



From the Superintendent's Desk

Hello, Madison Families:

Today (February 26, 2021), the Madison School District was notified of an additional two positive COVID-19 cases in the High School. In total for the 2020-2021 school year, the Lenawee County Health Department has notified the Madison School District of thirty-five confirmed positive cases and six probable cases. This information is kept up-to-date on our website. Please, click on the link to be directed to the document: School Associated COVID-19 Cases.

Due to the multiple positive cases reported this week, and the number of students currently quarantined, the Madison High School will be moving to all remote/virtual instruction until March 8, 2021. High School students who participate in athletics, that are not quarantined, will have the opportunity to continue competing during this period of remote/virtual learning. However, out of extreme precaution for our own students, and the school districts we are competing against, we will ask ALL eligible athletes to complete a rapid COVID-19 test, performed by our athletic department, within 24 hours prior competition. A parental consent form will need to be signed allowing athletes to undergo the test. If an athlete is not tested within 24 hours of competition, they will not be eligible to compete in that contest. The Madison Elementary School and Madison Middle School will still be holding in-person instruction at this time.

Middle School Exam Schedules

Middle school teachers will prepare a summative assessment (exam or project) for students to complete during their upcoming scheduled exam period. Instead of the exam being worth 20% of the student's grade, middle school teachers will enter the summative assessment in the grade book as another trimester unit test, project, or culminating assignment. The student's final trimester grade will be the trimester coursework percentage. The exam schedule will be consistent for all learners, face-to-face as well as virtual students. Face-to-face learners will report to school for half days on March 10th, 11th, and 12th. Virtual students will be allowed to complete the culminating learning experience on-line. Virtual students should login to Canvas at the designated time to complete the assessment unless directed otherwise by their teacher.

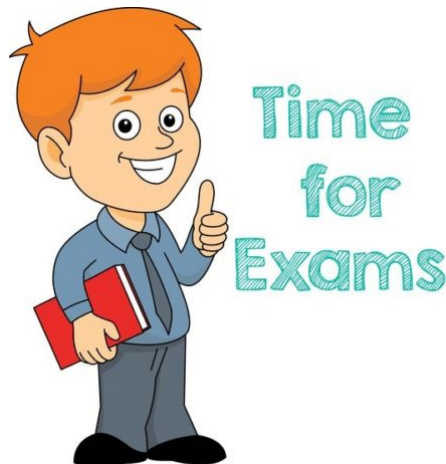

The My Alerts page includes checkboxes for the following types of alerts. If you are a guardian who can access multiple students in HAC, a separate set of boxes displays for each student. Checking a box enables the type of alert indicated.

Options:

Attendance - Allows email alerts to be sent when absence, tardy, and attendance codes are entered for your student. You can limit the alerts to certain codes. When the Attendance box is checked, its description becomes a link. Click the link to display a window listing the available codes. To receive all alerts, leave the any box checked. To select individual codes, uncheck the any box, check the boxes for the codes you want, then click Save.

Discipline - Allows email alerts to be sent when your student is involved in a discipline incident. You can limit the alerts to certain types of incidents. When the box is checked, its description becomes a link. Click the link to display a window listing the available discipline codes. To receive all alerts, leave the any box checked. To select specific codes, uncheck the any box, check the boxes for the codes you want, then click Save.

New Option

Classwork - Allows email alerts to be sent on averages for class assignments. To limit the alerts to averages outside a range, enter the bottom of the range in the ***below*** field - for example, 75 for averages less than 75 - and the top of the range in the ***above*** field - for example, 89 for averages of 90 or greater. Enter whole numbers; decimals are not allowed. To display averages for all assignments regardless of their level, leave the two fields blank.

Culture of Achievement Program (CAP) is an intervention to develop successful work habits and provide additional support for increased learning in academics.

At Madison Middle School, we believe that students who come to class prepared and complete assigned work obtain a better chance of reaching their potential than those who do not. The CAP program provides support for students as they transition into taking responsibility for their own learning in the middle school.

Students who may benefit from the CAP program are those who need help with the following:

- missing several assignments
- needing organizational assistance
- needing more time to master complex concepts being taught

The program is offered from 2:45 p.m. - 4:20 p.m. on Monday and Thursday. Students will receive assistance, from a staff member and high school tutors, with completing assignments. Bus transportation is available for those who need it.
