From the Superintendent's Desk:

I sincerely appreciate the Madison School District's partnership with Family Medical Center (FMC). Over the past few years tremendous support and guidance has been provided to students and families through tremendous effort of the FMC. M'Chae Hollowell, CMA Medical Support Coordinator, School Based Behavioral Health at the FMC of Michigan shares the following:

Sleep and Mental Health

Did you know sleep deprivation can affect your mental health? Research shows that sleep deprivation not only affects your psychological state but may also increase symptoms of anxiety, depression, bipolar disorder, and attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD). It can also contribute to irritability, difficulty coping with stress, and difficulty with comprehension and focus. Ways to combat insomnia include lifestyle changes (reducing caffeine), physical activity (regular exercise helps people fall asleep faster), sleep hygiene (maintaining a regular sleep and wake schedule), relaxation techniques (meditation, deep breathing exercises), and cognitive behavioral therapy.

While sleep disturbances can be normal adjustments to situations and events happening in a child's life, it is important to seek help when you are concerned. If you are interested in learning more about FMC's services, please feel free to contact us at (517)438-0065. Family Medical Center of Michigan, Inc. (FMC), has a location at Madison School District. Services offered through the school include counseling services for behavioral health as well as access to a psychiatrist if needed. These services allow children to remain in school for counseling services. Sometimes children struggle with issues such as focus, depression, anxiety, grief, trauma and stressors in the school environment. These can be addressed with counseling services for your children. Nakeyia Meyers, a Licensed Master Level Social Worker, is currently providing these services for FMC in select schools, including Madison School District, throughout Lenawee County.

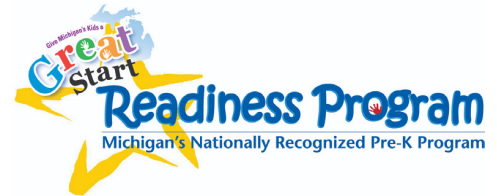


GSRP Preschool provides learning opportunities for youngest students

Madison's Great Start Readiness preschool program is now accepting new students. Children who are turning four years old, but who are less than five years old by September 1 are eligible. Children must reside in Lenawee County and meet state criteria for enrollment.

Someone from the GSRP office will contact you concerning your eligibility.

Please note that children are not placed into the program on a "first come first serve basis," but are prioritized by the family's income and number of other risk factors.

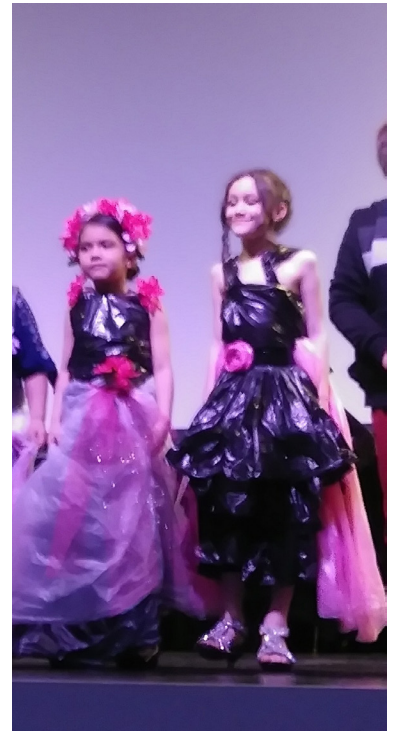
From the Elementary Art Room

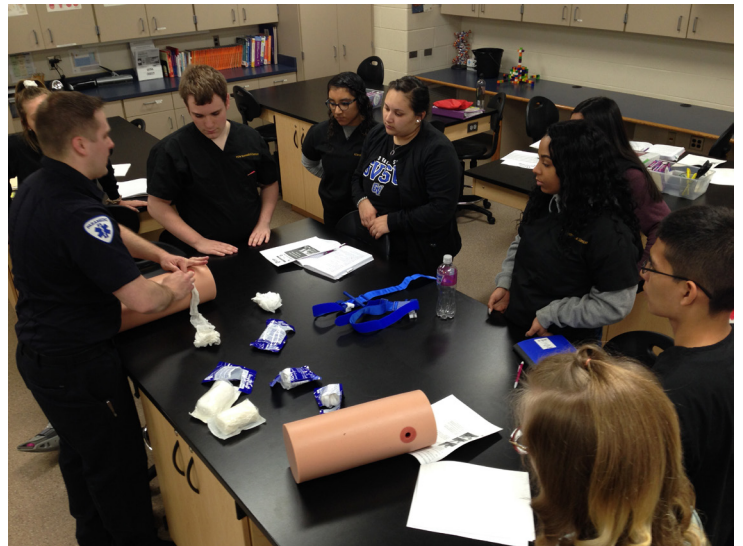

Madison Instrumental Music

2019-2020

Dear Parents of a child entering the 6th grade next fall,

On May 20th during the school day, your child will attend a concert showcasing all of the musical opportunities available to them in string orchestra, band and choir. After the concert they will be given the opportunity to play all of the instruments.

The four string orchestra instruments are:

Violin, Viola, Cello, Bass

The Band Instruments

Flute, Clarinet, Alto Saxophone, Trumpet, Trombone

Baritone and Tuba-- These are low brass instruments. Students will often start on Trumpet or Trombone and switch to these instruments.

Percussion – Students must play one of the instruments above first in order to play percussion. They must audition to show competent rhythm and note reading skills. Percussion is very competitive. We can only have 2 to 3 percussionist per grade level.

Why Join a music ensemble at Madison?

- ☐ Performing is a great learning experience and a way to share music with the community

Who can join?

Students entering the 6th grade for the 2019-20 school year who have the desire to learn how to make music. No advance musical training is required. The students will start from the very beginning learning how to hold the instrument and learning how to read music.

How do you rent or buy an instrument?

SHAR Music and Marshall Music offer programs where you can pay a small monthly fee to rent an instrument. Money that you put in rental fees will go toward the purchase of any instrument that they sell. These rental programs include maintenance and upkeep on the instrument being rented. If finances are an issue, we will work something out. We have several school instruments available for use.



Soon after the concert students will receive more detailed information. They will also receive a registration form to fill out and return to the school.

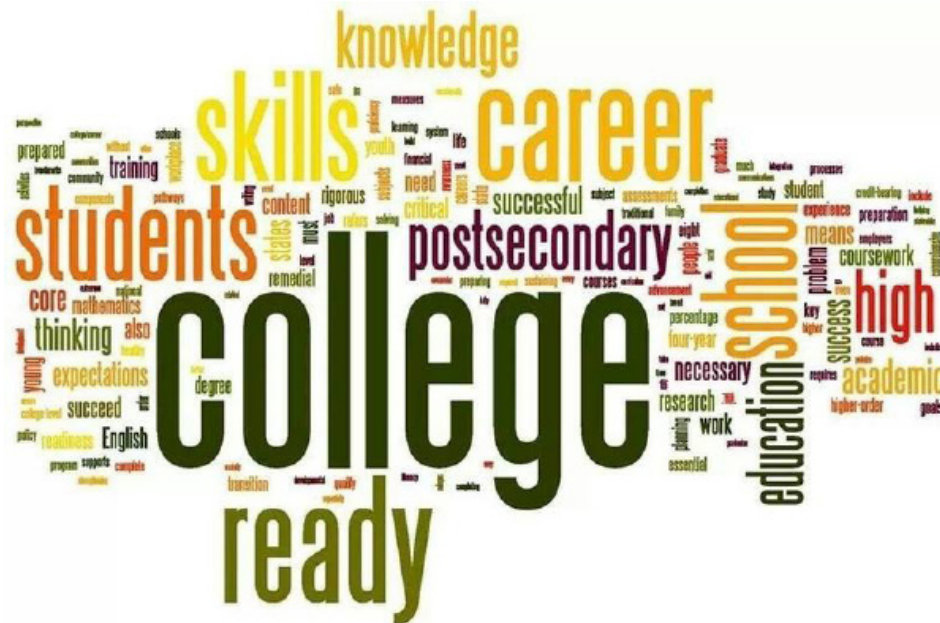
