

SPECIAL DEPARTMENTS

In developing the plans for Madison High School it was necessary for the Board of Education to consider standards of the State Department of Public Instruction, of the Accrediting Department of the University of Michigan and the desires expressed by patrons of the district. In keeping with these needs a number of special purpose rooms were planned.

The commercial room is readily adaptable to instruction in shorthand, typing and bookkeeping because of the type of desks used in the room. Posture chairs with adjustable features are designed to help the student achieve maximum efficiency in typing.

The instrumental music room with practice rooms and storage makes it possible to have both practice and rehearsal areas for instrumental music and free the elementary music room for vocal music.

The general shop is designed to give the student experience in drawing, woodworking, finishing, metal working, electrical work and welding.

The home economics rooms are planned to give practical experience in home-making, cooking, sewing, managing a home, budgeting and planning.

With the recent emphasis on science it was essential to plan two rooms, one to stress natural and biological science and the other to provide for the study of physical sciences.

In considering the various interests of students it was thought that many individuals have latent artistic abilities in arts and crafts. Toward this end it was decided to provide an area where instruction might be given in this field.

The library is an innovation to Madison and is one depart. ment which needs to be developed further as the years pass, since the library serves in the dual capacity of research laboratory and cultural exchange center.

The student-center-lobby provides a comfortable waiting area for students and patrons before and after school events. It is an area where meetings may be held, where students may study or use as an informal reading room, or where school parties may be held. It can serve as a project exhibit area or secondary recreation area.



MYAC Youth Football

Recently, the Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA), Michigan Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association (MIAAA), Michigan Athletic Trainers Society (MATS), and Michigan High School Football Coaches Association (MHSFCA) have communicated a Consensus Statement & Beliefs for Michigan Youth Football. Their goal is to establish a consistently positive and safe age-appropriate football experience for children prior to high school.

In effort to align our program with the organizations' Core Principles and Beliefs, there will be significant changes to MYAC Youth Football for the upcoming fall football season. We feel these changes will increase participation, reduce the cost to participate, and provide a more enjoyable and equitable youth football experience for our young athletes.

For the 2019 MYAC Youth Football season, the following opportunities will be available:

1st and 2nd Grade Flag Football:

- In-House Program (All games will be at Madison against other Madison teams)
- Practice and games on the same night (Tuesdays from 5:30 6:45)
- Six weeks beginning the first week of school
- Cost \$50

3rd and 4th Grade Flag Football:

- In-House Program (All games will be at Madison against other Madison teams)
- Practice and games on the same night (Wednesdays from 5:30 7:00)
- Six weeks beginning the first week of school
- Cost \$50

5th Grade Tackle Football: 5th grade practices will be on Mondays (5:30 – 7:00) and Thursdays (5:30 – 7:00), beginning August 12th and games will be on Saturdays. The season will be six weeks long, beginning the first week of school. The cost will be \$65.





Latch-Key Updates for 2019-20 School Year

Dear Latch-Key Parents,

Latch-Key applications for the school year 2020 can be completed on My School Bucks. All obligations must be paid before your application is accepted. If you receive child day care assistance from the state, please notify me before the beginning of the school year as there is a form that needs to be completed and submitted for payment.

Flat rates will continue to be added to your account until you contact us to withdraw your child from Latch-Key. Your child may be removed from Latch-Key after two weeks of non-payment. Outstanding accounts will be turned in to the Central Office for further processing.




