From the Superintendent's Desk:

Madison School District Modification to End of 2018-19 School Year

The Madison School District has endured a unique and challenging winter season, one that continues to deliver cold temperatures and additional precipitation. Throughout the past two months the district has prioritized the safety of students, faculty, and staff through 7 school day cancellations and 1 school delay.

The district has determined, considering the substantial loss of instructional time, that the 2018-19 school year will end Friday, June 14th rather than Wednesday, June 12th.

Madison Elementary School strives to create vibrant, excellent classrooms that serve the needs of all children.

Each year parents are invited to share valuable information about their children's learning styles, strengths, challenges, and needs. We consider all this information valuable. Teacher Input

All classroom teachers, specials teachers, and special education teachers provide input on all of their students' strengths, challenges, and unique learning characteristics. This includes academic ability and performance, behavior, social-emotional skills, likes/dislikes and interests, as well as relationships with other students. Teachers complete forms similar to you. Their form includes specific academic data, as well as things that seem to work for your child.

Teamwork Makes the Dream Work!

After parents and teachers have provided input, your child's current grade level team of teachers, special education teachers, specials teachers, literacy coach and counselor meet with the principals to draft the upcoming year's class lists. The objective is to match student learning styles to teacher strengths and areas of talent, while creating classrooms that have a balanced number of students who are strong, self-directed learners, with those who need some support. It is important that students learn to work and socialize in environments of diversity. This not only prepares them for "the real world" but also allows individual talents to shine. As staff works together in developing balanced classrooms, they factor in all student information gathered from the variety of sources.

Did you know?

Did you know that Family Medical Center of Michigan, Inc. (FMC), has a location in Madison Schools? FMC is a non-profit organization that has been providing medical, dental and behavioral health services to members of our community for over 35 years. FMC has partnered with schools in the area for over 2 years. Currently at Madison Schools, FMC sees students from the Elementary, Middle, and High School. Services that are offered through the school include counseling services for behavioral health as well as access to a psychiatrist if needed. These services allow children to remain in school for counseling services. Sometimes children struggle with issues such as focus, depression, anxiety, grief, trauma and stressors in the school environment. These can be addressed with counseling services for your children. Nakeyia Meyers, a Licensed Master Level Social Worker, is currently providing these services for FMC in select schools throughout Lenawee County.

It can be difficult at times to identify what is "normal" behavior for a child's age and what may be a more severe issue. Here are a few, not all, symptoms to consider:

- Decrease in enjoyment and time spent with friends and family (isolation)
- Significant decrease in school performance
- Loss of interest in sports or activities they used to enjoy
- A change in sleep habits/rituals
- Strong resistance to attending school or absenteeism
- Problems with memory, attention or concentration
- Significant changes in energy levels or eating (weight gain or weight loss)
- Physical symptoms (stomachaches, headaches, backaches, etc) and/or frequent visits to the school nurse
- Feelings of hopelessness
- Sadness
- Anxiety
- Crying often
- Frequent aggression
- Disobedience or lashing out verbally
- Excessive neglect of personal appearance or hygiene
- Substance abuse
- Dangerous, illegal, or thrill-seeking behavior
- Making critical comments about themselves
- Behavior problems at school or at home
- Signs of cutting, burning or other forms of self-harm
- Preoccupation with death

While these can be normal adjustments to situations and events happening in a child's life, it is important to seek help when you are concerned. If you are interested in learning more about FMC's services, please feel free to contact us at (517) 438-0065.

Elementary Student Council Involvement With Community



Madison Science Olympiad Team Competes at Hillsdale College








Competitive Cheer Flies to State Finals


