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Superintendent's Report May 20, 2019

First Meeting:

LISD Biennial Election of School Board Members (Information Item)

The Board shall consider a Resolution of the Madison Board of Education for the LISD Biennial Election of School Board Members.

Second Meeting:

LISD Biennial Election of School Board Members Resolution (Action Item)

The Resolution includes the designation of a member as its representative and an alternate member to serve on the 2019 electoral body responsible for electing a member to the LISD Board of Education. Furthermore, consideration shall be given to candidates running for one available seat on the Board. The representative is directed to vote for the candidate at a meeting of electoral body to elect an LISD board member June 3, 2019, 5:30 p.m. at the LISD ESC. The Resolution also authorizes and directs the secretary to file the Resolution with the secretary of the LISD Board of Education. I recommend the Board appoint a representative to vote for the one candidate determined by the Board.

As a reminder, the board is required under Section 614 to designate its representative for the LISD election meeting by adopting a resolution not earlier than 21 days prior to the date of the election. May 13 is the earliest date that a board may designate its representative this year, therefore, you may conduct this business Monday, May 20th.

The board must consider the resolution at not less than one public meeting before adopting the resolution. Therefore, the board will conduct two meetings when we meet one week from today. The board will conduct one meeting to consider the resolution and will conduct a second meeting to conduct the board's business, including an agenda item to identify the candidate the board supports to fill the one vacant position on the LISD Board.

There are two candidates from which to choose:

Richard Germond (incumbent) Kimberly Amstutz-Wild

The secretary of the ISD board is required to notify the secretary of each constituent school district of the location and time of the meeting at least 10 days before the meeting (May 24).

Proposed Co-Op – Lenawee United High School Hockey (Action Item)

Greg DeVitto joined me, Kris, and parents/guardians interested in having their child participate with a proposed hockey co-op athletic team here in Lenawee County. A presentation followed by a question and answer session occurred at Madison High School Wednesday, April 17th with approximately 15 attendees. Gregg provided the following information to be shared with athletic directors and each school board of participating schools.

Beginning with the 2019-20 scholastic season, the Lenawee United High School Hockey Co-Op is participating within the MHSAA as a varsity program and within the Adrian Community Hockey League as a Prep/JV entry. The teams will be comprised of players within the following seven school Districts: Adrian Public Schools, Tecumseh Public Schools, Onsted Community Schools, Clinton Community Schools, Addison Community Schools, Madison Schools, and Lenawee Christian Schools.

The Adrian Youth Hockey Association initiated efforts in October 2014 to begin a 5-year plan of studying, developing, and implementing the co-op effort through a "grass roots" effort of increased awareness and participation in youth ice hockey. Adrian College and the Michigan Amateur Hockey Association serve as key support. The following timeline is occurring now through March 2020:



The success of Lenawee United High School Hockey Co-Op requires the commitment and support of several entities:

- A fully functioning non-profit to manage the club's activities. A volunteer Board, Advisory Panel with representation from each District, and finances managed by the Lenawee Community Foundation.
- Continual support from the local youth Association to provide an adequate feeder system of new players.
- Facilities to host on-ice and off-ice training activities. Arrington Ice Arena at Adrian College, Jackson Optimist Ice Arena and Chelsea Arctic Coliseum.
- Collaboration between participating school districts. Student-athletes meeting eligibility requirements and held to the standards set forth by their representative school.

Participation within the Lenawee United High School Hockey Co-Op is strictly a "pay-to-play" endeavor. Individual season fees assessed dependent upon the total number of players in program. Student-athletes are expected to maintain the academic standards as set forth by the MHSAA and their representative school. Student-athletes must declare Ice Hockey as their Primary sport for the winter sports season. Season fees will include ice fees (practices and games), transportation (away games only), uniforms, equipment (limited), team apparel, off-ice training, and team events.

Kris and I recommend the board approve the proposed Co-Op.

School Finance Research Collaborative (SFRC) Resolution (Action Item)

The Board has an opportunity to show support for adequate and equitable public school funding. Many of the overall funding formula considerations in the School Finance Research Collaborative are included in Gov. Gretchen Whitmer's proposed budget. The Senate has presented its proposal, which looks much like we've seen in past years and does not reflect the work of the SFRC. The House has not yet released its proposal. Therefore, boards of education are urged to consider passing a resolution in support of the SFRC report and the weighted school aid formula recommended by Gov. Whitmer. A copy of the SFRC Resolution is included in your packet.

2019 – 2020 LISD Budget Resolution (Action Item)

Julie and I attended the LISD Budget Planning Meeting and LISD Budget Review Meeting. By law each of the constituent local school boards is required to pass a resolution either supporting or rejecting the LISD budget. Local board action is required, however, the Board's vote is only advisory. LISD administration and local public school superintendents continue to work towards ways in which LISD funds can be utilized to support educational opportunities for students throughout Lenawee County. I recommend the Board pass the Resolution in support of the LISD 2019 – 20 budget.

Second Reading – NEOLA Policies (Action Item)

Last month you had an opportunity to conduct a first reading of modifications to the semi-annual regular updates to various NEOLA policies. This month you have an opportunity to again consider the proposed changes and updates to policies. Unless you have questions, I recommend the Board adopt the policies as presented.

Ratification of Madison EA Contract (Action Item)

Brad, Nate, and I have met with the Madison EA bargaining team throughout the past several months. The Madison EA recently ratified the four-year agreement. I will discuss details with you Monday and recommend the board approve the Agreement between the Madison Board of Education and the Madison Education Association.

LISD Focus Fund Grant Report (Information Item)

Since August 27, 2014 teachers and administration at Madison have worked diligently to accomplish goals outlined within the District Improvement Plan, specifically work pertaining to implementing the Canvas Learning Management System (LMS) resource here at Madison. The District is very appreciative that the LISD provided, in part, funds to invest towards teacher stipends during the summer of 2018. Focus Funds have been used to pay for, and implement, the Canvas Learning Management System, to purchase technology resources to use the LMS, and offer Professional Development for successful implementation of this valued resource.

Progress regarding Focus Fund projects for each of the school districts was presented to the LISD and stakeholders Friday, May 17. More detail will be shared with the board regarding aspects of the proposed 2019-20 Focus Fund initiatives.

Travel Abroad Trip – Spring 2021 (Action Item)

Kristin has information in her report regarding a potential travel abroad trip to the Dominican Republic to occur spring 2021. Mrs. Wallace would again lead this trip and it would include a "Make a Difference" aspect within the travel. Mrs. Thomas will share more at the meeting Monday. Mrs. Thomas and Mrs. Wallace ask the board's approval for this overnight and out of country trip so that planning and preparation, including a manner in which to gauge interest, can occur at this time.

Board Report Brad Anschuetz Madison Middle School May 20, 2019

I. From April 9th – May 17th Madison Middle School students completed the **Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress** (M-STEP), which is aligned to the state's rigorous academic standards. The M-STEP is given on-line each spring and is designed to gauge how well students are mastering the standards. Students were asked to read complex fiction and non-fiction texts and use evidence from these texts to answer questions, make inferences, and present persuasive arguments. The assessment goes beyond multiple-choice questions for math and science, as well. Students are presented with multi-step problems, conceptual questions, and real-world applications. Not only are students expected to get answers correct but also explain how they arrived at their conclusions.

The chart below outlines the average time a Madison Middle School student took to finish a particular assessment. In addition to these scheduled times there were four make-up sessions averaging approximately four hours apiece.

II. The **NWEA testing** window for Madison Middle School began the first week of March and will conclude at the end of May. This assessment runs concurrently with M-Step, thus the large window needed to strategically fit everything into the calendar. With NWEA we will test reading comprehension, science and mathematical aptitude. The students are empowered to utilize the tool for goal setting purposes and for taking ownership of their learning. As a faculty, we pay a great deal of attention to these scores. It is uplifting to see the growth in students. It validates all the hours of hard work. For the student that shows little to no growth we need to intervene and address any concern before it

compounds. You may also recall that the NWEA assessment tool is 25% of the teacher evaluation. For the first year, we are required to compute a teacher's assessment data by compiling a 50/30/20 percent average from the prior three years data (50% from 2018, 30% from 2017, and 20% from 2016).

- III. On Wednesday, May 8th, 22 of our 8th grade students attended the **Pay-Back for Education** program. Each student was paired with a business in the community that matches their career pathway interests. The students spend a day with their business partner learning about the inner workings of the career. The businesses our students attended included the Adrian Police Department, Adrian Steel, Anderson Development, Aubree's Pizzeria & Grill, Brookdale Senior Living, Carter Rehab & Aquatic Center, Charles Noe (Asst. Prosecutor), Habitat for Humanity, Lenawee Conservation District, LISD Agriscience Programs, LISD Kindergarten Readiness, LISD TV, Michigan Works, Siena Heights Nursing Education Department, Tecumseh Center for Arts, The Centre, and Photography.

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF ADEQUATELY FUNDING MICHIGAN SCHOOLS

WHEREAS, the Michigan Constitution states the legislature shall maintain and support a system of free public elementary and secondary schools as defined by law; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's 21st Century Education Commission states the urgency could not be greater regarding our falling K-12 performance, given that Michiganders underperform their peers, ranking 41st on fourth-grade reading performance nationally; and

WHEREAS, these unacceptable statewide outcomes are clearly not a result of changing demographics as some suggest, as Michigan's higher-income and white students are also among the worst performing in the country; and

WHEREAS, the way we fund Michigan's public schools is fundamentally broken; and

WHEREAS, we must reexamine our approach and develop an equitable funding formula model that ensures ALL students, regardless of their circumstances, can achieve and succeed; and

WHEREAS, the School Finance Research Collaborative is a broad-based, diverse and bipartisan group of community, business and education leaders, from Metro Detroit to the U.P., who agree it's time to change how our schools are funded to cover the true cost of educating students; and

WHEREAS, the School Finance Research Collaborative adequacy study provides lawmakers and the public with the best, most accurate and reliable information on what it truly costs to educate ALL Michigan students; and

WHEREAS, the SFRC report and other research clearly demonstrates the need to increase funding for our schools and target education funding more effectively; THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Madison School District calls upon the Michigan Legislature to fulfill its commitment to maintain and support a system of free public elementary and secondary schools with the resources recommended in the School Finance Research Collaborative report to enable each child to achieve proficiency on Michigan standards; AND BE IT FURTHER
