From the Superintendent's Desk

Monday, November 2nd

I hope that everyone had a restful weekend and a Happy Halloween! I wanted to send out a quick communication to update families on a few topics. You should have received a Blackboard message last night stating that we are scheduled to return to face-to-face learning tomorrow, November 3, 2020. Therefore, the last day of distance learning, for student's who signed up for face-to-face instruction, will be today. We are excited to have students back in the building tomorrow!

Friday, November 6, 2020 is scheduled to be a half day. As a result of our first review of our Extended COVID-19 Preparedness Plan, the district implemented half day in-peron/half day remote learning days on Fridays. On Wednesday, November 4, 2020 the district will hold our second monthly review of our Extended COVID-19 Preparedness Plan at 5:00. At this meeting, we are looking to review our current model and layout for the remainder of the first trimester. The main item of discussion will be our current Friday format. We do not anticipate any other changes to our learning model for Mondays-Thursdays. Once this meeting is complete, I will send out a communication regarding what that will look like.

During our district-wide remote learning, we were notified of two additional school associated cases in the early elementary building. Those two classrooms were directly notified and will be rejoining face-to-face learning two days after the rest of the district. In total for the 2020-2021 school year, the Lenawee County Health Department has notified the Madison School Dis-




