

From the Superintendent's Desk:

Career and Technical Education (CTE) and Social and Emotional Learning (SEL): A Powerful Combination

Frank Parsons is considered the pioneer of vocational guidance in the United States. Many in the early 20th century, including Parsons, were concerned about career and economic development and believed, similar to today, that children have the opportunity to succeed through a quality public education, especially when enhanced with a real-life, relevant experience related to life outside the classroom.

Many high school students interested in an occupation choose to engage in a Career and Technical Education (CTE) program at their resident school district or the LISD TECH Center. Students subsequently progress through career exploration opportunities in a succinct, deliberate, and intentional manner. CTE continues to serve as an educational option for many students interested in a variety of occupations. However, its value as a means for students to crystallize, specify, and implement the choice to pursue a high-wage, high-skill, and high-demand career is not understood to the extent possible. CTE is regularly overlooked as a viable educational option by students who are often unaware of the specific experiences that influence a decision to pursue a post-secondary certificate or degree. Today, CTE has made great strides to position itself as a viable college and career preparatory option for students.

Enrollment in a secondary CTE program occurs within a timeframe whereby students, through career-related exploration activities, have the opportunity to learn more about their abilities and skill sets, develop self-concepts, and engage in influential experiences. Each of these experiences and opportunities has the potential to impact the student's career decision-making process as he/she transitions from a secondary CTE program to college and career. Through CTE programming, not only are students influenced, but the career exploration experiences often confirm their decision and strengthen their resolve to pursue the career by the end of their senior year in high school.

Behaviors that students exhibit through academic and technical experiences throughout their CTE course begin to define their self-concept. Students have an opportunity to immerse themselves in the culture of the profession in numerous ways. They have the opportunity to observe roles of other students and their instructor and also engage in real-life situations through participation with the opportunities and challenges respective to a specific career. Exploration activities empower students to gather information about themselves and the environment specific to a chosen career.

There is, however, yet another benefit of CTE. CTE offers an excellent way for students to exercise aspects of their social and emotional learning (SEL). SEL is the process through which individuals acquire and effectively apply the knowledge, attitudes, and skills necessary to understand and manage emotions, set and achieve positive goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain positive relationships, and make responsible decisions. All Lenawee County public school districts have adopted the Collaboration of Academic and Social-Emotional Learning (CASEL) framework. The five competencies of CASEL include Self Awareness, Self-Management, Social Awareness, Relationship Skills, and Responsible Decision-Making. Experiences through a CTE program empower students to practice and master aligned skills and attributes aligned with these competencies such as self-confidence, goal setting, empathy, teamwork, analyzing situations, and ethical responsibility while, at the same time, engaging in academic and technical skills. These attributes are what employers expect from their employees and what we, as educators, practice with the students we serve. CTE programs provide a powerful way for students to exercise and master these important career and employability skills as they prepare for a post-secondary experience. Career and Technical Education: Critical for some, beneficial for all.

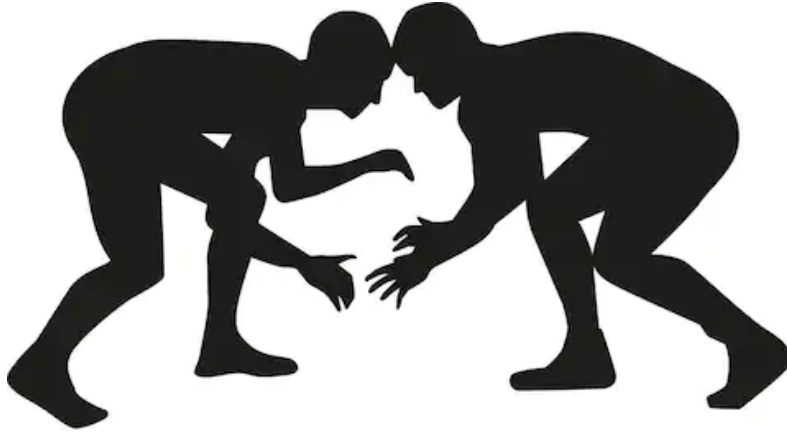


MYAC Wrestling Registrations Now Open

Svoboda averaged 1.82 kills on .180 hitting and 2.45 digs for Madison. She was named to the All-TCC first team.

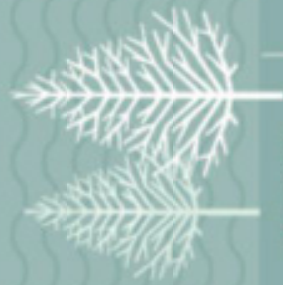
Laura Teunion-Smith, senior, Madison
