Creating a Career and College Ready Culture...We Need You!

This past October our high school celebrated Michigan Post-Secondary Month. Traditionally, many people use the word College, but what we are truly emphasizing at Madison is post-secondary planning for ALL students. Our primary purpose at the high school level is to ensure that our students graduate with a plan for their future and the skills necessary to execute that plan! A student's plan could include enlisting in the military, a 2 year or 4 year degree, a specialized certification course, a skilled trades training program/apprenticeship or direct entry into the workforce.

In 2011, the National Clearinghouse began collecting data around post-secondary performance of high school graduates. This data allows us to track where our students are at in relation to post-secondary opportunities for the 6 years following their high school graduation. When our staff received this data in 2015, we were surprised by the number of Madison graduates who indicated they had a Post-Secondary Plan on graduation day, but were not actually pursuing that post-secondary opportunity after graduation. Armed with this information and a desire to improve post-secondary obtainment, we have worked very hard to establish a curriculum focused on encouraging students to become more invested in the post-secondary planning process. Currently, all students are required to take a Seminar Course in their 10th, 11th, and 12th grade year. These seminar courses are unique to Madison High School and are designed to help students explore numerous career pathways, understand what colleges and future employers are looking for, expose students to employment opportunities outside of a traditional 2yr/4yr degree, and help students better identify their own strengths and areas of interest. Next Fall, we will be adding a seminar course for all 9th grade students, as well! Outside of our Seminar Courses, Madison High School students have opportunities to enroll in a variety of Advanced Placement Courses, may Dual-Enroll in one of our local colleges or university, or participate in an Early Middle College Program. In addition, we send more than 75% of our juniors and seniors (the highest percentage of all Lenawee County Schools) to the LISD Tech Center to participate in over 20 different Career and Technical Education Programs.

As a parent, it is never too early to begin talking with your child about planning for their future. These conversations play an integral role in shaping your students thoughts and beliefs regarding the importance of post-secondary planning. With your help, we can strengthen and enhance our efforts to ensure all Madison students graduate college and career ready!

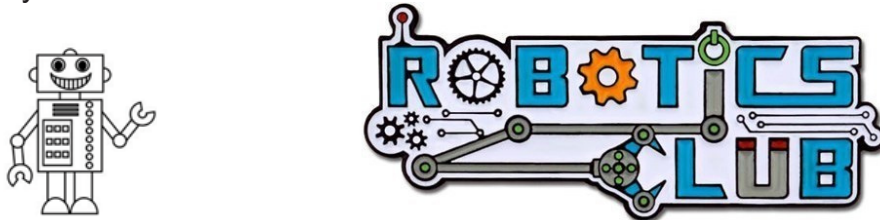

HOSA WEEK November 4-8th, 2019

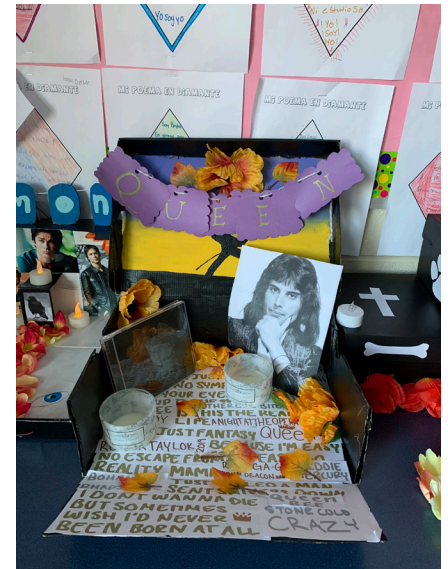

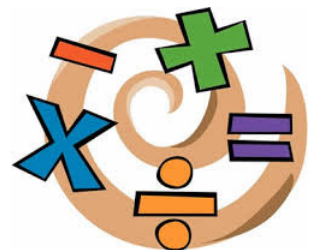

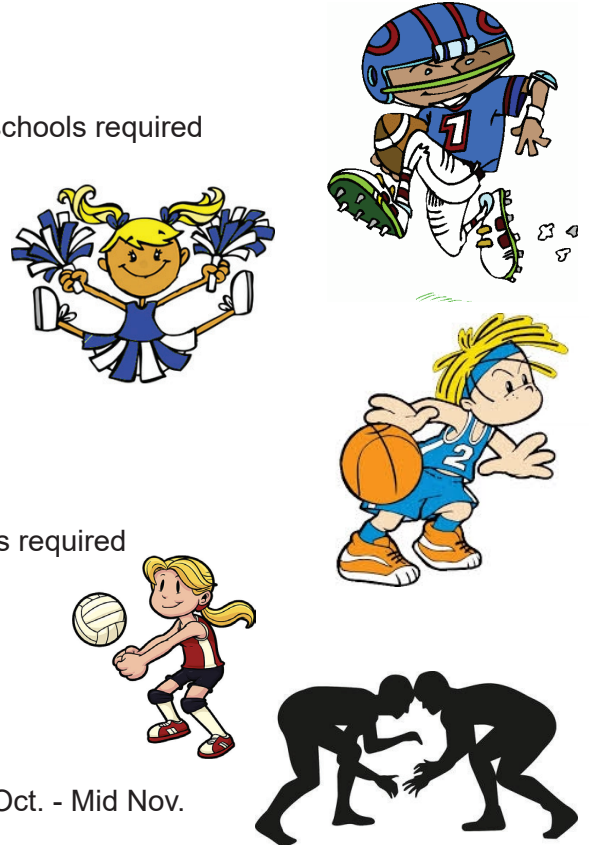
