provide your child with a safe and fun learning environment in which s/he will continue to grow cognitively, physically, socially and emotionally.

If a middle school student did not earn credit in one or more required classes this school year, he/she needs to enroll in summer school to stay on track with their current graduation class.

Credit recovery courses will be completed on the computer utilizing a web-based program, Edgenuity (formally known as E2020). Classes will begin on Monday, July 9th and end on Friday, August 17th. Students may complete as many courses as they wish during this period for a one-time, flat fee of \$70.







The Varsity Girls Track Team placed Second at the May 26th MITCA State Track Meet. Congrats, ladies! The Trojans scored 1361.5 points. It is their 4th runner up trophy in the last 5 years.

The girls track team won their 3rd consecutive Regional title with 114 points. Advancing to the State meet were: Carly Anschuetz (High Jump and 300 Hurdles), Kaiya Wall (High Jump and 100 Hurdles), Anne Wong (Pole Vault), Kiarah Horn (Pole Vault), Chelsea Short (200 Dash) and the 400, 800, 1600, and 3200 Meter Relay teams.

At the County Meet on May 29, the Trojans 4x200 relay team of Becky McTaggart, Kaiya Wall, Sierra Hernandez and Chelsea Short got a win (1:46.61). Wall took the 100 hurdles (15.51) and the high jump (5'-4"), while Short had the best 200 time (26.19) and Kiarah Horn won the pole vault (10'-6").



Varsity Track Captures A Pair of TCC Crowns

The boys track team placed 1st at the Tri County Conference meet on May 23 with 125.83 points. The victory secured the boys 5th consecutive conference championship.

The girls track team also placed 1st at the Tri County Conference meet with 214 points. The victory secured the girls 12th consecutive conference championship. Anne Wong broke the meet record in the pole vault with a jump of 10' 4".


The Trojans finished the regular season with a 22-5 record, 11-3 in the Tri-County Conference.


