From the Superintendent's Desk:

On Wednesday, September 23, 2020, the Madison School District Board of Education held a special board meeting to discuss our return to learn plan. As part of our new State guidelines, we are required to review that plan monthly. As a result of this meeting, the Madison School District will move to a model that provides a $\frac{1}{2}$ day of face-to-face instruction and $\frac{1}{2}$ day distance learning (from home) on Fridays. The remainder of the week will continue under our current model of instruction. This change will provide staff members time to collaborate and support both our virtual and in-person students. Our first Friday half day in-person schedule will take place on October 2, 2020

What does that mean for families?

- All students will have distance learning assignments to complete in the afternoon
- All Middle/High School Students will be released or bussed home from in-person instruction at 11:00 am
- All Afternoon TECH students can remain on campus and be transported to the TECH center for their afternoon classes
- A secondary Learning Lab (grades 6-12) will be available for virtual students who need additional support or to take assessments.
- Elementary Students will be released or bussed home from in-person instruction at 12:00
- For Elementary families that are not able to have their students return home at 12:00, there will be a Y5-5 learning lab available where students can stay at school until their normal 3:30 dismissal time.

A follow up information page and survey will be sent out to all elementary families outlining what the learning lab will include and provide you the opportunity to choose whether your student(s) will be released at 12:00 or staying until 3:30. We appreciate your understanding as we continue to work through the pandemic.

Friday Learning Lab Resources

Elementary Learning Lab Information

Last week, the district sent out a communication regarding a change to our Friday schedule. During our planning process, we wanted to ensure that any change we made would be minimally impactful for our families. As a result, we created the Elementary Learning Lab. This provides a place for PK-5 students to go, on Friday afternoons, for families that are not able to have their student be home during that time. Below, you will find a brief outline of what the Elementary Learning Lab will look like:

What Will The PK-5 Learning Lab Look Like?

- Will run from 12:00-3:00
- Will be facilitated by paraprofessionals
- Students will have the opportunity to complete their school assignments
- Students will be grouped by grade-level
- All K-5 students will be required to wear their mask during the learning lab
- Students can be picked up or bussed (if they are already assigned to a bus route) home at 3:30

High School Learning Lab Information

Beginning this Friday, October 2nd, A HS Learning Lab will be available to Face-to-Face students needing a place to stay till 2:40pm on early release Fridays. A sign-up sheet for students wishing to stay in the HS Learning Lab can be located in the HS Office.


High School Students:

Next Month your student will be taking the College Board assessments that were originally scheduled for the Spring of last school year. The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) and the College Board will provide Fall 2020 testing for students who are enrolled in schools that were established for Spring 2020 testing. Per Executive Order 2020-65, schools are expected to administer the applicable grade-level assessments in the Fall of 2020 (https://www.michigan.gov/mde/0,4615,7-140-22709_86724----,00.html).

Madison High School has established the assessment schedule below to administer the SAT Suite of assessments to students in grades 9-12.

Face-to-Face students will be tested in areas that allow for physical distancing in accordance with Covid-19 regulations. Virtual students will be tested using the same assessment schedule but in a location with other virtual students of the same grade level. Physical distancing and disinfectant guidelines will be followed to ensure both face-to-face and virtual students have a safe testing environment.

- Wednesday, October 14th- SAT (12th grade)
- Tuesday, October 20th PSAT 8/9 (9th grade)
- Thursday, October 29th PSAT/NMSQT (10th and 11th grade)

Note From Nurse Cara

September 29, 2020

Dear Madison Families,

I doubt anyone would disagree that these are unprecedented times. What our Madison Family once knew and enjoyed as nmmal is no more. However, in a matter of weeks we have built a completely new infrastructure and reimagined what our school could be. With these unprecedented times also comes unprecedented opportunities to learn, grow, and evolve quickly. With daily changes to State requirements, new forms and repotting, and the ever changing dynamics of our cmrent pandemic, we are striving to take advantage of those oppmtunities. As we learn and evolve, and begin to watch the dust settle, we ask that you continue to do your patt, and help to keep our school safe and healthy.

As long as there are cases of COVID-19 in the community, there will be no way to prevent all risks within our school. The goal is to keep the risk as low as possible and keep school activities as safe as possible. If students did not go to school, they would be at risk of COVID-19 illness from their interactions in our community. Yet going to school is very important to the development and well-being of our children. It gives them proper education, social and emotional skills, safety, reliable nutrition, physical/speech and mental health therapy, and opportunities for physical activity, among other benefits. Our goals are to ensure that the benefits to our in-person students far outweigh any risks.

Included with this letter is the Madison Daily Screener and the Return to School information which were created with help from the Lenawee County Health Department. This information was sent prior to the start of school, but we've changed the format in an attempt to make it as easy as possible to follow. We ask that you continue to use the Daily Screener with your student prior to arriving to school each morning. We know that there is overlap between the list of symptoms associated with COVID-19 and other common causes, including seasonal allergies, and asthma. Our students or staff with pre-existing health conditions that present with any of the COVID-19 -like symptoms will not need to be excluded from school, if a health care provider has evaluated them and determined the symptoms are not due to COVID-19, and that information is on file with our school. However, if these symptoms are just beginning, worsening, or changing, the student or staff member will be required to be excluded from school activities and not return until re-evaluated or tested.

Unfortunately, COVID-19 presents differently in children than adults, and there have been many cases of COVID-19 that seemed to be nothing more than worsening allergies. We desire, more than anything, to see our students attend school and benefit from all that entails, but we also have a responsibility to those smne children, our staff, and their families to keep the risk associated as low as possible.

On September 25, 2020, Governor Whitmer signed Executive Order 2020-185. Part of this executive order mandates all students grades PK-12 wear a face covering at all times while in a school building. The order goes into effect October 5, 2020.

Thank you for all of your trust and your cooperation in making this a safe place to be!




GSRP Preschool provides learning opportunities for youngest students

Madison HOSA Announces Officers for 2020-21 School Year



Varsity Football Defeats Whiteford for the first time since 1980 in opener

Dante Cerasulo led the Madison Trojans to a 42-24 victory over the Whiteford Bobcats on Friday, September 18.

Cerasulo rushed for 211 yards and three touchdowns on the evning. Max Palpant tossed a trio of touchdown passes, and Isiah Casarez-Ruiz had 101 yards receiving and a touchdown. The Trojans offense compiled nearly 500 yards of offense in the victory!

The win over Whiteford market the first since 1980. Madison was on a 38-game losing streak to Whiteford dating back to that year.

Fall Sports Rules and Regulations

As of September 9, 2020

- 1. EVERYONE must wear a mask. Even the participants have to wear a mask at all times. This is a governor's EO and hopefully we will get better clarification on it.
- 2. Every athlete is allowed 2 guests to attend a home or away contest. Away games you MUST have a ticket and pay at the visitors gate when you arrive to the contest.
